



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I Overview

Bill No. 84 (EC): AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 10 OF CHAPTER VI OF PUBLIC LAW 27-106 RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO UTITLIZE LIMITED-TERM EMPLOYEES UNTIL THE END OF THE 2004-2005 SCHOOL YEAR. by Larry F. Kasperbauer

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations & Reorganization to which was referred **Bill No. 84**, conducted a Public Hearing on same on March 18, 2005 at the Legislature's Public Hearing Room beginning at 9 a.m. Bill No. 84 (EC) was heard at 2:03 p.m.

Cruz, Chairman, Guam Education Policy Board (Written)

II Summary of Testimony Testimony on Bill No. 84 was provided by:

Mr. Luis Reyes, Administrator of Personnel Services Division, Department of Education for DOE on behalf of Superintendent of Education Juan P. Flores – Mr. Reyes provided written and oral testimony in full support of Bill No. 84. Mr. Reyes stated that the Department of Education stands to lose 51 custodial workers who were hired as temporary facilities maintenance services workers or Limited Term Employees. Mr. Reyes reasoned that Bill 84 offered the Department of Education the opportunity to transition into the privatization mandate as required by Public Law 27-106 and 27-32 in a more orderly fashion by allowing the continued employment of the custodians until the end of the 2004 – 2005 school year. Mr. Reyes explained that there are 51 part-time building custodians, who augment 104 permanent classified custodians for all of DOE's 37 schools. He conjectured that if Bill 84 is not passed, DOE would be forced to layoff the 51 LTE's at the end of March, leaving the schools with an inadequate custodial staff because the implementation of the privatization efforts for DOE have yet to be finalized. Mr. Reyes stated that there would be no personnel available at the end of the month to immediately carry forward the duties of the would-be terminated LTE's. Mr. Reyes also

recommended that the Bill be extended to include the LTE's employed as cafeteria workers at the schools.

Mr. Matt Rector, President, Guam Federation of Teachers - Mr. Rector provided oral testimony in support of Bill No. 84, He agreed with the Department of Education and expressed concern about the effect the termination of the Limited Term Employees would have on the schools and the inconvenience the affected school communities would be burdened with should the termination become necessary as a result of the mandate in 27-106 that prohibits employment of LTE's beyond March 30, 2005.

Mr. Ron Benoit, Business Member, Guam Education Policy Board, Member of the Guam Chamber of Commerce - Mr. Benoit provided oral testimony against Bill No. 84. Mr. Benoit stated the purpose of Bill 84 was due to the lack of action by the former Guam Education Policy Board. He stated that the measure would simply allow the Department of Education more time to do nothing. Mr. Benoit stated that he is confident in the current GEPB's ability to meet the mandate albeit, not by the end of the month. He urged lawmakers to leave the mandate in place with the end of March as a deadline despite the termination of the LTE's. Senator Kasperbauer posed a question to Board Member Benoit as to whether or not he felt DOE would be able to carry out a RFP by the end of March. Mr. Benoit responded in the negative.

II Summary of Testimony - Cont

Testimony on Bill No. 84 was provided by:

Dr. Jose Cruz, Chairman, Guam Education Policy Board, provided written testimony in support of Bill No. 84. See Attached. **Dr Cruz** states that the reprieve offered by the measure will allow DOE and the current GEPB, some leg room to implement the provisions as contained in the mandates to privatize. He stated that the passage of the measure would prevent any disruption in the obligation DOE has of educating and providing requisite services to schoolchildren and the department's endeavor to provide an adequate public education to students.

III Findings and Recommendations

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations & Reorganization finds that the need exists for the Department of Education to finalize the implementation of the Privatization mandate as adopted by the Guam Education Policy Board via Public Law 27-32, with specific provisions contained in Public Law 27-106 - Chapter VI, Section 10, Item 9, that mandate the abolishment of Limited Term Employees by March 30, 2005. The Committee finds that the March 30, 2005 deadline is fast approaching and there is no indication that DOE can comply with its privatization mandate by the established deadline. Without intervention through Bill No. 84, the employment of fifty-one DOE limited term facilities maintenance services workers will be terminated. The absence of these employees would pose a serious threat to the health and welfare of the students at the schools where they now work. Bill No. 84 proposes a temporary extension of the employment of these workers to ensure that the services they provide to our students continue until the end of the current school year. The Committee further finds that the immediate passage of Bill No. 84 (EC) is necessary to ensure that there is no disruption in the educating, or affects to the health and welfare, of students enrolled in the Public School System during the remainder of the 2004 - 2005 school year.

Accordingly the Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations & Reorganization directs that bill No. 84 (EC) be reported out with the **Recommendation To Do Pass**.

Thank you for giving the Department of Education the opportunity to provide testimony on bill 84. An Act to Amend Section 10 of Chapter VI of Public Law 27-106 Relative to allowing the Department of Education to Utilize Limited Term Employees until the end of the 2004-2005 school year.

