Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the sum of *not more than* Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the Safe Streets Fund to the Mayors Council of Guam *solely* for the purpose of resurfacing the multi-purpose sports court at the Sinajana Community Center subject to the procurement and contracting laws of Guam. Upon project completion, any unexpended balance shall revert to the Safe Streets Fund.

Footnotes:

Per 16 GCA, Ch.18, Article 1, §18125, the Safe Streets Fund is under the purview of the Unified Judiciary of Guam (c/o the Superior Court). Per discussion with Court Controller Antonio Meno, the average yearly collections for the Fund is approximately \$396K. Currently, a portion of such collections fund the operations of Erica's House of Hope (\$100K) and the remaining balance funds the Guam Law Library. As such, any appropriation from the subject fund may affect the quality of services currently being provided. The Bureau would like to note that clarification is needed on the actual fund source being considererd for the subject appropriation. If it is I Liheslaturan Guahan's intent to utilize funds reflected in Fund 217 in the Department of Administration's AS400 system, it should be noted that such funds are currently earmarked for use by the Department of Corrections (DOC) as outlined in 16 GCA, §18125(c). This section states, in part, that funds are "to be used to compensate staff and provide supplies or facilities to house incarcerated persons." Given the importance of services being provided by DOC, the Bureau is of the opinion that any and all funds that can be utilized by the Department are essential to its operations and should not be diverted for other purpo

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Finance, Taxation, and Commerce held a Public Hearing on Tuesday, March 29, 2005, 9:30 a.m. at I Liheslaturan Guahan's Public Hearing Room on Bill no. 81 (EC), "An Act To Appropriate The Sum Of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) Streets Fund To The Mayor's Council Of From The Safe Guam For The Purpose Of Resurfacing The Multi-Purpose Sports Court At The Sinajana Community Center For Safety". Notices of this public hearing were disseminated throughout all local media via facsimile and are attached herein.

II. SUMMARY OF VERBAL TESTIMONIES:

Following introductory remarks by Chairman Edward J.B. Calvo, Senator Benjamin Cruz briefly clarified that Bill No. 81 (EC) was introduced in order to address

concerns brought to him by Sinajana Vice-Mayor Robert Hofmann regarding the costs and funding source necessary to repair the multi-purpose court in the village of Sinajana. Senator Cruz further clarified that the funding issue for this facility is time-sensitive and that any potential financial support from the federal government for structural damages sustained during Typhoon Ponsonga would be lost should the local government be unable to appropriate funds to cover costs associated with repairs to the multi-purpose court and related lighting, fencing, and other structural support.

Sinajana Mayor Roke Blas followed with comments supporting Bill No. 81 (EC). Mayor Blas encouraged panel members and the rest of the legislature to consider appropriating the minimal amount as indicated in the proposed legislation in order to take advantage of the support being offered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). According to Mayor Blas, the Village's annual appropriations are insufficient to bear the costs associated with repairing the multi-purpose court. Mayor Blas concluded his comments by informing panel members of the list of *manâmkos* from his village who had signed a letter of support for Bill No. 81 (EC). (Written testimony and letter of support are attached)

Vice-Mayor Robert Hofmann also provided comments in support of Bill No. 81 (EC). Vice-Mayor Hofmann spoke of the fond memories he and others share of the many youth activities that have taken place over the years at the multi-purpose court. In addition to sporting activities, the multi-purpose court continues to be used for ceremonial, church-related, and community-based events. Vice-Mayor Hofmann encouraged members of the legislature to pass Bill No. 81 (EC) and allow the youth and manåmko of Sinajana to utilize a safe and important multi-purpose facility. (Written testimony is attached)

Following comments made by Vice-Mayor Hofmann, Mr. Atanacio Gutierrez, a member of Sinajana's Municipal Planning Council, offered brief testimony in support of Bill No. 81 (EC). Mr. Gutierrez recognized that the multi-purpose court in his village continues to deteriorate over time and will ultimately present safety concerns for those

who choose to use the facility. Mr. Gutierrez urged panel members and the rest of the legislature to pass Bill No. 81 (EC) and help the village of Sinajana provide safe leisure and physical activities for residents to enjoy.

