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§70100. Definitions. As used in this Chapter:

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(a) *Board* means the Contractors License Board.

3 (b) *Contractor* means any person who undertakes to construct, 4 alter, repair, add to, subtract from, improve, move, wreck *or* demolish any 5 building, highway, road, railroad, excavation *or* other structure, project 6 development or improvement *or* do any part thereof, including the erection 7 of scaffolding *or* other structure of works in connection therewith for 8 another person for a fee.

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(c) Contractor includes a subcontractor and a specialty contractor.

(d) *Person* means an individual, partnership, joint venture,
 corporation *or* any combination thereof. Corporation includes an association,
 business trust *or* any organized group of persons.

- (e) *Self-construction* means a project *or* operation performed by the
 owner for personal needs on personal premises; a self-constructed/performed
 project or operation *shall* otherwise be deemed performed by a contractor.
- (f) *Investigator* means an employee with the Contractors License
 Board who conducts thorough investigations of applicants applying for a
 contractor's license and who inspects, regulates, and enforces the laws, rules
 and regulations of the Licensing Board for Contractors.
- 20 (g) *Responsible Management Employee* means the individual 21 responsible for the direct management of the contracting business of the 22 licensee.
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§70101. Exemptions. This Chapter *shall not* apply to:

(a) An officer *or* employee of the United States, the Territory *or* any
political subdivision, *if* the project *or* operation is performed by employees
thereof;

1 (b) Any person acting as a receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, 2 administrator *or* executor, *or* any other person acting under any order *or* 3 authorization of any court;

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(c) A person who sells *or* installs any finished products, materials *or* articles *or* merchandise which are *not* actually fabricated into and *do not* become a permanent fixed part of the structure, *or* to the construction, alteration, improvement *or* repair of personal property;

(d) Any project *or* operation for which the aggregate contract price for 8 labor, materials and all other items is less than Two Thousand Five Hundred 9 Dollars (\$2,500). This exemption shall not apply in any case wherein the 10 undertaking is by a licensed contractor or is only part of a larger or major 11 project or operation, whether undertaken by the same or a different 12 contractor or in which a division of the project or operation is made in 13 contracts of amounts less than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 14 (\$2,500) for the purpose of evading this Chapter or otherwise; 15

(e) A registered architect *or* professional engineer acting *solely* in a
professional capacity;

- (f) Any person who engages in the activities herein regulated as an
 employee with wages as *sole* compensation;
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(g) Any person who undertakes either personally *or* through his *or* her employees, any project *or* operation for himself or herself; and

- (h) Any co-partnership *or* joint venture *if* all members thereof hold
 licenses issued under this Chapter *or if* the person *or* persons who have
 direct management of the contracting business thereof hold a license for
 purposes of requiring additional contractor's licenses for the copartnership *or* joint venture.
- 27 §70102. Contractors License Board.

(a) There *shall* be a Contractors License Board compose of seven
(7) members; two (2) of which *shall* be appointed by *I Maga'lahi* from the
construction industry; three (3) of which *shall* be appointed by *I Maga'lahi*from the general public and who *shall* have no interest in the construction
industry; the Director of Revenue and Taxation, ex-officio; and the Director
of Public Works, ex-officio. Those members appointed by *I Maga'lahi* are
subject to confirmation by *I Liheslatura*. Their terms *shall* be four (4) years.

8 (b) The concurrence of four (4) members of the Board *shall* be
9 necessary for the validity of any of its actions.

(c) Organization, Records, Reports. Immediately upon the 10 appointment and qualifications of the original members, and annually 11 thereafter, the Board shall organize by the election of one (1) member as 12 Chairman and one (1) member as Vice-Chairman. The Board shall keep a 13 complete record of all its proceedings and shall present annually to the 14 Governor through the Executive Director a detailed statement of the 15 previous year, proceedings and such recommendations as the Board may 16 17 deem proper.

(d) Compensation. Members of the Board *shall* receive the sum of
Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each attendance at the meetings of the Board,
provided, however, that *no* member *shall* receive more than One Hundred
Dollars (\$100) per month.

§70103. Powers and Duties of Board. In addition to any other duties and
powers granted by this Chapter, the Contractors License Board *shall*:

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(a) Grant licenses to contractors pursuant to this Chapter;

25 (b) Make, amend *or* repeal such rules and regulations as it may 26 deem proper to fully effectuate this Chapter and carry out the purpose 27 thereof, which purpose is the protection of the general public. All such rules

and regulations shall be adopted pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication 1 Law. The rules and regulations may forbid acts *or* practices deemed by the 2 Board to be detrimental to the accomplishment of the purpose of this 3 Chapter. The rules and regulations may require contractors to make reports 4 to the Board containing such items of information as will better enable the 5 Board to enforce this Chapter and rules and regulations, or as will better 6 enable the Board from time to time to amend the rules and regulations more 7 to fully effectuate the purposes of this Chapter. The rules and regulations 8 may require contractors to furnish reports to owners containing such matters 9 of information as the Board deems necessary to promote the purpose of this 10 Chapter. The enumeration of specific matters which may properly be made 11 the subject of rules and regulations shall not be construed to limit the 12 Board's general power to make all rules and regulations necessary to fully 13 effectuate the purpose of this Chapter; 14

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(c)Enforce this Chapter and rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto:

Suspend or revoke any license for any cause prescribed by (d)17 §70116 or for any cause for suspension or revocation prescribed by the rules 18 and regulations, and refuse to grant any license for any cause which would 19 be grounds for revocation *or* suspension of a license; 20

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(e) Publish and distribute pamphlets and circulars containing such information as it deems proper to further the accomplishment of the purpose 22 of this Chapter; and 23

(f) Contract professional testing services as deemed necessary to 24 prepare, administer, and grade applicant examinations as may be required 25 for the purpose of this Chapter. 26

§70104. Executive Director; Other Assistants. 27

Contractors License Board shall employ (a) The 1 an Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be employed with due 2 regard to his or her fitness, thorough administrative ability and knowledge of 3 and experience in the business of contracting. The Executive Director shall 4 act only with the advice and consent of the Board and shall be responsible to 5 the Board. The Executive Director shall devote his or her entire time to the 6 7 duties of the office and *shall not* be actively engaged or employed in any other business, vocation or employment, nor have any pecuniary interest, 8 9 direct or indirect, in any contracting enterprise or enterprises conducted or carried on within the Territory. 10

11 (b) The Executive Director *shall*, under the supervision of the 12 Board, administer this Chapter and the rules and regulations and orders 13 established thereunder and perform such other duties as the Board may 14 require; *shall* attend but *not* vote at all meetings of the Board; and *shall* be in 15 charge of the offices of the Board and responsible to the Board for the 16 preparation of reports and the collection and dissemination of data and other 17 public information relating to contracting.

