BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Transfer of The Administration Of Soil And Water Conservation Programs to the University of Guam. The administration of the Soil and Water Conservation Programs contained in Article 5 of Chapter 63 Of 4 5 Title 5, Guam Code Annotated from the Department of Agriculture to the University of Guam. All reference in said Article supra, to the Department of 6 Agriculture shall be changed to the University of Guam. All reference in said 7 Article supra, to the Director of the Department of Agriculture shall be changed to 8 the President of the University of Guam. The Compiler of Laws shall re-codify 9 10 said Article supra, from 5 G.C.A. to 17 G.C.A.

II. Summary of Testimonies

Bill No. 123 (EC)

Mr. Paul Bassler, Director of the Department of Agriculture (DOA), testified in support of the Bill. He noted that since the 27th Guam Legislature saw fit to appropriate the funding for the Soil and Water Conservation programs to the University of Guam (UOG), the administrative responsibilities of the Program should also be transferred to UOG. He also stated that if the Legislature saw fit to revert the funding for the program to DOA, he would have no problem keeping the administrative functions with DOA.

Mr. Benny San Nicolas, Farmer of the Southern District of Inarajan & Chairman of the Southern Salt & Water Conservation District Board, testified in support of the Bill. He noted that since the program is working well under the guidance of UOG.

Dr. Lee Yu din, Dean of the College of Natural Applied Sciences (former College of Agriculture and Life Sciences) at the University of Guam, testified in support of the Bill. He echoed the sentiments of the DOA Director in that the responsibility should follow the money. He noted that it would have made better sense if the legislature had transferred the administrative functions prior to making appropriations to UOG. He also noted the UOG has advanced its own money towards the program since UOG had received only \$10,000 of the \$100,000 appropriation at the time of the hearing.

Mr. Ernie Wusstig, Chairman of the Northern Salt and Water Conservation District Board & the Vice President of the Pacific Basin of Conservation Districts, testified in support of the Bill. He believed the program was largely an educational program for farmers and that UOG's College of Agriculture would be best suited to administer it.

Remarks By Senators

Senator Larry Kasperbauer. Senator Kasperbauer asked general questions of the witnesses regarding the history of the program and its future plans if the bill should pass. He also inquired about the staffing for the program.

Senator Adolpho Palacios. Senator Palacios expressed concern regarding the level of funding that was released to UOG at the time of the hearing. Dr. Yudin replied that UOG had advanced \$50,000 of its own money

Senator Ray Tenorio. Senator Tenorio expressed his support for Agriculture and commended all the witnesses for their work and dedication.

III Findings and Recommendations

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations, & Reorganization finds that since the funding for the Soil and Conservation programs of the Department of Agriculture (DOA) is appropriated to the University of Guam (UOG), that the administrative responsibilities should also be vested with UOG. The committee further finds that the Soil and Conservation program is largely an educational function and that UOG would be better suited toadminister the program than DOA.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations, & Reorganization that Bill No. 123 (EC) be reported out with the recommendation to DO PASS.
