AN ACT TO DISAPPROVE THE NEW CHILD SUPPORT GUIDELINES FILED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF GUAM AND TO CREATE A COMMISSION FOR FURTHER REVIEW OF SAID GUIDELINES AND TO AMEND TITLE 5 GCA SECTION 34118(a) TO REQUIRE THAT THE GUIDELINES BE AMENDED ONCE EVERY FOUR (4) YEARS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. The proposed child support guidelines filed with *I*Liheslaturan Guåhan on March 31, 2005 by the Attorney General of Guam and attached as Exhibit I to this Act are hereby disapproved and rendered invalid.

Section 2. Any and all existing child support guidelines shall remain in effect until further action by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

Section 3. Title 5 GCA Section 34118(a) is hereby amended to read:

"§34118. Payment Schedule. (a) The Attorney General shall adopt, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, a schedule of normal child support payments to be paid by a non-custodial parent to a custodial parent pursuant to Subsections (c)(1) and (c)(2) of this Section, to be updated every four (4) years."

Section 4. There is hereby established, within *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, the Child Support Guidelines Review Commission. The Commission shall consist of the Deputy Attorney General who manages the Child Support Enforcement Division, the Public Defender, the Director and Managing Attorney of Guam Legal Services Corporation, an attorney in private practice with extensive experience in Family Law litigation to be appointed by the President of the Guam Bar Association, a person appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court, the Director of Public Health and Social Services, a social worker to be appointed by the President of the Guam Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers, and the Director of the Bureau of Plans and Statistics. The Commission shall, under the purview and direction of the Chairman of the Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth and Foreign Affairs of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, review the proposed guidelines,

Exhibit 1 attached to Substitute Bill No. 128 (EC), and the written testimony 1 submitted at the public hearing of Bill No. 128 (EC) by the Chief Deputy 2 3 Attorney General who manages the Child Support Enforcement Division and shall make recommendations to the Chairman regarding the enactment of the 4 proposed guidelines. The Commission shall report to the Chairman from 5 time to time as he may require. The Chairman shall provide a meeting place, 6 secretarial and staff support, technical assistance, and such other assistance as 7 the Commission shall need to accomplish its objective. 8

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs conducted a public hearing on June 3, 2005 in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Included in the public hearing was Bill No. 128(EC). Public notice was printed in the Pacific Daily News on May 27 and 31, 2005 and an article was featured in the Pacific Daily News on June 2, 2005.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Douglas Moylan, Attorney General of Guam, gave oral testimony in support of Bill No. 128(EC). General Moylan testified that Bill No. 128(EC) will attempt to provide a uniform system for the child's needs. General Moylan further stated that it is the legal requirement of the Office of the Attorney General to update the Child Support Guidelines every two (2) years and indicated that the last update made was in 1996.

Barbara Cepeda, Deputy Attorney General & IV-D Director, presented oral and written (see attached) in support of Bill No. 128(EC). Ms. Cepeda stated that the proposed Guidelines have been endorsed by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services (Region 9) provided that an amendment be made to 19 G.A.R. §1204(a).

Kathleen Maher, Director, Public Defender Service Corporation, presented oral and written (see attached) testimony in opposition to the legislative passage of the Child Support Guidelines proposed by the Attorney General. Ms. Maher stated that the proposed Child Support Guidelines do not apply to joint and equal custody cases but only to sole custody cases. Ms. Maher stated that this will encourage litigation between parents who may now want to seek sole custody since there will be a presumed guideline child support amount to be received by the sole custody parent.

Ron Moroni, Attorney-at-Law, Tarpley & Moroni, presented oral testimony in opposition to the legislative passage of the Child Support Guidelines proposed by the Attorney General. Mr. Moroni stated that he has concerns regarding joint custody cases. He indicated that many of the custody cases are moving to joint custody and are already problematic under the current guidelines. Mr. Moroni would like to see a mathematical formula used in joint custody situations.