18 (c) The Board may, by written order filed in its office, delegate to 19 the Executive Director such of its powers *or* duties as it deems reasonable 20 and proper for the effective administration of this Chapter, *except* the power 21 to make rules *or* regulations. The delegated powers and duties may be 22 exercised by the Executive Director in the name of the Board.

(d) Subject to the Personnel Law, the Executive Director may
 employ and remove such administrative and clerical assistants as may be
 required, and prescribe their powers and duties.

§70105. Place of Meeting. The Executive Director shall provide suitable 1 quarters for meetings of the Contractors License Board and for the transaction of 2 its other business. 3 §70106. Classification. 4 For the purpose of classification, the contracting business 5 (a) includes any or all of the following branches: 6 7 (1)General Engineering Contracting; General Building Contracting; (2)8 Specialty Contracting; and 9 (3)Responsible Management Employee (R.M.E.). (4) 10 A General Engineering Contractor is a contractor whose (b)11 principal contracting business is in connection with fixed works requiring 12 specialized engineering knowledge and skill, including the following 13 divisions or subjects: irrigations, drainage, water power, water supply, flood 14 control, inland waterways, harbors, docks and wharves, shipyards and ports, 15 dams and hydroelectric projects, levees, river control and reclamation works, 16 highways, streets and roads, tunnels, airports and airways, sewer, sewage 17 disposal plants and systems, waste reduction plants, bridges, overpasses, 18 underpasses and other similar works, pipelines and other systems for the 19 transmission of petroleum and other liquid or gaseous substances, parks, 20 playgrounds and other recreational works, refineries, chemical plants and 21 similar industrial plants requiring specialized engineering knowledge and 22 skill, powerhouses, power plants and other utility plants and installations, 23 mines and metallurgical plants, land leveling and earth-moving projects, 24 excavating, grating, trenching, paving and surfacing work and cement and 25 concrete works in connection with the above-mentioned fixed works. 26

1 (c) A *General Building Contractor* is a contractor whose principal 2 contracting business is in connection with any structure built, being built *or* 3 to be built, for the support, shelter and enclosure of persons, animals, 4 chattels *or* movable property of any kind, requiring in its construction the 5 use of more than two (2) unrelated building trades *or* crafts, *or* to do *or* 6 superintend the whole *or* any part thereof.

(d) A *Specialty Contractor* is a contractor whose operations as such are the performance of construction work requiring special skill and whose principal contracting business involves the use of specialized building trades *or* crafts.

11 (e) A *Responsible Management Employee* is an individual 12 responsible for the direct management of the contracting business of the 13 licensee and has proved contracting knowledge by both written examination, 14 as administered by the Board, and the fulfillment of requirements, as stated 15 in Part II Section 2.2 of the Guam Contractors License Board Rules and 16 Regulations.

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§70107. Powers to Classify and Limit Operations.

(a) The Contractors License Board may adopt rules and regulations
necessary to effect the classification of contractors and *shall* require a
written examination in a manner consistent with established usage and
procedure as found in the construction business, and may limit the field and
scope of the operations of a licensed contractor to those in which the
licensed contractor is classified and qualified to engage, as defined in
§70106.

25 (b) A licensee may make application for classification and be 26 classified in more than one (1) classification *if* the licensee meets the 27 qualifications prescribed by the Board for such additional classification. For

1 qualifying *or* classifying in additional classifications, the licensee *shall* pay 2 the appropriate application fee but *shall not* be required to pay any 3 additional license fee.

4 (c) This Section *shall not* prohibit a specialty contractor from 5 taking and executing a contract involving the use of two (2) *or* more crafts 6 *or* trades, *if* the performance of the work in the crafts *or* trades, other than in 7 which the specialty contractor is licensed, is *less than* thirty-five percent 8 (35%) and supplemental to the performance of work in the craft for which 9 the specialty contractor is licensed.

10 **§70108. Licenses Required.** No person within the purview of this Chapter 11 *shall* act, *or* assume to act, *or* advertise, as general engineering contractor, general 12 building contractor *or* specialty contractor without a license previously obtained 13 under and in compliance with this Chapter and the rules and regulations of the 14 Contractors License Board.

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§70108.1. Advertising.

(a) A Contractor may advertise in print *or* broadcast medium *only if* the contractor includes in the advertisement *or* listing the contractor's
applicable and current license number, and provides proof of the number's
validity to the publisher *or* producer of the advertising medium. Violation of
this Section may be subject to the provisions of §70116 and/or §70121.

§70109. Investigation Permitted. The Contractors License Board may investigate, classify and qualify applicants for contractor's licenses, and investigate for compliance with the rules and regulations of the Board and the provisions of this Chapter.

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§70109.1. Investigation Citation Authority.

(a) In addition to any other remedy available, the investigator of
 the Contractors License Board may issue citations to acting contractors,

licensed *or* unlicensed, in violation of the provisions of this Chapter and
 rules promulgated.

(b) Each citation *shall* be in writing and *shall* describe the basis of
the citation, including the statutory provisions alleged to have been violated.
The citation *shall* also contain an order to cease and desist from the
violation, and an assessment of civil penalties *no less than* Two Hundred
Dollars (\$200) but *not to exceed* fifty percent (50%) of the value of the
project.

9 (c) Recipients of contractual work *shall* be notified of each 10 violation in a timely manner.

\$70109.2. Immediate Cease Work Order Permitted. The investigator
may issue an immediate cease work order to any person's construction activity
where serious safety concerns are present.

14 **§70109.3. Cease Work Order Permitted.** The Executive Director may 15 issue a cease work order to any person's construction activity *if* found to be in 16 violation of this Chapter and/or of any Contractors License Board rules and 17 regulations.

