BILL 158(EC): AN ACT TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE RECYCLING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUAM ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Natural Resources, Utilities & Micronesian Affairs held a public hearing on Thursday, July 7, 2005 at 9:00 a.m. in the Public Hearing Room of the Guam Legislature, Hagåtña, Guam.

Committee Chairwoman, Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown commenced hearing at 9:09 a.m with welcoming remarks.

II. TESTIMONY

The following is a summary of written and oral testimony provided during the hearing:

- Mr. Randy Sablan, Acting Administrator, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, gave written testimony in favor of the bill with amendments to the recycling legislation to allow for better participation from all segments of our community.
- Mr. Ricardo Blas, Director, Guam Customs and Quarantine, is in support of the bill, but had some concerns, one of which would be cost recovery for implementation of the pubic law. Other issues include what entity would be responsible for fees that would be occurred for goods like tires, batteries, white goods and vehicles which are held at the port authority. These are some of the concerns that Customs and Quarantine stated which were not considered during drafting of the recycling laws. Mr. Blas stated that if the public law was to be implemented there would be a shortage of staff to carry out the agency's current duties of boarding vessels, safeguarding our borders, and collecting and processing fees.
- Mr. Joey Crisostomo, Guam Automobile Dealers Association, submitted written testimony in support of a Twenty-Five Dollar (\$25.00) fee attached to vehicle registrations, as opposed to the fee structure set into Public Law 27-38.

• Mr. Monty McDowell, Chairman, Guam Chamber of Commerce, provided written testimony which supports the position of the Guam Automobile Dealers Association which is also supported by the Guam Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors.

III. CONCERNS:

Senator Leon Guerrero questioned that the current law concerning recycling of vehicles states that the fee be assessed at the point of release, and not at the point of sale, as stated in the rules and regulations.

Ms. Barbara Torres, Supervisor, Solid Waste, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, clarified that P.L.27-38 mandated the fee for vehicles to be collected at the point of entry, but this was later changed by P.L. 27-148.

Senator Leon Guerrero was concerned with the difference with the sections of P.L. 28-07 and P.L. 27-148 pertaining to vehicles, stating that this would have a significant impact towards the dealers:

Senator Leon Guerrero asked if it was the recommendation of Mr. Sablan and Mr. McDowell to raise the current registration fee twenty-five dollars more.

Mr. McDowell stated that it was from the recommendation from the Guam Automobile Dealers Association looking for an additional Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).

Vice Speaker Brown stated that the Twenty-Five Dollar (\$25.00) fee is an alternative to what the law already requires.

Mr. Sablan stated that we shouldn't be looking for a new recycling law but just revising the current law.

Vice Speaker Brown stated that we will need to come back to discuss the issue and come up with a better solution to the problems of the recycling law.

Mr. McDowell stated that we will need to track white goods from the base exchange since the bases already provide each family with the necessary white goods.

Vice Speaker concluded the hearing and scheduled a round table meeting for the August 11, 2005 to further discuss amendments needed to address the recycling law.

III. CONCLUSION:

Chairwoman Brown stated that the committee would hold a roundtable meeting with all government and private entities which are impacted by this legislation to discuss any amendments to the legislation.

The hearing was adjourned at 12:45p.m.

Vice Speaker Brown opened with brief information about concerns with fees associated with the disposal of materials. Vice Speaker Brown stated that the committee is faced with the decision to approve or disapprove the rules and regulations based on these concerns. She also stated that the committee wanted to receive feedback from the agencies that would have to implement these rules and regulations.

Mr. Randy Sablan, Acting Administrator, Guam Environmental Protection Agency; stated that the Guam Environmental Protection Agency(GEPA) supports the proposal by the Guam Automobile Dealers Association(GADA) to attach an annual charge to the registration of vehicles. Mr. Sablan also stated that by adopting this proposal, assessing the fees created in Public Law 27-38 & 27-148 would be much easier. According, to Mr. Sablan, GEPA has drafted the necessary changes to legislation to support the proposal from GADA. Mr. Sablan further stated that the proposal would include military personnel who have more than one vehicle per household.

