

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. §4203.3 of Article 2, Chapter 4 of Title 4 GCA is hereby amended
- 3 to read:

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"§4203.3. Prohibition: Sex Offenders Prohibited From Employment in Agencies and Facilities of the Government of Guam.

- (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry shall work in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam.
- Section 2. §5253 of Title 5 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

"§5253. Restriction Against Contractors Employing Convicted Sex Offenders from Working at Government of Guam Venues.

- (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, and who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for an agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, shall work for his employer on the property of the government of Guam other than a public highway.
- (b) All contracts for services to agencies listed herein shall include the following provisions: (1) warranties that no person providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a mimimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry; and (2) that if any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the

- provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of

OVERVIEW:

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations, and Reorganization held public hearings on Bill 233 (EC) on December 7, 2005 in the Guam Legislature public hearing rooms in Hagatna, Guam. Notice of public hearing was printed in the Pacific Daily News (See Appendix B) and disseminated throughout all local media.

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY:

Dr. Judi Gutherz, professor at the University of Guam, provided the committee with letters written by her students concerning Bill 233 (EC). The letters are available for your perusal at Bob's Office and www.bobsoffice.org.

Kenneth P. Chargualaf, acting superintendent of Guam Public School System, submitted written testimony in favor of Bill 233 (EC), though he suggested the following amendments:

- prohibit the employment of anyone whose conviction was of an offense which includes all the elements of a crime described in Title 9 GCA, Chapter 25, or Title 2, Article 2
- change Section 2 of the bill, as outlined in the testimony, to remedy the confusion of "in any agency or instrumentality of the Government of Guam." Chargualaf states that the intent is not clear.

FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recent events suggest the increased need to address laws dealing with the employment of sex offenders in our government.

Bill 233 is a measure providing protection in the government work place from persons convicted of sex offenses and amends local law to limit the employment of sex offenders in Government of Guam agencies and facilities.

The committee finds that prospective prohibition against employing sex offenders in governmental workplace is salutary.

The matter of involuntary transfers of government employees convicted of sex offenses before the passage of this bill gives rise to a constitutional issue, i.e. the prohibition against *ex post facto* laws. While a provision that mandates voluntary transfers may be constitutionally infirm, a system encouraging voluntary transfers is salutary.

Therefore, the committee finds that Section 2, subsection (b) of Bill 233 should be deleted and proffers a new Section 3 to be added to the bill as follows:

Section 3. Section 20106(e) of Title 5 Guam Code Annotated is hereby added to read:

"(e) The Director of Administration shall establish and maintain a list of all government employees who are sex offenders as that term is defined in Section 4203.3, of Article 2, Chapter 4 of Title 4 Guam Code Annotated and identify those employees who are assigned to positions which require public contact. The Director shall determine the positions in the classified service not requiring public contact for which those employees are qualified and eligible. The director shall notify each employee determined to be eligible for a position or of positions of his or her eligibility and allow the employee to voluntarily transfer to a position not requiring public contact."



Footnotes: 1/The intent of the proposed bill is to amend existing statute to prohibit employment of sex offenders in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam. And if such offenders are currently employed in the Guam Public School System, or "similarly employed in the government of Guam" then they shall immediately be transferred to a position in another agency having no contact with the general public. Such offense is defined in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 25, 9 GCA, and Article 2 of Chapter 28, 9 GCA, and which shall apply whether convicted in Guam, United States, the federal government or a foreign country for purposes of this bill. Additionally, the bill includes that if such sex offender is employed by a business contracted to perform services for an agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, then he/she is restricted from working in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam. As such, all contracts for services to agencies shall include contract provisions, as stipulated in the bill language to meet the intent of the bill. Enactment of the proposed bill entails a fiscal impact government-wide, connected to any transfer of individual(s) affected by the proposed bill. Fund requirements to implement the intent of the bill may be absorbed under existing budgets or be included in subsequent annual budgets.

Dear Chairman and Committee Members:

Hafa Adai! We endorse the intent of Bill No. 233 which proposes to limit employment with the government of Guam of individuals who have been convicted of sex crimes in Guam and other jurisdictions. The Guam Public School System particularly welcomes this action because of the large number of vulnerable children which are in our care. Many of them lack the judgment and experience to distinguish between predators and friends. Because they lack this judgment, it is our responsibility to exercise this judgment for them. At the present moment, we lack the legal tools we need to provide each child with a secure environment. At the present moment, it is not illegal for a convicted felon of any sort to work at our schools.

This situation needs to be remedied and we are thankful that steps are being taken by this Legislature to remove these offenders from our schools. It is not an acceptable compromise to place these individuals in public positions in Guam Public School System which don't involve contact with the public.

The fact is that it is that a position within the Guam Public School System which does not have the potential of contact with children is practically non-existent. I would not want to assume the responsibility for assuring the public that these contacts could never occur because mistakes are always possible. This matter is too important for mistakes.