18 §70110. No License Issued When. No license hereunder shall be issued
19 to:

20 (1) Any person unless said person_has filed an application and paid
21 the applicable fees therefore;

(2) Any person who *does not* possess a good reputation for
honesty, truthfulness, financial integrity and fair dealing;

(3) Any co-partnership *or* joint venture who *does not* actively
participate in at least one (1) construction job in the course of the license
year in the contracting business and thereof *does not* hold an appropriate
license;

1 (4) Any corporation, unless the contracting business thereof is 2 under the direct management of an officer *or* employee thereof, and unless 3 the officer *or* employee holds an appropriate Responsible Management 4 Employee license;

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(5) Any individual, unless eighteen (18) years of age or more; and

6 (6) Any person who employs other individuals as employees unless 7 satisfactory proof is submitted by the person of a current workers' 8 compensation insurance policy.

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§70111. Application: Fees.

(a) Every applicant for a license under this Chapter shall file an 10 application with the Contractors License Board in such form and setting 11 forth such information as may be prescribed or required by the Board, and 12 shall furnish such additional information bearing upon the issuance of the 13 license as it shall require. Every application shall be sworn to before an 14 officer authorized to administer oaths. In the case of a co-partnership, joint 15 venture or corporation, any member or officer thereof may sign the 16 application and verify the same on behalf of the applicant. 17

18 (b) Every application, in the case of an individual, *shall* be 19 accompanied by sworn certificates of *not less than* two (2) persons who have 20 known the applicant for a period of *not less than* six (6) months certifying 21 that the applicant bears a good reputation for honesty, truthfulness and fair 22 dealings.

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(c) Every application for a license hereunder *shall* be accompanied by an application fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00)

§70112. Form of Licenses. The form of every license *shall* be prescribed
by the Contractors License Board and *shall* be issued in the name of the Board.

§70113. Place of Business and Posting of License. A licensed contractor 1 shall have and maintain a definite place of business in the Territory and shall 2 display therein a personal contractor's license. 3 §70114. Fees; Annual. 4 The annual fees for each license thereof prescribed by this 5 (a) Chapter *shall* be as follows: 6 (1)License Fee 7 License to act specialty contractor 8 as 9\$400 License general engineering 10 to act as contractor..... \$400 11 building License general to act 12 as contractor...... \$400 13 License Fee for Responsible Management Employee (2)14 (RME) 15 License 16 to act as RME in specialty Contracting.....\$400 17 License to act as RME in general engineering contracting 18\$400 19 RME building License to act as in general 20 contracting......\$400 21

6 (b) The annual fee *or* inactive license fee *shall* be paid on *or* before 7 June 30 of each year for a license year beginning on July 1. Failure, neglect 8 *or* refusal of any licensee to pay the annual fee before such date *shall* 9 constitute a forfeiture of license. Any such license may be restored upon 10 written application, therefore, within one (1) year from such date and the 11 payment of the required fee plus an amount equal to ten percent (10%) 12 thereof.

13 (c) Upon written request by a contractor, and for good cause, the 14 Board *shall* place an active license in an inactive status. The license, upon 15 payment of the annual inactive license fee, may continue inactive for a 16 period of three (3) years after which time it must be reactivated *or shall* 17 automatically become forfeited. The license may be reactivated at any time 18 within the three (3)-year period by fulfilling the requirements for renewal, 19 including the payment of the appropriate renewal fee.

§70115. Action on Application. Within forty-five (45) days after the
filing of a proper application for a license and the payment of the required fees, the
Contractors License Board *shall*:

(a) Conduct an investigation of the applicant and in such
investigation may post pertinent information, including, but *not limited to*,
the name and address of the applicant, and *if* the applicant is associated in
any partnership, corporation *or* other entity, the names, addresses and
official capacities of associates; and

1	(b) Either issue a license to the applicant or else notify the
2	applicant in writing by registered mail of the Board's decision not to grant
3	the license and specifically notify applicant of the right to have a hearing
4	within fifteen (15) days from the receipt of the Board's decision. The
5	hearing shall be conducted in accordance with § 70117.
6	§70116. Revocation, Suspension and Renewal of Licenses.
7	(a) The Contractors License Board may revoke any license issued
8	hereunder, or suspend the right of the licensee to use such licenses, or refuse
9	to renew any such license for any of the following causes:
10	(1) Conviction of any felony or misdemeanor involving
11	moral turpitude;
12	(2) Any dishonest or fraudulent or deceitful act as a
13	contractor which causes a substantial damage to another;
14	(3) Pursuing a continued and flagrant course of
15	misrepresentation or of making false promises through advertising or
16	otherwise;
17	(4) Abandonment of any construction project or operation
18	without reasonable or legal excuse;
19	(5) Willful departure from or willful disregard of plans or
20	specifications in any material respect without consent of the owner or
21	his duly authorized representative, which is prejudicial to a person
22	entitled to have the construction project or operation completed in
23	accordance with such plans and specifications;
24	(6) Willful violation of any law of the Territory <i>or</i> of any
25	political subdivision thereof, relating to building, including any
26	violation of any applicable rule or regulation of the Department of
27	Public Health, or of any applicable safety or labor law;

(7)Failure to make and keep records showing all contracts, 1 documents, records, receipts and disbursements by a licensee of all his 2 transactions as a contractor for a period of not less than three (3) years 3 after completion of any construction project or operation to which the 4 records refer *or* to permit inspections of such records by the Board; 5 When the licensee being a co-partnership or a joint (8)6 venture permits any member of such co-partnership or joint venture 7 who *does not* hold a license to actively participate in the contracting 8 business thereof: 9 (9)When the licensee being a corporation permits any 10 officer or employee of such corporation who does not hold a license 11 to have the direct management of the contracting business thereof; 12 (10) Misrepresentation of a material fact by an applicant in 13 obtaining a license; 14 (11) Failure of a licensee to complete in a material respect any 15 construction project or operation for the agreed price if such failure is 16 without legal excuse; 17 Willful failure in any material respect to comply with this (12)18 Chapter *or* the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto; 19 (13) Willful failure or refusal to prosecute a project or 20 operation to completion with reasonable diligence; 21 Willful failure to pay when due a debt incurred for (14)22 services of materials rendered or purchased in connection with his 23 operations as a contractor when the individual has the ability to pay or 24 when the individual has received sufficient funds therefor as payment 25 for the particular operation for which the services or materials were 26 rendered or purchased; 27