The Department of Education is in full support of bill number 84. The passage of this bill will allow the Department of Education to continue to provide the much needed custodial services since it is anticipated that the privatization of such services require that the Department of Education and the Guam Education Policy Board analyze the feasibility of privatization. We are concerned about the prospect of the part-time custodians ending their employment at the end of this month pursuant of P.L. 27-106. If the part-time custodians end their employment and the privatization does not take place immediately, the schools will be left with very few custodians. As with the part-time custodians, we support also the intent of bill 84 by including the hiring of limited term cafeteria services workers up to the end of the school year when we anticipate the Guam Education Policy Board to determine whether privatization shall continue for the remaining schools that have not yet been privatized.

Currently the department has only a total of 104 permanent classified building custodians and 51 part-time building custodians. This is a total of 155 building custodians servicing 37 public schools. It becomes immediately obvious that the schools will be severely affected. Attached is a breakdown of the current number of custodians assigned to each school.

Thank you once again for giving us the opportunity to provide testimony in support of bill number 84.

Testimony on Bill 84, Allowing the Department of Education to utilize limited-term employees until the end of School Year 2004/2005 By Dr. Jose Q. Cruz, Chairman, GEPB March 18, 2005

Senator Kasperbauer, Chairman of the Committee on Education and Community Development, Honorable Senators and members of the Committee, my name is Dr. Jose Q. Cruz, Chairman of the Guam Education Policy Board. I speak most specifically as Chair of the Legislative Affairs Subcommittee of our Board consisting of myself, Mrs. Rosa S. Palomo, GEPB voting member, Mr. Ron Benoit, business representative, Mrs. Neeti Prakash, GFT representative, Mr. Luis Reyes, Superintendent liaison to the Committee and with summary consultation with Superintendent of Education, Mr. Juan P. Flores. The Subcommittee supports Bill 78 with one abstention from the Subcommittee. Action by the full Board is not possible because our Board meetings are called every 2nd & 4th Wednesdays of the month. However, I feel GEPB will have no objections to the Bill with its most important and stop gap measure.

Bill 84 lifts exception of hiring part-time cafeteria services and facilities maintenance up to March 30, 2005 and extends the exception till the end of the school year. We are most grateful of this Bill and I wish to extend our apologies in not owning up if not calling attention to the policy mandate now being amended. Be assured that our GEPB will be looking into the foundational PL 27-32 which asks for outsourcing and privatization of appropriate education service. With the reprieve contained in the Bill we will have sufficient time to address our situation altogether. On Monday, March 21, 2005, GEPB will be in work session to address the directive of PL 27-32. We thank you for your kind consideration of our employees who are affected but more importantly in preventing any disruption to our obligation to educate and provide requisite services for an adequate public education.

As Chair of the Guam Education Policy Board, I believe we will fully support Bill 84 as a stop gap measure and will rise to the challenge of outsourcing and privatization. I will subsequently submit an official resolution on GEPB's position of support.

Thank you and Si Yuos Maase for the opportunity to speak on behalf of the Guam Education Policy Board. I will remain to answer any questions or need for clarification.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 10 OF CHAPTER VI OF PUBLIC LAW 27-106 RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO UTITLIZE LIMITED-TERM EMPLOYEES UNTIL THE END OF THE 2004-2005 SCHOOL YEAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 1303 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended*read:

Section 10. Limited Term Appointment Moratorium. Notwithstanding the provisions of §4102 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, or any other provision of law, *no* person may be employed on a temporary or limited-term basis by an instrumentality of the government of Guam during the Fiscal Year, *except* for the following:

9 (1) Teachers, school health counselors, and on-call substitutes (within staffing
10 pattern funding levels);

11 (2) Attorneys at the Department of Law (within staffing pattern funding12 levels);

13 (3) Nurses and doctors (within staffing pattern funding levels);

14 (4) Temporary survey workers employed by the Department of Labor for the
15 purpose of conducting employment surveys (within staffing pattern funding levels);

16 (5) Licensed healthcare professionals and ancillary service personnel
 17 employed at the Department of Education, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority,

the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and the Department of
 Public Health and Social Services (all within staffing pattern funding levels);

3 (6) Academic personnel positions at the University of Guam and the Guam
4 Community College (within their appropriated funding levels);

5 (7) (a) Temporary Solid Waste Technicians employed by the 6 Division of Solid Waste Management of the Department of Public Works for the 7 purpose of collecting residential solid waste;

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(b) Such sums as are necessary are hereby appropriated from the Solid Waste Operations Fund to fund the temporary positions contained in this Section;

11 (8) Federally-funded positions (matching and up to one hundred percent12 (100%)); and

13 (9) Temporary cafeteria services and facilities maintenance services workers
14 employed by the Department of Education *not to exceed* March 30, 2005
15 employment the end of the school year 2004-2005.
