AN **ACT** TO **PLACE** THE **FORMER INARAJAN ELEMENTARY** SCHOOL **FACILITY UNDER** THE ADMINISTRATIVE JURISDICTION OF THE INARAJAN MAYOR'S OFFICE; TO INCREASE THE PORTION OF THE MARBO PROPERTY TO BE LEASED FOR A NEW SCHOOL BY AMENDING P.L. 28-68, CHAPTER II, PART I, SECTION 20; AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDING FOR THE MAYOR OF PITI TO LEASE OFFICE SPACE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Transfer of Property. The administrative jurisdiction over the
- 3 former Inarajan Elementary School facility is hereby transferred to the Inarajan
- 4 Mayor's office to be used for civic and community purposes. Such purposes

- 1 include, but are not limited to, a community center, recreational uses, emergency
- 2 shelter, police and/or fire station use, library, learning center and senior citizens'
- 3 center.
- 4 Section 2. Item (a) of Section 20 of Part I of Chapter II of Public Law 28-
- 5 68 is hereby *amended* to read:
- 6 "(a) Authorization to Enter into Lease. For the purpose of
- 7 facilitating the financing of the design, construction and maintenance of an
- 8 Education Facility, as defined in Title 5 GCA §58103(e), an Education Agency,
- 9 namely the Guam Public School System, or the government of Guam, as the case
- may be, is authorized to lease, to a Contractor, up to thirty-five (35) acres of
- 11 certain real property located on Guam better described more particularly as that
- 12 certain real property, located in Yigo, Guam, known as Lot Marbo Base Command
- "B"-4, consisting of approximately eighty (80) acres, as described in Exhibit "A"
- of the United States Quitclaim Deed, Instrument Number 479882, of which to
- 15 construct an Education Facility, as defined in Title 5 GCA §58103(e) pursuant to
- 16 Chapter 58 of Title 5, also known as the Education Facilities Construction
- 17 Initiative Act of 2001, as amended."
- 18 Section 3. Authorization to Make Changes to the RFP. The education
- agency is authorized to amend the Request For Proposal authorized by Item (b) of
- 20 Section 20 of Part I of Chapter II of Public Law 28-68 and attached thereto as
- 21 Exhibit "B" of Public Law 28-68 to allow for the leasing of up to thirty-five (35)
- 22 acres of certain real property located on Guam better described more particularly
- as that certain real property, located in Yigo, Guam, known as Lot Marbo Base
- 24 Command "B"-4, consisting of approximately eighty (80) acres, as described in
- 25 Exhibit "A" of the United States Quitclaim Deed, Instrument Number 479882 as
- authorized by Section 1 of this Act.

Section 4. A new Item (1) is hereby *added* to Subsection (a) of Section 32 of Chapter III, Public Law 28-68 to read:

"(1) Municipal Office Space Rental. The sum of Twelve Thousand
 Dollars (\$12,000.00) from the Fiscal Year 2006 General Fund appropriation to the
 Mayors Council of Guam is authorized for the purpose of funding office space

COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 172 (EC)

An Act To Place The Former Inarajan Elementary School Facility Under The Administrative Jurisdiction Of The Inarajan Mayor's Office.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 172 would relocate the current office of the Inarajan Mayor from the Malojojo back to the village in Inarajan. For several years the Mayor's Office has been situated at the social hall next to the Malojojo Catholic Parish and has been leasing the facilities allocated from the budget. The committee finds that the Department of Education has not utilized the former Inarajan Elementary Building for several years and has agreed to transfer the building to house the new Inarajan Mayor's Office.

The people of Inarajan are voters too and are your constituents as well. Together, we all have the responsibility in providing for them.

That being said, the following issues and concerns are hereby listed for your consideration:

- The present facility, although very accommodating for routine office operations, public meetings, civic and parish functions, community programs and activities and other large gathering, the structure however, is not conducive for an Emergency Operation Center particularly during typhoons. Just this week with Tropical Storm Nabi and with past typhoons, flooding and roof leaks are our usual battle during the storms.
- 2. Often times I get criticize by St. Joseph Parishioners that I am only patronizing San Isidro. They to, have a Social Hall.
- 3. As with most leased properties; expansion, improvements and modifications are prohibited or restricted, thus hindering operations need and efficiency.
- 4. The abandoned school building is government property, has been unoccupied for over 8 years, strong structure, lots of floor space, adequate public parking, ADA complaint, and everything else a public facility should have.
- 5. Because of its long time idleness, initial cost to repair, renovate, and restore the facility to usable condition may be large but long term savings will be realized.
- 6. Unless we can afford a new Mayor's Office all together, relocating the Mayor's Office to this unoccupied building at the present time is an investment and the right thing to do for our community.

Above are the major justifications in support of Bill 172.

As usual, in all my closing messages, I wish to depart with you these words. "It has been said that those who know the most say the least, and those who know the least say the most. I wish not to be numbered among the latter, therefore, I will now conclude my testimony."