1	(15) The folse deniel of any debt due or the validity of the
1	(15) The false denial of any debt due <i>or</i> the validity of the
2	claim therefor with intent to secure for licensee, employer or other
3	person, any discount of such debt or with intent to hinder, delay or
4	defraud the person to whom such debt is due;
5	(16) Failure to secure or maintain workmen's compensation
6	insurance;
7	(17) Knowingly entering into a contract with an unlicensed
8	contractor involving work or activity for the performance of which
9	licensing is required under this Chapter; or
10	(18) When the Responsible Management Employee and/or the
11	majority stockholders have, under another corporate or company
12	structure, caused the non-payment of employees wages and/or the
13	abandonment of alien workers to become a burden on the
14	Government.
15	(19) Willful failure to pay when due a debt or penalty incurred
16	for damaging a public utility operated by the Guam Power Authority,
17	the Guam Telephone Authority or the Guam Waterworks Authority
18	and the Department of Public Works.
19	(20) Knowingly taps into any power, water, sewer line, or
20	facility belonging to the Guam Power Authority and/or the Guam
21	Waterworks Authority without first obtaining permission through the
22	established service rules and regulations of each respective
23	governmental agency.
24	(b) No license shall be suspended for longer than two (2) years and
25	no person whose license is revoked shall be eligible for a new license until
26	the expiration of two (2) years.

1 (c) For purposes of this Section, the Contractors License Board in 2 cooperation and in conjunction with the Department of Public Works, 3 Department of Revenue and Taxation and the Department of Labor may 4 have investigative powers for purposes of carrying out the intent of this 5 Section.

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§70117. Hearings.

(a) In every case where it is proposed to refuse to grant a license *or*to revoke *or* suspend a license *or* to refuse to renew a license, the
Contractors License Board *shall* give the person concerned notice and
hearing in conformity with the Administrative Adjudication Law. The
notice *shall* be given in writing by registered *or* certified mail with return
receipt requested *at least* fifteen (15) days before the hearing.

In all proceedings before it, the Board, and each member (b) 13 thereof, shall have the same powers with respect to administering oaths, 14 compelling the attendance of witnesses and the production of documentary 15 evidence and examining witnesses as are possessed by circuit judges at 16 chambers. In case of disobedience by any person of any order of the Board, 17 or any member thereof, or any subpoena issued by it, or the person, or the 18 refusal of any witness to testify to any matter regarding which the individual 19 may be questioned lawfully, any judge of the Superior Court, on application 20 by the Board thereof, shall compel obedience as in the case of disobedience 21 of the requirements of a subpoena issued by the Superior Court, or a refusal 22 to testify therein. 23

§70118. Appeal to Superior Court. An applicant who has been refused a license and every licensee whose license has been suspended, revoked *or not* renewed may appeal the Contractors License Board's decision to the Superior Court in the manner provided in the Administrative Adjudication Law.

1 §70119. Disposition of Fees, Refunds.

(a) Notwithstanding the Central Accounting Act, all fees and money
collected under the provisions of this Chapter *shall* be deposited in a special
fund known as the *Contractors License Board Fund*. This Fund *shall* be
kept in a bank licensed to do business on Guam and funds *shall* be paid out
only upon a request for payment *or* requisition submitted by the Executive
Director *or* its personnel and countersigned by the Chairman of the Board.
All monies in this Fund *shall* require legislative appropriation.

9 (b) The Board may request the Treasurer of Guam to have any fee 10 erroneously paid to it under this Chapter refunded when the Board deems it 11 just and equitable.

12 **§70120.** Death *or* Dissociation. *No* co-partnership, joint venture *or* 13 corporation *shall* be deemed to have violated any provision of this Chapter by 14 acting *or* assuming to act as a contractor after the death *or* dissociation of a 15 licensee who had the direct management of the contracting business thereof prior 16 to final disposition by the Contractors License Board of an application for a license 17 made within thirty (30) days from the date of the death *or* dissociation.

§70121. Violation, Penalty. Any person who violates *or* omits to comply
with any of the provisions of this Chapter *shall* be fined an amount *no less than*Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) but *not to exceed* fifty percent (50%) of the value of
the project.

§70122. Injunction. The Contractors License Board may, in addition to any other remedies available, apply to a judge of the Superior Court for a preliminary *or* permanent injunction restraining any person from acting *or* assuming to act *or* advertising as general engineering contractor, general building contractor *or* specialty contractor, without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this Chapter and the rules and regulations of the Board and upon hearing and for cause shown, the judge may grant the preliminary *or*permanent injunction.

§70123. Exemptions for Prior Licensees. Any contractor who obtained a 3 valid contractor's license under the existing license statute prior to July 1, 1977, 4 shall be exempt from the provisions of this Chapter relative to application, 5 investigations and examinations. Any contractor with a valid license issued prior 6 to July 1, 1977, with a classification different from those enumerated in §70106, 7 shall be automatically placed in the appropriate classification without the necessity 8 of complying with the application, investigation and examination provisions of this 9 Chapter. All other provisions *shall* apply." 10

An act to repeal and re-enact chapter 70 of title 21, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the Guam Contractors Licensing Board

I. Overview

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works and Veterans Affairs convened on March 6, 2009 at 8:30am to hold a public hearing that included the subject of **Bill No. 24 (LS) – An act to repeal and re-enact chapter 70 of title 21, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the Guam Contractors Licensing Board**. Notice of the hearing was disseminated to all local media outlets via facsimile on February 26, 2009 and March 3, 2009, thus meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

II. Summary of Testimonies

Thomas Morrison:

Provided written and oral testimony (written testimony is attached)

Thomas Morrison is in support of Bill 24. As Executive Registrar of the Contractor's License Board, Mr. Morrison believes that Bill 24 provides for updates to 21 GCA Chapter 70 that are vital to help the Board better serve the community and regulate the construction industry. He explains that Bill 24's intent is to allow the Board to establish professional testing services to prepare, administer and grade the examinations for applicants seeking a contractor's license. Mr. Morrison then detailed the intent of §70108.1, explaining that it outlines the need for a contractor to include in any advertisements a valid license number, and in order to do so the contractor must provide proof to the publisher of a valid license. He mentioned that this would allow the Board and consumers to check the credentials of an advertised contractor. Mr. Morrison also notes that §70109.1 would give investigators the authority to issue a direct citation in violation of the law, the ability to issue a cease and desist order and to assess a civil penalty not to exceed ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars. Additionally, §70109.2 would provide protection for the licensed contractors from falsified consumer complaints. Mr. Morrison also explains that §70109.3 would expand the investigator's authority to issue a cease and desist order to any person's construction activity if a violation is found. The Board would use this section to obligate prompt responses and compliance from contractors who are in violation of this chapter. Mr. Morrison conveyed his determination to continue the fine-tuning and enforcement of the Contractors License Board's mandates.

