- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
- 2 Section 1. Disapproval of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency
- 3 Recycling Rules and Regulations. The Recycling Rules and Regulations for the
- 4 Guam Environmental Protection Agency ("GEPA"), that were adopted by the Board

- 1 of Directors for GEPA on June 17, 2005, are hereby disapproved and repealed.
- 2 These rules and regulations are attached hereto and labeled as **Exhibit A**.
- Section 2. Disapproval of Amendments to the Guam Solid Waste
- 4 Disposal Rules and Regulations. The amendments to the Guam Solid Waste
- 5 Disposal Rules and Regulations for GEPA that were adopted by the Guam
- 6 Environmental Protection Agency Board of Directors on June 17, 2005, in order to
- 7 renumber said regulations are hereby disapproved and repealed. These rules and

The Recycling Fee Payment Form issued 15 shall have the information of the vehicle model, make, year, engine number, 16 and vehicle identification number (VIN). 17 18 Payment must be made prior to obtaining vehicle registration and Certificate (5) 19 of Ownership issued by the Department of Revenue and Taxation, Division 20 of Motor Vehicles. 21 22 The Department of Revenue and Taxation, Division of Motor Vehicles shall (6) 23 withhold the issuance of the vehicle registration for any imported motor 24 vehicle sold through a dealer until the official receipt from CQA is presented 25 evidencing the payment of the recycling fee for said vehicle being registered. 26 27 As per Section 23503.3, a statement of proof that such "recycling fee" has 28 (7) been paid on the vehicle must appear as a separate line item on every
