


Dear Senators of The Guam Legislature,

Testimony on Bill #16

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen of the 28th Guam Legislature:

On behalf of the Youth For Youth Organization (YFYO) We hereby submit this testimony on the proposed Bill #16, AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 90100, 90103 and 90107 AND ADD A NEW SUB SECTION (6) TO SECTION 90105, CHAPTER 90, DIVISION 4, OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF SMOKING ACTIVITIES, TO BE KNOWN AS THE “NATASHA PROTECTION ACT.”

We are a Youth Organization that believes in living drug-free (to include tobacco and alcohol, legal drugs) and promoting a healthy lifestyle.

The fact is SECOND HAND SMOKE (SHS) harms everyone – smokers and non-smokers and second hand smoke is especially harmful to young children.

The FACTS remain:

- Everyday on Guam, one person dies from tobacco related diseases.
- Guam has the highest rate for adult smoking among all the US States and Territories. One in the three adults smokes on Guam; many of them smoke around children.
- 57% of Guam middle school students live with a smoker.
- 44% of Middle School students reported riding in a car with a smoker in the past week.
- A child who lives with a smoker inhales the equivalent of 102 packs of cigarettes by the age of 5.
- SHS is responsible for between 150,00 and 300,000 lower respiratory tract infections in infants and children under 18 months of age, resulting in between 7,500 and 15,000 hospitalizations each year, and,
- It causes 1,900 to 2,700 sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS) deaths in the United States annually.
- SHS can also aggravate symptoms in 200,000 to 1,000,000 children with asthma and,
- There is no economically or practical way to purify recirculating air systems.

The Youth For Youth Organization believes the best way to protect children from second hand smoke is to keep their surroundings completely smoke-free. The data on smoking has been proven to be correct, it is therefore our hope that the 28th Guam Legislature will “STRENGTHEN” proposed Bill #16 to provide a non-smoking environment in ENCLOSED PUBLIC PLACES.

We ask this Honorable body Enough is Enough1!! – “Save our Future ... SAVE US – the Children of Guam!”

Guam would be wise to join smoke-free states

Sen. Lou Leon Guerrero's introduction of Bill 16, also known as Natasha Protection Act of 2005, is an excellent bill that is long overdue.

Currently, 15 states in the United States are reviewing bills to ban smoking in public places. Guam would be wise to join the ranks of promoting a healthy environment for their people, especially the children. Eight states now prohibit smoking in restaurants; 33 states require enclosed ventilated areas for smoking apart from the public areas.

It has been shown through research that smoke-free laws add value to the business establishments, reduce the number of days missed by workers, reduce the cost of maintenance to heating/air-conditioner units, and reduce health-related issues with doctors and hospitals.

Scientists have not been able to identify a safe threshold level of exposure — even very

low levels of secondhand smoke can cause illness or even death. It's what scientists call a non-linear dose response. Therefore, while ventilation or air filtration system (air purifiers or air cleaners) may be successful in reducing the level of visible smoke in the air; this reduction doesn't eliminate hazardous toxins and gasses found in secondhand smoke. Many of us who do not smoke are quite aware of someone beginning to smoke the moment they take their first puff.

Please, Guam, do not tell me you do not care about our children and those around us who cannot enjoy the freedom of going out to eat with their families. Help Natasha as well as many others. Pass Bill 16.

Anti-smoking legislation likely to affect social patterns on Guam

While it may be too early to predict the economic effect of banning smoking in bars and restaurants on Guam, it is probable that such a ban would have a big impact on consumer habits, local businessmen say.

Bill 16, and its amendment, introduced by Sen. Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, would ban smoking in restaurants and bars if passed into law. The bill is awaiting its hearing with the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Commerce, chaired by Sen. Edward J.B. Calvo.

Ireland, which passed a law to prohibit smoking in public houses in 2004, has seen an initial double-digit decline in business in those pubs, leveling off at about 15%, according to Damien Fallon, general manager of Pacific Ventures Inc., which runs the Taco Bell/Long John Silver's franchises on Guam. Fallon, who is originally from Ireland, said that smok-

ing in pubs is an institution in that country, and the ban changed the way that many people consumed alcohol.

"The decline was actually offset to a large degree by an increase in off-license sales, which is the equivalent of liquor stores here," Fallon said.

Ireland's climate deterred people from leaving an establishment to smoke, he said. "Ireland has the problem where the weather is typically a kind of mix with a damp coldness, and it's very, very difficult for people to go outside even to smoke a cigarette. It's nothing short of freezing. If you drive people out of pubs, all the comfort is lost because of the weather."

Trevor Adsett, based in Singapore, is customer director for Asia of Diageo, whose imports to Guam include

Johnnie Walker, Gordon's Gin, Smirnoff Vodka, J&B whisky and Tanqueray Gin. His customers on Guam include Island Wines and Spirits, among other liquor importers.

Adsett told the *Journal*, "If the proposal goes through, I would think that it will affect their companies' performance by about 10% to 15% and so have an implication on their companies' taxable revenue as well as consideration to staff employment levels."

Paul Shimizu, general manager of Ambros Inc./Shimbros, said that customers will find other ways to have a cigarette with their alcohol.

"They'll actually look for somewhere else where they can do that," Shimizu said. "When you start to limit customers' choices, they'll find ways to do it elsewhere. They'll probably still go to the establishments, but they'll find another place where they can go ahead and use tobacco products."