Sam Taylor:

Provided oral testimony

Sam Taylor is in support of Bill 24. As a representative of GWA, Mr. Taylor read the written testimony submitted by Leonard Olive (General Manger of GWA) and then offered his own oral testimony. Mr. Taylor first thanked Mr. Morrison for being a great director. Mr. Taylor then voiced his support for the changes in law proposed in Bill 24, including the added authority afforded to the Board and its investigator to investigate non-licensed individuals and to determine the fine for violations. Mr. Taylor also believes that ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars is too low a fine for large companies, and that the size of the company should in some way dictate the levy imposed (in order to provide an equitable determent to all companies).

Leonard Olive:

Provided written testimony (written testimony is attached)

Leonard Olive is in support of Bill 24. As General Manager for Guam Waterworks Authority. Mr. Olive expressed support for modifying the enabling statute for the Guam Contractors License Board, and more specifically, §70116 which allows the board to revoke the license of contractors who tap into the utility systems without written permission from GWA. Mr. Olive applauds the GCLB for this proposed changed.

Louis C. DeMaria:

Provided written testimony (written testimony is attached)

Louis C. DeMaria is in support of Bill 24. As the Chairman of the Guam Contractors Association, Mr. DeMaria noted the importance of a contractor's license number when advertising. Mr. DeMaria believes that the requirement and validation for a posted license number will be essential as construction activity increases during the military build-up.

J.C. Flores:

Provided written testimony (written testimony is attached)

J.C. Flores is in favor of Bill 24. As the General Manager of Guam Power Authority, Mr. Flores communicated his support for Bill 24. He also recommends that §70116 be modified to indicate that the contractor must obtain services in accordance with established Service Rules and Regulations of the Authority in place of "prior written permission".

JQ Ninete:

Signed up for oral testimony, however he did not testify

Larry Perez:

Provided oral testimony in the form of Question and Answer (responses are included below).

Question and Answer

Senator Palacios: Senator Palacios requested to find a better term to encompass the duties of the "investigator" as defined in section 70100 (f); he suggested the word "agent". Senator Palacios also suggested that new monies being collected by the GCLB should be directed to the License Board, and that it must be stipulated in such a way to prevent the monies from going into the general fund.

Sam Taylor: Mr. Taylor agreed with Senator Palacios and also cautioned that whenever monies are collected from fines or violations, they should not be used by the entity assessing that fine for wages, but rather, should be specifically allocated to training or other organizational programs that would eliminate a conflict of interest.

Senator Palacios: Senator Palacios asked how this funding allocation process compares to the court systems.

Sam Taylor: Mr. Taylor responds that such funds do not go to the salaries of the judges, but to certain programs. At the moment, he explains, funds are going to pay for the crime lab.

Senator Palacios: Senator Palacios seeks clarification regarding the power to give cease and desist orders by the investigator. He believes that the Board should have oversight on this, but the investigator should have the power to issue the citation.

Tom Morrison: Mr. Morrison explains that this is in fact what the Board does. He also infers that the Board has this oversight.

Senator Palacios: Senator Palacios expresses his concern about the false complaint clause and the fine. He wants the fine to be increased from one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars.

Sam Taylor: Mr. Taylor addresses this concern by suggesting the inclusion in section 70108 wording that makes such a violation a felony. He also recommends changing the term "line" in section 70116 to "line and facility".

Senator Palacios: In regards to section 70114, Senator Palacios recommends adding fees to help pay for the addition of more investigators.

Senator Rector: Senator Rector agrees with an increase in penalty, preferably higher than \$10,000. He explains that this would provide for a more significant deterrent. Senator Rector also wants the fees collected to somehow fund the entity that collects it.

Sam Taylor: Mr. Taylor cautions pursuing such a funding course because it would be a conflict of interest for those collecting the fees, as it would be funding their organization. He cautions against directing the fines collected toward the pay of salaries.

Senator Rector: Senator Rector recommends looking into the fee structure and changing it to reflect the size of the company or its annual income. He believes that such fees should pay for the operation of the Board.

Senator Ada: Senator Ada recognizes Richard Quiambao and Larry Perez.

Richard Quiambao: Mr. Quiambao recalls a situation in which an unlicensed contractor, who was fined and charged, continued to pursue contracts. Mr. Quiambao would like the bill to give the Board the authority to handle situations like this more decisively.

Larry Perez: Mr. Perez addresses Senator Rector's comments about the pay schedule. Specifically, Mr. Perez notes that in regards to the fees to be used for the employees enforcing the rules, such fees can only be used for "cost recovery" and not as incentives or motivators for the employees. Was this not the case, he believes that it may produce many overzealous employees looking to get more incentives. Mr. Perez also requests that the triple AAA process for setting rates be looked at or modified to be more flexible in accounting for the lack of staff and funds needed to meet each requirement.

Senator Rector: Senator Rector believes that the "check and balance" in the system will protect against an overzealous employee. He notes that the board sets the rate and the investigator issues the fines, and as such, an overzealous investigator would be subject to disciplinary action if there is proof of unnecessary fines.

Senator Palacios: Senator Palacios recommends adding in section 70110 a clause addressing convicted felons in regards to the issuance of a license. He notes that section 70116 also addresses the topic of felonies.

Tommy Morrison: Mr. Morrison state that the investigation citation authority was added to give the investigator the authority to stop the project. He explains that the amount of time it takes for the AAA process is long, and in some cases the building project can actually be completed before the AAA process forces the contractor to shut down. Mr. Morrison assures that the citation will conform to the law, but that the power to stop a project is needed in order to address such situations in a timely manner.

Senator Ada: Senator Ada announces that there will be a mark-up meeting in regards to Bill 24. He closes the public hearing for Bill 24.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works and Veterans Affairs finds changes in law must be made in order to better aid the Contractors License Board in the pursuit of its mandate. Currently the Contractors License Board oversees over 930 contractors on island, with that number expected to increase in the coming years. While the board has performed its duties admirably in recent years, future activities related to the military build-up will strain its resources; as such, some fees will need to be increased in order to more accurately reflect the actual costs incurred by the board. Additionally, current law does not stipulate precise enough authority to investigate citations, issue citations and cease work orders, address false complaints, and regulate advertising. Bill No. 24 (LS) addresses these concerns by adjusting current law to better meet current and future demands.

