AN ACT TO AMEND ATTACHMENT A-1 OF PUBLIC LAW 29-19 RELATIVE TO (k)(2) OF §22435, CHAPTER 22, TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE GUAM PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM ACCESS TO VITALLY NEEDED FUNDS IN ORDER TO ADDRESS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND FACILITY REPAIRS WHICH DO NOT REQUIRE AN ENGINEERING ASSESSMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Intent. Recent failures of safety and sanitary
- 3 inspections conducted by the Department of Public Health and Social Services and
- 4 the Guam Fire Department by as many as eight (8) schools within the Guam Public
- 5 School System is of great concern to I Liheslaturan Guåhan, as the very health and

safety of our children have been placed at great risk. These conditions cannot and 1 should not be tolerated. I Liheslaturan Guåhan, by this Act, intends to make 2 available the funding necessary for the Guam Public School System to immediately 3 make the necessary repairs in order to correct these deficiencies and ensure that the 4 5 health and safety of our school children, teachers and staff are not compromised. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that proceeds from the sale of the government of Guam 6 General Obligation Bonds, 2007 Series A, included Twenty-nine Million Five 7 Hundred Four Thousand Dollars (\$29,504,000) to fund the capital expense items 8 and capital improvement projects of the Guam Public School System needed to 9 10 comply with the "Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act" as listed in Attachments A and A-1. Additionally, I Liheslaturan Guåhan has been 11 12 informed by the Administration that pro rata adjustments have been made to the distribution of all recipients of bond proceeds as Seventy-nine Million Dollars 13 (\$79,000,000) was appropriated for various uses; however, the net proceeds from 14 the sale of the bonds amounted to Sixty-nine Million Two Hundred Seventy-seven 15 Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-two Dollars (\$69,277,352). As a result the bond 16 proceeds for the Guam Public School System capital expense items and capital 17 improvement projects have been adjusted to Twenty-six Million One Hundred 18 19 Thirty-five Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars (\$26,135,977). It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to amend legislation which requires an 20 assessment by an outsourced engineering firm prior to the use of bond proceeds for 21 capital improvement projects and facility repairs, provided, that such capital 22 improvement projects and facility repairs are not structural in nature and are 23 necessary to address health and safety concerns resulting from failed inspections 24 25 by the Department of Public Health and Social Services and the Guam Fire Department. I Liheslaturan Guåhan has been informed by the Guam Public 26 School System that such a list of urgently needed repairs, which are not structural 27

in nature, will be made available to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to append said list to this Act.

Section 2. Attachment A-1 of Public Law 29-19 relative to (k)(2) of §22435, Chapter 22, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read:

- "(a) Funds provided to Guam Public School System (GPSS) from the Bond proceeds for capital improvement projects and facilities repair, shall be held in reserve until such time as an assessment of the facilities is conducted by an outsourced engineering firm. The Superintendent of Education is authorized to use bond funding proceeds for the outsourcing of the assessment. Upon completion of the assessment, the Superintendent shall ensure that funds are expended in accordance with the recommendations contained in the assessment.
- (b) Notwithstanding all other provisions of law, the following funds from the Bond proceeds as delineated in Attachment A of Public Law 29-19, specifically: Intercom, Security & Fire Alarm Systems; A/C Replacement; A/C Maintenance and Repairs; Recreational Facility Upgrade and Replacement; and General CIP (Facility Repair/Replacement), may be released from reserve for the purposes of addressing health, sanitary and safety repairs, replacements, and services necessary to correct the deficiencies cited in an official citation report from an enforcement agency of the government of Guam relative to the health, sanitation and safety of the students and personnel of the GPSS. The funds to be used *shall* come from the respective category relative to the deficiency. Funds for items, repairs, replacements and services *not* relative to categories listed *shall* come from the General CIP (Facility Repair/Replacement) category. The requirement for an engineering assessment *shall* not apply to repairs, replacements, and services which are *not* structural in nature and which are necessary pursuant

to this Subsection.

- (c) The Superintendent of Education, within five (5) working days from the receipt of a citation report from an enforcement agency of the government of Guam relative to the health, sanitation and safety of the students and personnel of the GPSS, *shall* provide to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a list of items and services necessary to correct the deficiencies cited.
- (d) In addition to the reporting requirements mandated by Public Law 29-19, at the end of each month the Superintendent of Education *shall* submit to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a detailed report of the expenditures made pursuant to Subsection (b), including, the category from which the expenditure was funded, the citation report it addressed, and the remaining balance of the respective category from which the funds were used. The GPSS *shall* post said report on its website. The penalty for noncompliance of reporting requirements as mandated by Public Law 29-19 *shall* apply to this Section."