This said, the language of Bill No. 233 could more effectively accomplish this goal with some changes. In Sections 1-3, the following language appears. "No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in another state or subdivision of the United States or a foreign country with similar or identical elements of a sexual nature, or listed on the Sex Offender Registry, ----".

The language of the Bill is very clear as to what is being outlawed if the offender committed the crime on Guam. In a desire to be comprehensive and deal with individuals who have convicted elsewhere, language is introduced which is unnecessarily vague and may result in delay and litigation before a court decides what it means. This urgent public safety issue does not need further delay or litigation. The use of the phrase "similar or identical elements of a sexual nature" is an unnecessary problem with the legislation. It will be relatively easy for those who will administer the law to decide whether a conviction in a foreign jurisdiction involves the identical elements for a crime under Guam law. The difficulties for honest and conscientious public servants will come when the question is asked as to whether a particular conviction involved elements "similar" to those that are a part of Guam law.

No one can say with certainty what kind of sexual conduct is similar to that outlawed by Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or Article 2 of Chapter 28 until a court decides the matter. While the question is decided, time is wasted and children will not receive the protection the Bill is intended to provide.

We understand the concern that there should be no loop holes which will allow individuals convicted in other places to slip through the employment prohibition and do harm. The way to accomplish this goal is to prohibit the employment of anyone whose conviction was of an offense which includes at least all of the elements of a crime described in Title 9 GCA, Chapter 25, or Title 28, Article 2.

The reference to employment "in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam." is also confusing. Employees of contractors don't work in any agency or instrumentality of the government because they are not employees. Perhaps the aim is to prevent them from working on government property, but the intent is not clear.

To remedy these two sources of confusion, the language should read in Section 2 for example, "No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25, Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or who has been convicted of an offense in any jurisdiction which includes at least all of the elements of any such offense under Guam law as all or part of the proof of guilt, or is required to register as a sex offender with any registry maintained by Guam or any other jurisdiction, who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for the government of Guam, may work for his employer on the property of the government of Guam other than a public highway."

AN ACT TO AMEND §4203.3 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 4 AND TO AMEND §5253 TO TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING CONVICTED SEX OFFENDERS FROM BEING EMPLOYED IN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM OR BY GOVERNMENT CONTRACTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 4203.3, of Article 2, Chapter 4 of Title 4 is hereby amended to read:

"§4203.3. Prohibition: Sex offenders prohibited from employment in the Guam Public School System or other agencies and facilities of the government of Guam frequented by children. (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in another state or subdivision of the United States, the federal government or a foreign

country with similar or identical elements of a sexual nature, or listed on the Sex Offender Registry may shall work in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam. on the campus of any public school, on the campuses of the Guam Community College or the University of Guam, as a bus driver, in any public library, the Department of Youth Affairs, at the Guam Memorial Hospital, at the Medical Services and the Child Protection Services divisions of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, at the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), at the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, or in areas frequented by children under the jurisdiction of the Department of Parks and Recreation including, but not limited to, the Hagåtña Pool."

(b) A sex offender currently employed by the government of Guam in the Guam Public School System following the enactment of this Act shall immediately be transferred out of the Guam Public School System to a position in another agency having no contact with the general public. All other sex offenders similarly employed in the government of Guam shall be reassigned to positions where there is no contact with the general public.

Section 2. Section 5253 to Title 5 Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read:

"§5253. Restriction against contractors employing convicted sex

offenders from working at certain government of Guam venues. (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in another state or subdivision of the United States or a foreign country with similar or identical elements of a sexual nature, or listed on the Sex Offender Registry, who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for an agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, may shall work in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam. on the campus of any public school, on the campuses of the Guam Community College or the University of Guam, as a bus driver, in any public library, the Department of Youth Affairs, at the Guam Memorial Hospital, at the Medical Services and the Child Protection Services divisions of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, at the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), at the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, or in areas frequented by children under the jurisdiction of an agency of the government of Guam including, but not limited to, the Hagåtña Pool.

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(b) All contracts for services to agencies listed herein shall include the following provisions: (1) warranties that no person, providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or an offense in another state or subdivision of the United States or a foreign country with similar or identical elements of a sexual nature, or listed on the Sex Offender Registry; (2) that if any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA or an offense in another state or subdivision of the United States or a foreign country with similar or identical elements of a sexual nature, or legally listed on the Sex Offender Registry, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction.

- (c) Duties of the General Services Agency or Procurement Administrators. All contracts, bids, or Requests for Proposals shall state all the conditions in §5253(b).
- (d) Any contractor found in violation of §5253(b), after notice from the contracting authority of such violation, shall within twenty-four (24) hours take corrective action and shall report such action to the contracting authority. Failure to take corrective action within the stipulated period may result in the temporary suspension of the contract at the discretion of the contracting authority."