Additionally, and after receiving public input on Bill No. 24 (LS), the Committee has amended the bill as such:

- The price limit for construction activity that falls under the purview of the Contractors License Board was raised from \$1000 to \$2500 in order accommodate small projects by local handypersons.
- In §70102, language regarding the commencing date of board terms was removed in order to allow terms to begin upon appointment by the Governor and confirmation by the legislature.
- The title of "Executive Secretary" was changed to "Executive Director" throughout the bill.
- In §70106.e, the criteria for a "Responsible Management Employee" was expanded to include passing a written examination and the criteria stipulated in section 2.2 of the Contractors License Board's Rules and Regulations.
- In §70101.1, clarification was made to explain that violation of this section may be subject to provisions of §70116 and/or §70121.
- In §70109, wording was added to expressly note that the board may investigate for compliance with the rules and regulations set forth by the board and provisions of this law.
- In §70109.1.a, "persons" was changed to "acting contractors, licensed or unlicensed" in order to focus the bill upon contractors and not their employees.
- In §70109.1.b and §70121, penalties were changed from "\$1000" to "no less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) but not to exceed twenty fiver percent (25%) of the value of the project". This was done in order to more accurately access fines in accordance with the impact and size of the project.
- A §70109.1.c was added stipulating that recipients of contractual work must be notified of each violation in a timely manner. This change was made in order to keep members of the public informed should their contractor be violating laws.
- A §70109.3 was changed to stipulate that the board has the ability to issue immediate cease work orders should dangerous safety conditions be found (the previous §70109.3 was renumbered to §70109.4).
- §70109.4 (previously §70109.3) was changed to include the rules and regulations of the board as criteria for holding contractors accountable to their actions.
- In §70114.a, the amount for a "letter of good standing" was increased from \$20 to \$50, the amount for an "inactive license fee" was increased from \$20 to \$50, and the amount of a "study guide" was increased from \$50 to \$75 in order to more accurately reflect the actual costs of producing the book.
- A §70114.a.9 was added to create an "exam fee" that shall cost \$50.
- In §70116.a.20, the term "facility" was added in order to prevent contractors from improperly tapping directly into a facility, and "written permission" was changed to "obtaining permission through the established service rules and regulations of each respective governmental agency" in order to align with the established practices of both GWA and GPA.
- Minor grammatical corrections were made, and gendered language was replaced with non-gendered or gender-neutral language.

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Testimony in Favor of Bill 24

By Thomas Morrison, Executive Registrar, Contractors License Board Before the Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs 30th Guam Legislature - March 6, 2009

Hafa Adai Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee, my name is Thomas Morrison, Executive Registrar of the Contractors License Board ("Board"). I appreciate the opportunity to testify in support of bill 24.

Bill 24 is timely and is the first step to updating 21 GCA Chapter 70 to better serve the community and regulate the construction industry. This bill proposes to allow the Board to contract professional testing services as it deems necessary to prepare, administer, and grade the examinations for applicants wishing to obtain a contractors license in Guam. Currently the Contractors Law doesn't define this authority for the board pertaining to examinations. Outsourcing the Boards testing services will eliminate potential challenges especially with regards to the Part II of the trade examination and will work to have applicants meet National Standards for specific classifications.

Subsection 70108.1 clearly outlines how a licensed contractor must advertise in print or broadcast medium. Simply browsing the phone book or listening to contractors promoting their services on the airwaves has led investigators to serving concerned notices to many individuals who were clearly unlicensed. We have also cited licensed contractors for advertising services outside their authorized specified classification. This section makes it clear that a contractor must provide proof of his/her license to a publisher or producer and include its applicable license number in the advertisement. This will better afford consumers the opportunity to verify with the license board a contractor's license, especially its specified classification. This section will also further enforce Subsection 70108 by preventing individuals from acting, or assuming to act, or advertise, as a general engineer contractor, general building contractor, or specialty contractor without a license.

Subsection 70109.1 will allow investigators with the stiff authority to issue a direct citation once a violation of the law has been discovered and has substantial evidence in its possession. This authority is ideal for violations that are significant in terms of consumer protection. Importantly, the section further addresses that the citation shall contain an order to cease and desist from the violation, and an assessment of civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars. I would like to request to make a correction in the last sentence of this section. Please change where states "and order" to "an order."

Subsection 70109.2 will work to protect licensed contractors from individuals filing falsified complaints against them. It has happened on occasion and it's the CLB's hope that this section would be a deterrent to such un-clever acts that only disrupts the operations of the investigation unit. If this section passes into law, I will make sure that every individual who picks-up a complaint form is aware of the potential reverse consequences by their acknowledgment of this section. It is also our duty to look out and protect our licensed contractors.

Subsection 70109.3 expands the authority of the investigators to issue cease and desist orders to any person's construction activity if found to be in violation of this chapter. This section will force licensed and unlicensed contractors to immediately address violation concerns from the board if their project activity has been order to cease by investigators. For far too long investigators have had to put up with quit a number of contractors that neglect board notices or fail to address consumer complaints in a timely manner. The board will properly use this section to compel prompt responses and compliance from contractors who violate this chapter.

The CLB has made tremendous progress over the past year. We've focused on changes that improve customer service, streamline processes, and open communications with licensees and the public much more effectively. I'm dedicated to maintaining this momentum of fine tuning and enforcing the contractors law.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of bill 24.

Specifically, GWA is in support of the amendment to § 70116 which allows the board to revoke the licenses of contractors who tap into the utility systems without first obtaining the written permission of the utilities. (c) A general building contractor is a contractor whose principal contracting business is in connection with any structure built, being built or to be built, for the support, shelter and enclosure of persons, animals, chattels or movable property of any kind, requiring in its construction the use of more than two unrelated building trades or crafts, or to do or superintend the whole or any part thereof.

(d) A specialty contractor is a contractor whose operations as such are the performance of
 construction work requiring special skill and whose principal contracting business involves the use
 of specialized building trades or crafts.

30 (e) A Responsible Management Employee is an individual <u>responsible for the direct management of</u>

31 the contracting business of the licensee and who has proved his contracting knowledge by both

1 written examination as administered by the board and the fulfillment of requirements as stated in

2 Part II section 2.2 of the Guam Contractors License Board Rules and Regulations.

3 § 70107. Powers to Classify and Limit Operations.

writing by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested at least fifteen (15) days before
the hearing.