Mr. Philip Taijeron from the Village of Merizo informed the Committee that he had problems with Bill No. 81 (EC) in its current form and recommended that panel members seek to also include other villages that require repairs to their sporting facilities. Mr. Taijeron appeared before the Committee in order to inform senators that other villages, such as Merizo, also have sporting facilities that need to be improved, facilities that many residents do utilize for a variety of different activities.

In response to Mr. Taijeron's concerns, Vice-Mayor Robert Hofmann reiterated that there is an urgency to pass Bill No. 81 (EC) as FEMA has already set a deadline of June 2005 for the village of Sinajana to use funds granted by the federal government.

Speaker Mark Forbes followed by informing those present that he had also introduced a similar piece of legislation; however, his version would appropriate funds from the Tourist Attraction Fund rather than the Safe Streets Fund.

Vice-Chairman, Senator Lawrence Kasperbauer, asked Mr. Philip Taijeron to clarify whether or not he objected to Bill No. 81 (EC), with the latter responding that he did not object to the measure, however, he would like to see that other villages also receive help from the government.

Senator Adolpho Palacios provided brief comments and recommended that the Mayor's Council of Guam provide the Legislature with information relative to other projects where FEMA has approved funding for repairs and/or renovations due to damages sustained during a disaster. Because the Federal government would provide a substantial portion of the actual cost for any of these repairs, Senator Palacios suggests that the local government consider this avenue as a feasible approach in funding community-based projects during these difficult economic times.

Chairman Edward J.B. Calvo concluded by extending his appreciation to those in attendance for presenting their testimony on Bill No. 81 (EC). The Chairman informed

the public that an additional ten (10) working days is provided for individuals wanting to submit written testimony on said legislation. Chairman Calvo adjourned this Public Hearing of the Committee on Finance, Taxation, and Commerce at 12:21 past noon.

IV. COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Finance, Taxation, and Commerce finds that *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that the 30-year old multi-purpose court at the Sinajana Community Center requires resurfacing to ensure the adequate safety of the many youth and villagers who utilize the facility. It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guâhan* to appropriate the sum of Twenty-Thousand Dollars from the Safe Streets Fund to resurface the court in line with the Guam Visitors Bureau's initiative to promote sports tourism and our island's sports facilities. *I Liheslaturan Guâhan* finds that the public assistance grants from the Federal Emergency Management Agency will only replace and repair fencing and lights of the multi-purpose court as a result of direct damage from Typhoon Pongsona. Consistent with federal rules and regulations, the resurfacing of the court is not eligible for public assistance funds due to its state of disrepair prior to Typhoon

Pongsona. The resurfacing of the multi-purpose court must be timely completed prior to the FEMA funded restoration and repairs. Otherwise, completed restoration and repair work will be damaged during resurfacing of the facility.

The Committee on Finance, Taxation, and Commerce, to which Bill No. 81 (EC) "An Act To Appropriate The Sum Of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) From The Safe Streets Fund To The Mayor's Council Of Guam For The Purpose Of Resurfacing The Multi-Purpose Sports Court At The Sinajana Community Center For Safety", was referred, does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan TO PASS Bill No. 81 (EC), as amended by the Committee.

Good Morning Chairman Calvo and members of the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Commerce.

Thank you for this opportunity to address you and provide testimony...

My name is Roke B. Blas, Mayor of the Municipality of Sinajana whose population is 2,853 and I appear before you today humbly requesting that Bill 81 introduced by Senator B.J. Cruz and Senator Judi WonPat be accepted by this committee and passed by the 28th Guam Legislature.

Since the completion of the U.S. Urban Renewal Project in Sinajana in the 60's, Sinajana hasn't seen any new community projects since then. To service the neighborhood H.U.D. built a multipurpose court, a play ground and a baseball field all of which have outlived their normal lifespan.

Natural Disaster after natural disaster, these facilities have taken a beating and have become dilapidated and old. Because the playground was rusted out and falling apart and unsafe, we had no choice but to remove it completely. We are currently in the process of working with GHURA to build a new safer playground at a new location.

We are very grateful to FEMA for their assistance with federal money to do some renovations to the multipurpose court and baseball field. These repairs however, are not enough and sadly FEMA will only restore the facilities to pre-disaster conditions and areas that are old, worn and broken from use are not covered through this federal money.

