Section 2. A new Section 5253 is hereby *added* to Title 5 Guam Code Annotated to read:

"§5253. Restriction against contractors employing convicted sex offenders from working at certain government of Guam venues. (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, in another state or subdivision of the United States or a foreign country, who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for an agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, may work on the campus of any public school, on the campuses of the Guam Community College or the University of Guam, as a bus driver, in any public library, the Department of Youth

Affairs, at the Guam Memorial Hospital, at the Medical Services and the Child Protection Services divisions of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, at the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), at the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, or in areas frequented by children under the jurisdiction of an agency of the government of Guam including, but not limited to, the Hagåtña Pool.

- (b) All contracts for services to agencies listed herein shall include the following provisions: (1) warranties that no person, providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA; (2) that if any person providing services on behalf of the the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction.
- (c) Duties of the General Services Agency or Procurement Administrators. All contracts, bids, or Requests for Proposals shall state all the conditions in §5253(b).
- (d) Any contractor found in violation of §5253(b), after notice from the contracting authority of such violation, shall within twenty-four (24) hours take corrective action and shall report such action to the contracting authority. Failure to take corrective action within the

Testimony on Bill 5, Prohibiting convicted sex offenders from being employed in the Government of Guam or for government contractors to employ the same By Dr. Jose Q. Cruz, Chairman, GEPB March 18, 2005

Senator Kasperbauer, Chairman of the Committee on Education and Community Development, Honorable Senators and members of the Committee, my name is Dr. Jose Q. Cruz, Chairman of the Guam Education Policy Board. I speak most specifically as Chair of the Legislative Affairs Subcommittee of our Board consisting of myself, Mrs. Rosa S. Palomo, GEPB voting member, Mr. Ron Benoit, business representative, Mrs. Neeti Prakash, GFT representative, Mr. Luis Reyes, Superintendent liaison to the Committee and with summary consultation with Superintendent of Education, Mr. Juan P. Flores. Action by the full Board is not possible because our Board meetings are called every 2nd & 4th Wednesdays of the month. However, I feel we will have no objections to Bill 5 as proposed. We support Bill 5.

Bill 5 prohibits sex offenders and those convicted under Chapter 25 of Title 9 of Guam Code Annotated from working in our public school system and in other agencies and facilities frequented by children. In addition, it prohibits government contractors from allowing sex offenders to work in the same facilities while contracted for services. Explicit warranties prohibiting the hiring of sex offenders by a contractor is required. Other venues in the Government of Guam are noted where prohibitions also apply. Finally, Bill 5 proposes that a person arrested of crimes noted in Chapter 25, of Title 9 is also prohibited until the arrest process is completed.

We fully support Bill 5 and I will subsequently submit an official resolution on our GEPB position.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak on behalf of the Guam Education Policy Board. I will remain to answer any questions that the Committee may want to have answered or addressed.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4203.3 is hereby added to Title 4, Guam Code 3

Annotated to read:

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"§4203.3. Prohibition: Sex Offenders Prohibited from Employment in the Guam Public School System or other agencies and facilities of the Government of Guam frequented by children. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of Public Law or Personnel Rules and Regulations, no person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, or a sex offense or a crime of moral turpitude in Guam, in another state or subdivision of the United States or a foreign country; may work on the campus of any public school, on the campuses of the Guam Community College or the University of Guam, as a bus driver, in any public library, the Department of Youth Affairs, at the Guam Memorial Hospital, at the Medical Services and the Child Protection Services divisions of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, at the Department of Integrated Services for Persons with Disabilities

- 1 (DISID), at the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, or in areas
- 2 frequented by children under the jurisdiction of the Department of Parks and
- 3 Recreation including but not limited to the Hagåtña Pool."

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- Section 2. Section 5253 is hereby *added* to Title 5, Guam Code Annotated to read:
- §5253. Restriction against contractors employing convicted sex offenders 7 from working at certain Government of Guam Venues. (a) Notwithstanding 8 any other provision of Public Law no person convicted of a sex offense under the 9 provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, or a sex offense or a 10 11 crime of moral turpitude in Guam, in another state or subdivision of the United 12 States or a foreign country; who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, may work on 13 the campus of any public school, on the campuses of the Guam Community 14 College or the University of Guam, as a bus driver, in any public library, the 15 Department of Youth Affairs, at the Guam Memorial Hospital, at the Medical 16 Services and the Child Protection Services divisions of the Department of Public 17 18 Health and Social Services, at the Department of Integrated Services for Persons with Disabilities (DISID), at the Department of Mental Health and Substance 19 Abuse, or in areas frequented by children under the jurisdiction of an agency of 20 the Government of Guam including but not limited to the Hagåtña Pool. 21
 - (b) All contracts for services to agencies listed her in shall include (1) warranties that no person, providing services on behalf of the contractor, has been convicted of a sex offense or crime of moral turpitude as described herein, (2) in the event that any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense or crime of moral turpitude as described herein, that

such person be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction and (3) in the event that any person providing services on behalf of the the contractor is arrested for a sex offense or crime of moral turpitude as described herein, that such person will not be allowed to work at such agency until such time the person is found "Not Guilty" of such crime or such charges are dismissed with prejudice.