(b) In all proceedings before it, the Board and each member thereof shall have the same powers 6 7 respecting administering oaths, compelling the attendance of witnesses and the production of documentary evidence and examining witnesses as are possessed by circuit judges at chambers. In 8 9 case of disobedience by any person of any order of the Board, or any member thereof, or any subpoena issued by it, or him the person, or the refusal of any witness to testify to any matter 10 regarding which the individual may be questioned lawfully, any judge of the Superior Court, on 11 application by the Board thereof, shall compel obedience as in the case of disobedience of the 12 requirements of a subpoena issued by the Superior Court, or a refusal to testify therein. 13

14 § 70118. Appeal to Superior Court.

15 An applicant who has been refused a license and every licensee whose license has been suspended,

16 revoked or not renewed may appeal the Contractors License Board's decision to the Superior Court

17 in the manner provided in the Administrative Adjudication Law.

18 § 70119. Disposition of Fees, Refunds.

19 (a) All fees received by the Contractors License Board under this Chapter shall be deposited by the

8 § 70122. Injunction.

9 The Contractors License Board may, in addition to any other remedies available, apply to a judge of 10 the Superior Court for a preliminary or permanent injunction restraining any person from acting or 11 assuming to act or advertising as general engineering contractor, general building contractor or 12 specialty contractor, without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this 13 Chapter and the rules and regulations of the Board and upon hearing and for cause shown, the judge 14 may grant the preliminary or permanent injunction.

15 § 70123. Exemptions for Prior Licensees.

Any contractor who obtained a valid contractor's license under the existing license statute prior to July 1, 1977 shall be exempt from provision of this Chapter relative to application, investigations and examinations. Any contractor with a valid license issued prior to July 1, 1977 with a classification different from those enumerated in § 70106 shall be automatically placed in the appropriate classification without the necessity of complying with the application, investigation and examination provisions of this Chapter. All other provisions shall apply."

The Executive 11 Secretary shall be employed with due regard to his fitness, thorough administrative ability and 12 knowledge of and experience in the business of contracting. (c) A general building contractor is a contractor whose principal contracting business is in connection with any structure built, being built or to be built, for the support, shelter and enclosure of persons, animals, chattels or movable property of any kind, requiring in its construction the use of more than two unrelated building trades or crafts, or to do or superintend the whole or any part thereof.

(d) A specialty contractor is a contractor whose operations as such are the performance of
 construction work requiring special skill and whose principal contracting business involves the use
 of specialized building trades or crafts.

(e) A Responsible Management Employee is an individual who has proved his contracting
knowledge by written examination.

30 § 70107. Powers to Classify and Limit Operations.

The notice shall be given in writing by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested at least fifteen (15) days before 21 22 the hearing.

(b) In all proceedings before it, the Board and each member thereof shall have the same powers 23 respecting administering oaths, compelling the attendance of witnesses and the production of 24 25 documentary evidence and examining witnesses as are possessed by circuit judges at chambers. In case of disobedience by any person of any order of the Board, or any member thereof, or any 26 27 subpoena issued by it, or him, or the refusal of any witness to testify to any matter regarding which he may be questioned lawfully, any judge of the Superior Court, on application by the Board thereof, 28 shall compel obedience as in the case of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena issued by 29 30 the Superior Court, or a refusal to testify therein.

31 § 70118. Appeal to Superior Court. 1 An applicant who has been refused a license and every licensee whose license has been suspended,

- 2 revoked or not renewed may appeal the Contractors License Board's decision to the Superior Court
- 3 in the manner provided in the Administrative Adjudication Law.

4 § 70119. Disposition of Fees, Refunds.

(a) All fees received by the Contractors License Board under this Chapter shall be deposited by the
Executive Secretary with the Treasurer of Guam to the credit of the General Fund.

- 7 (b) The Board may request the Treasurer of Guam to have any fee erroneously paid to it under this
- 8 Chapter refunded when the Board deems it just and equitable.

9 § 70120. Death or Dissociation.

10 No copartnership, joint venture or corporation shall be deemed to have violated any provision of this

11 Chapter by acting or assuming to act as a contractor after the death or dissociation of a licensee who

12 had the direct management of the contracting business thereof prior to final disposition by the

- 13 Contractors License Board of an application for a license made within thirty (30) days from the date
- 14 of the death or dissociation.

15 § 70121. Violation, Penalty.

16 Any person who violates or omits to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined 17 not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000).

18 § 70122. Injunction.

The Contractors License Board may, in addition to any other remedies available, apply to a judge of the Superior Court for a preliminary or permanent injunction restraining any person from acting or assuming to act or advertising as general engineering contractor, general building contractor or specialty contractor, without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this Chapter and the rules and regulations of the Board and upon hearing and for cause shown, the judge may grant the preliminary or permanent injunction.

25 § 70123. Exemptions for Prior Licensees.

Any contractor who obtained a valid contractor's license under the existing license statute prior to July 1, 1977 shall be exempt from provision of this Chapter relative to application, investigations and examinations. Any contractor with a valid license issued prior to July 1, 1977 with a classification different from those enumerated in § 70106 shall be automatically placed in the appropriate classification without the necessity of complying with the application, investigation and

31 examination provisions of this Chapter. All other provisions shall apply."

- 18 structure, project development or improvement or do any part thereof, including the erection
- 19 of scaffolding or other structure of works in connection therewith for another person for a fee.
- 20 (c) Contractor includes a subcontractor and a specialty contractor.
- 21 (d) Person means an individual, partnership, joint venture, corporation or any combination thereof.
- 22 Corporation includes an association, business trust or any organized group of persons.

- 31 § 70101. Exemptions.

1 This Chapter shall not apply to:

2 (a) An officer or employee of the United States, the Territory or any political subdivision, if the
3 project or operation is performed by employees thereof;

4 (b) Any person acting as a receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, administrator or executor, or any other
5 person acting under any order or authorization of any court;

6 (c) A person who sells or installs any finished products, materials or articles or merchandise which
7 are not actually fabricated into and do not become a permanent fixed part of the structure, or to the
8 construction, alteration, improvement or repair of personal property;

9 (d) Any project or operation for which the aggregate contract price for labor, materials and all other 10 items is less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000). This exemption shall not apply in any case 11 wherein the undertaking is only part of a larger or major project or operation, whether undertaken by 12 the same or a different contractor or in which a division of the project or operation is made in 13 contracts of amounts less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for the purpose of evading this

14 Chapter or otherwise;

15 (e) A registered architect or professional engineer acting solely in his professional capacity;

16 (f) Any person who engages in the activities herein regulated as an employee with wages as his sole

17 compensation;

(g) Any person who undertakes by himself or through his employees any project or operation forhimself; and.