Our intentions for requesting for this appropriation is to make sure that if the lighting and fencing were to be redone and made anew, then the resurfacing would complete the project and make the whole court usable. The present conditions of the court make it

only playable in some areas. What use would the court be if only the fencing and lighting were done? It would only be nice to look at but not usable.

Since taking office the activity in the community center has increased tenfold and we want to do more... but in order to do more we need better sporting facilities... We would like to start a village wide health program as well as participate in numerous tournaments...

Many years ago, money for a gymnasium was appropriated for the municipality of Sinajana, however, the village never got one... Inasmuch as we'd love to have one built, we realize the financial state the government is in, and hope that this minimal amount will provide some level of comfort and solution until a real sporting facility can be built.

Sadly, the regular Fiscal Year appropriation for the Municipality of Sinajana isn't enough to pay for the resurfacing and using our annual appropriation would greatly impact our operations and funds for our sports programs.

Attached to my testimony is a petition from the *Manamko* of our village who utilize the Community Center on a regular basis and they too would like to be able to use the court for exercise and their activities. They may not be large in numbers but our ultimate goal is to provide healthy alternatives and encourage them to make healthy lifestyle choices.

I am not sure how much more I can say, but please know that we need this money, and are counting on all of you. Si Yu'os Ma'ase!

Not to mention the numerous outer-island teams that practice in the evenings for their leagues. Not a day goes by that the court is not in use.

There is just a feeling of awe when you see these youth and teens play sports guided by parents and coaches who once were in their shoes....they've committed to continue to cycle and know the benefits of playing sports.

Throughout the campaign trail we heard from residents time and time again asking us to make Sinajana active again...the way things used to be... By having a sporting facility that is operable we can promote healthy living and provide a safe alternative to playing on the streets. Studies have shown that students that participate in activities and sports do better in schools because of their concentration and winning attitude. As the Vice Mayor and somewhat young still, I have seen the enthusiasm and the energy that lie in these youths, teen and manamko...Like the saying goes "If you build it they will come..." So let us all make winners out of our village youths and adults...and keep Sinajana active and healthy. I humbly urge this body to pass Bill No. 81. Thank You!

§ 18125. Safe Street Fund.

- (a) There is created within the Superior Court of Guam the Safe Streets Fund (the "Fund"), which shall be maintained separat and apart from the other funds of the Superior Court. The fund shall be held in an interest bearing account. All interest earned shall remain in the Fund.
- (b) All fines collected for any of the acts made unlawful in §§ 18102, 18109, 18111, 18120, and 18121 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, as amended from time to time, and for which punishment is prescribed in §§ 18104, 18105, 18106, 18107, 18109, 18110, 18111, 18119, 18120 and 18121 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, as amended from time to time, shall be deposited in the Safe Streets Fund.
- (c) So much of the Fund as is required is appropriated to the Department of Corrections to be used to compensate staff and provide supplies or facilities to house incarcerated persons convicted of misdemeanors and persons convicted of acts made unlawful in Article 1, Chapter 18 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated.
- (d) The Director of Corrections may expend not more than Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000) per month from the fund for the purpose outlined in Subsection (c) of this Section, which the Administrative Director of the Courts shall pay over to the Director of Corrections on a regular basis. Any funds in excess of the monthly payment to the Director of Corrections and all funds accumulated shall be disbursed in accordance with Subsection (c) of § 9211 of Title 7, Guam Code Annotated.
- (e) Annually, the Superior Court of Guam and the Director of Corrections shall report to the Governor and to the Speaker of the Legislature regarding the status of the Fund during the preceding fiscal year.

- 3 public assistance funds due to its state of disrepair prior to Typhoon
- 4 Pongsona.
- Section 2. Appropriation. The sum of not more than Twenty
- 6 Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the Safe
- 7 Streets Fund to the Mayor's Council of Guam for the purpose of
- 8 resurfacing the multi-purpose court at the Sinajana Community
- 9 Center subject to the procurement and contracting laws of Guam. All
- 10 expenses associated with this appropriation shall be subject to the
- 11 Single-Audit of the government of Guam for the fiscal year in which
- 12 it is completed. Upon project completion, any unexpended balances
- shall revert to the Safe Streets Fund.