Shimizu said that restaurants and

bars that can provide outside smoking areas will do so to lessen the impact on their business, but said that there will be an impact. "Businesses will be affected because they're afraid that their regular customers will not patronize their establishments," Shimizu said.

Both Shimizu and Fallon suggested an alternative: using a ventilation and air-conditioning system that doesn't allow smoke to go into non-smoking sections.

"In this day and age of technology, you can actually purify the air quite substantially, even in the smoking section in a restaurant," Fallon said. "There would be some costs associated. I've been in places in the mainland where you can be sitting in the smoking section, and the smoke literally does not get out of it. That is another possibility to think of, in terms of benefiting the Japanese, first of all."

Fallon said that not all businesses will be affected — the Taco Bell/Long John Silver's restaurants, for example, have been smoke-free for three years without a negative impact.

"Ours is somewhat of a different business because people are in and out quickly," he said. "In our Taco Bell in Tamuning, it's actually had a positive effect. First of all, people can now bring their children to eat and not worry about it. We also get our fair share of health professionals, and these people who are very health conscious tend to appreciate it more."

Meanwhile, education against tobacco use received a boost with the signing into law on June 3 of Public Law 28-40. The legislation extends the timeline set by Public Law 27-69 for the departments of public health and social services and mental health and substance abuse to develop programs to be funded by \$1.5 million from the Tobacco Trust and Endowment Funds. **MBJ**

Restaurants to oppose smoking bill

LEADERS of the island's hotel and restaurant sectors are expected to oppose Bill 16, which would totally ban smoking on dining establishments on island. The controversial bill, sponsored by Sen. Lou Leon Guerrero, is finally scheduled to have a public hearing today after previous hearings on the

bill were postponed. Bartley Jackson, chairman of the Guam Hotel and Restaurants Association, said his organization plans to submit testimony opposing Bill 16. "This is an issue that impacts all of us, directly if you have free standing restaurants or restaurants inside hotels, or indirectly because all of us go to restaurants," Jackson told

GHRA members during the group's monthly meeting yesterday. As an organization, Jackson said GHRA needs to support its members and their families. "As an industry, we believe in supporting the health of all of our employees and that of our families, and our customers. Thus we will be in favor of any bill or regulation that assists us in that

effort," the GHRA chairman said. However, Jackson said GHRA's board is not supportive of Bill 16 as currently written because it is "arbitrary" in its selection of places that offer food versus those that don't. "It's inconsistent and unfair. Thus, we are going to oppose it. If the bill was really concerned

about health, then why does it stop at restaurants. Why doesn't it include all bars, clubs, hotel lobbies, and other public areas. Those areas also have employees and customers." Jackson pointed out. "Consequently, we feel that this inconsistency prevents us from supporting this bill. As far as I know we

don't have any bars that don't serve food as members although we have lots of member restaurants that have bars. So we feel that it picks on our members in an arbitrary way." Jackson stressed. Bill 16, if enacted into law, would also apply to restaurants with drinking bars. "If a restaurant includes an area devoted to the serving of alcoholic beverages, that area shall be deemed part of

the restaurant, not a separate bar," the bill states. Although restaurant owners and managers interviewed by Variety did not want to be quoted, they confided that they intend to vote positively if GHRA decides to adopt a position paper opposing the bill. According to Sen. Leon Guerrero, majority of the exposure of secondhand smoke comes from confined areas

such as dining in a restaurant. "There is indisputable scientific evidence that exists linking tobacco use and exposure to secondhand tobacco smoke to pulmonary and cardiovascular diseases and cancer," she added. Currently, most restaurants are already divided between smokers and nonsmokers. However, Leon Guerrero said there is still a serious level of risk for non-

smokers because secondhand smoke is released directly into a confined indoor space, with it being diluted into the outdoor general atmosphere. But Jackson insists that any smoking legislation must be consistent. "If its primary aim is protecting the health of the people of Guam, our employees, and all of our visitors, then let's go do it. But let's not be selective," Jackson said.

SUBJECT: **Re-Referral of Bill 16, "relative to the regulation of smoking activities, to be known as the "Natasha Protection Act"**

I have received your e-mails regarding the re-referring of Bill 16 to the Committee on Finance, Taxation, and Commerce. I appreciate Sen. Calvo's concerns that Bill 16 may affect businesses due to unfair competition between restaurants and bars, and potential loss of business to smokers. However, Bill 16 also protects employees and private citizens from second-hand smoke. If implemented, we may expect positive impacts in decreasing numbers in lung cancer, lower cases of asthmatic patients, lower medical costs, and lower insurance costs. There are many states who have seen some positive impacts on the community and have shown no affect to businesses, such as California and Massachusetts.

According to the Standing Rules, Section 17.04 states that the Committee on Health and Human Services shall have purview over "Guam's comprehensive health planning system" and "to health in general."

The late notification on change of referral is problematic because Bill 16 was referred to our committee on January 17th and our public hearing date is scheduled for March 10th. Also, we have met with several constituents, organizations, and have done some research on the matter. More importantly, we've sent out numerous notifications and advertisements, and we are now left with numerous constituents who are not pleased with the further delay. It only makes sense that our committee should have oversight on Bill 16. I truly hope you will consider our viewpoint in this matter.

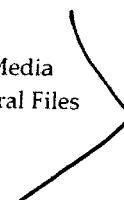