Mr. Dan Camacho, President, Guam Automobile Dealers Association, explained how the association arrived with the Twenty-Five Dollar (\$25.00) fee. Mr. Camacho stated that adding the current disposal fees for batteries and tires per year for life span of each vehicle.

Mr. Paul Tobiason, Recycling Association of Guam, asked Mr. Sablan if there were other recycling facilities that were contacted when the proposed fees were formulated. He also questioned if there were enough recycling centers on island.

Mr. Sablan stated that there are currently about nine (9) centers on island and there are other companies in the process of obtaining permits.

Mr. Steve Aguon, Division of Motor Vehicles, Department of Revenue & Taxation; submitted a letter that was written by Mr. Artemio Illagan, Director of Revenue & Taxation (attached with testimonies).

Vice Speaker Brown asked GEPA for a breakdown of what would be a feasible volume of cars that would be moved around each year, so when DPW comes out to contract there is an intake system that would allow for sanitation and storage so that these same cars don't end up "back in the jungle."

Mr. Joey Crisostomo, GADA, stated that the only way that we can get the public to accept the Advance Disposal Fee is if we called it the "Guam Disposal Fee." Mr. Crisostomo questioned if the Abandoned Vehicle Streetlight fund was still being collected by Revenue & Taxation.

Mr. Steven Aguon stated that since the Advance Disposal Fee was not enacted Revenue & Taxation still collects for the Abandoned Vehicle Fund.

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V. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee finds that Bill No. 158 (EC) "An act to approve or disapprove the Recycling Rules and Regulations for the Guam Environmental Protection Agency," is in line with efforts of previous laws passed intended to clean and beautify our island through responsible disposal methods and the reduction and recycling of waste streams. The Committee further finds – after several meetings with the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Public Works, Department of Revenue & Taxation, and Guam Customs and Quarantine – that there are several complexities found that have to be resolved before implementing the proposed recycling rules and regulations. The Committee additionally finds that if the proposed recycling rules and regulations were approved, consumers, businesses and governmental agencies would be heavily impacted by cost and an onset of technical perplexities.

One of the concerns would be the ability for Customs and Quarantine to receive funding to cover administrative fees to track and collect recycling fees. The issue also extends to the business community that would have additional administrative cost in implementing the fee schedule. Therefore, the added cost would be passed on to consumers. Another, concern would be the ability to track white goods sold by the Military Base Exchanges, which is not addressed in the recycling rules and regulations. As a result businesses in the local community that pay taxes would be at a disadvantage because the cost of their goods would be increased automatically as a result of the Advanced Disposal Fees.

The Committee also recognizes that the Solid Waste Disposal Rules and Regulations were required to change so that both rules and regulations would correspond with each other. With the opposition of the proposed recycling rules and regulations it is the Committees

recommendation also to disapprove the proposed changes to the solid waste rules and regulations.

Furthermore, pursuant to Article 3, Chapter 9, Section 9301(d) of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, proposed rules and regulations under the Administrative Adjudication Law, shall include, as part of the promulgation of such rules or regulations, an economic impact statement, which must be completed and made available to the public prior to any required hearings on the proposed rules or regulations. Neither the proposed recycling nor solid waste rules and regulations were accompanied by an economic impact statement upon submission to *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. Additionally, as required by Public Law 28-58, the Bureau of Statistics and Plans was mandated to perform an economic impact statement, at the request of GEPA, which was to be submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* with the regulations.

Therefore, it is the recommendation by the Committee on Natural Resources, Utilities and Micronesian Affairs which Bill No. 158 (EC) As Substituted by the Committee on Natural Resources, Utilities and Micronesian Affairs was referred, TO DO PASS, in order to disapprove the proposed rules and regulations.