Alec Raphael, Staff Attorney, Guam Legal Services Corp., presented oral testimony citing concerns with the visitation credits in the proposed Guidelines. Mr. Raphael said that it would be very difficult to say with precision how many days a parent visited. Mr. Moroni stated even with strict visitation orders in place many parents modify the order to accommodate schedules. Mr. Moroni further stated that visitation credits is not a bad idea but with the strict guidelines in place may promote more litigation.

Jane Kennedy, Staff Attorney, Public Defender Services Corp, presented oral testimony in opposition to the legislative passage of the Child Support Guidelines proposed by the Attorney General. Ms. Kennedy stated her concern that the language of the Bill would eliminate child support in joint custody situations. Ms. Kennedy further stated that, while it is not the intent of the AG's office to eliminate support in joint custody cases, she recommended that the language be rewritten to be clear that there would be support in joint custody cases.

Tricia Ada, Staff Attorney, Public Defender Services Corp., presented oral testimony in opposition to the legislative passage of the Child Support Guidelines proposed by the Attorney General. Ms. Ada stated that the Guideline should always be the basis whatever the custody situation may be. Ms. Ada further stated that when different formulas are used in different living situations this would encourage the parties to aim for the best one they would want to fall under to have their calculation made.

Kristi Dunning, private citizen, presented oral and written (see attached) testimony in opposition to the legislative passage of the Child Support Guidelines proposed by the Attorney General. Ms. Dunning stated that it would be costly to pay legal fees for the Court to determine child support in joint custody cases. Ms. Dunning inquired as to why a Guideline cannot be established for joint and equal custody arrangements.

Curtis Van deVeld, Attorney-at-Law, Van deVeld, Shimizu, Fisher & Canto, presented oral testimony in favor of the passage of certain sections. Mr. Van deVeld, however, did not indicate the sections that he favored but pointed out that the Guidelines should not be used as an income distribution tool.

Jeffrey Cook, Attorney-at-Law, Cunliffe & Cook, submitted written testimony (see attached) that a more comprehensive review of the Guidelines be done with input from all members of the community who the Guidelines affect.

Richard Pipes, Attorney-at-Law, Law Offices of Richard Pipes, submitted written testimony (see attached) against the Guidelines as drafted. Mr. Pipes stated that there are some areas that need to be addressed with corrective legislation.

R. Todd Thompson, Attorney-at-Law, Mair, Mair, Spade & Thompson, submitted written testimony (see attached) in opposition to the legislative passage of the Child Support Guidelines proposed by the Attorney General. Mr. Thompson wrote that the proposed changes are unnecessary and ill conceived and that the ramifications have not been fully thought through.

Senator Klitzkie posed the question to the panel if any harm would be caused if the Guidelines were not adopted? General Moylan replied that there would be harm caused because the legal precedent set by the Supreme Court of Guam was not being followed. Ms. Maher stated that there would be no harm caused.

Senator B.J. Cruz asked Ms. Barbara Cepeda to clarify her statement regarding the endorsement of the Guidelines by Region 9 but indicated that Region 9 has problems with the Guidelines. Ms. Cepeda replied that the Guidelines were endorsed if the amendment offered in Exhibit 7 were included with the Guidelines. There is, however, no proof of evidence provided by Ms. Cepeda indicating the approval by Region 9.

III. FINDINGS

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs finds that the proposed Child Support Guidelines submitted by the Attorney General contain several issues that need to be further researched and clarified such as the issue regarding support payments in Joint and Equal Physical Custody situations. Another issue is whether the economic indicators used are up-to-date.

The Committee further finds that in light of the opposition by various members of the legal and general community, it would serve the best interest for all parties involved that a Commission be created to further examine the Guidelines.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 128(EC), as substituted by the Committee: "An act to disapprove the new Child Support Guidelines filed by the Attorney General of Guam and to create a Commission for further review of said Guidelines and to amend Title 5 G.C.A. Section 34118(a) to require that the Guidelines be amended once every four years" to I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan with the recommendation TO PASS.