20 (h) Any copartnership or joint venture if all members thereof hold licenses issued under this Chapter

or if the person or persons who have direct management of the contracting business thereof hold a
license.

23 § 70102. Contractors License Board.

(a) There shall be a Contractors License Board compose of seven (7) members; two (2) of which shall be appointed by the Governor from the construction industry; three (3) of which shall be appointed by the Governor from the general public and who shall have no interest in the construction industry; and the Director of Revenue and Taxation, ex-officio; and the Director of Public Works, ex-officio. Those members appointed by the Governor are subject to confirmation by the Legislature. Their terms shall be four (4) years and said terms to commence January 1 next following the enactment hereof. (b) The concurrence of four (4) members of the Board shall be necessary for the validity of any of its
action.

3 (c) Organization, Records, Reports. Immediately upon the appointment and qualifications of the
4 original members, and annually thereafter, the Board shall organize by the election of one member
5 as Chairman and one member as Vice-Chairman. The Board shall keep a complete record of all its
6 proceedings and shall present annually to the Governor through the [Director of Public Works]
7 Executive Secretary a detailed statement of the previous year, proceedings and such
8 recommendations as the Board may deem proper.

9 (d) Compensation. Members of the Board shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each

10 attendance at the meeting of the Board, provided, however, that no member shall receive more than

11 One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month.

12 § 70103. Powers and Duties of Board.

In addition to any other duties and powers granted by this Chapter the Contractors License Boardshall:

15 (a) Grant licenses to contractors pursuant to this Chapter;

16 (b) Make, amend or repeal such rules and regulations as it may deem proper fully to effectuate this 17 Chapter and carry out the purpose thereof which purpose is the protection of the general public. All 18 such rules and regulations shall be adopted pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law. The 19 rules and regulations may forbid acts or practices deemed by the Board to be detrimental to the 20 accomplishment of the purpose of this Chapter. The rules and regulations may require contractors to 21 make reports to the Board containing such items of information as will better enable the Board to 22 enforce this Chapter and rules and regulations, or as will better enable the Board from time to time to 23 amend the rules and regulations more fully to effectuate the purposes of this Chapter. The rules and 24 regulations may require contractors to furnish reports to owners containing such matters of 25 information as the Board deems necessary to promote the purpose of this Chapter. The enumeration 26 of specific matters which may properly be made the subject of rules and regulations shall not be 27 construed to limit the Board's general power to make all rules and regulations necessary fully to

28 effectuate the purpose of this Chapter;

29 (c) Enforce this Chapter and rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto;

(d) Suspend or revoke any license for any cause prescribed by § 70116 or for any cause for
suspension or revocation prescribed by the rules and regulations, and refuse to grant any license for
any cause which would be ground for revocation or suspension of a license; and

4 (e) Publish and distribute pamphlets and circulars containing such information as it deems proper to

5 further the accomplishment of the purpose of this Chapter.

6 (f) Contract professional testing services as deemed necessary to prepare, administer, and grade the
 7 examinations for applicants as may be required for the purpose of this chapter.

8 § 70104. Executive Secretary; Other Assistants.

9 10 (a) [Subject to the Personnel Law the Department of Public Works may employ and remove such administrative and clerical assistants and require and prescribe their powers and duties.]

(a)(1) The Contractors License Board shall employ an Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary shall be employed with due regard to his fitness, thorough administrative ability and knowledge of and experience in the business of contracting. The Executive Secretary shall act only with the advice and consent of the Board and shall be responsible to the Board. He shall devote his entire time to the duties of his office and shall not be actively engaged or employed in any other business, vocation or employment, nor shall he have any pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in any contracting enterprise or enterprises conducted or carried on within the Territory.

18 (2) The Executive Secretary shall, under the supervision of the Board, administer this 19 Chapter and the rules and regulations and orders established thereunder and perform such other 20 duties as the Board may require; he shall attend but not vote at all meetings of the Board; he shall be 21 in charge of the offices of the Board and responsible to the Board for the preparation of reports and 22 the collection and dissemination of data and other public information relating to contracting.

(3) The Board may, by written order filed in its office, delegate to the Executive Secretary
 such of its powers or duties as it deems reasonable and proper for the effective administration of this
 Chapter, except the power to make rules or regulations. The delegated powers and duties may be
 exercised by the Executive Secretary in the name of the Board.

27 (4) Subject to the Personnel Law the Executive Secretary may employ and remove such
 28 administrative and clerical assistants and require and prescribe their powers and duties.

29 § 70105. Place of Meeting.

30 The [Director of Public Works] Executive Secretary shall provide a suitable quarters for meetings of 31 the Contractors License Board and for the transaction of its other business.

1 § 70106. Classification.

2 (a) For the purpose of classification, the contracting business includes any or all of the following
3 branches:

- 4 (1) General Engineering Contracting;
- 5 (2) General Building Contracting;
- 6 (3) Specialty Contracting;

(4) Responsible Management Employee (R.M.E.).

8 (b) A general engineering contractor is a contractor whose principal contracting business is in 9 connection with fixed works requiring specialized engineering knowledge and skill, including the following divisions or subjects: irrigations, drainage, water power, water supply, flood control, 10 11 inland waterways, harbors, docks and wharves, shipyards and ports, dams and hydroelectric projects. 12 levees, river control and reclamation works, highways, streets and roads, tunnels, airports and 13 airways, sewer, sewage disposal plants and systems, waste reduction plants, bridges, overpasses, 14 underpasses and other similar works, pipelines and other systems for the transmission of petroleum 15 and other liquid or gaseous substances, parks, playgrounds and other recreational works, refineries, 16 chemical plants and similar industrial plants requiring specialized engineering knowledge and skill, 17 powerhouses, power plants and other utility plants and installations, mines and metallurgical plants, 18 land leveling and earth-moving projects, excavating, grating, trenching, paving and surfacing work 19 and cement and concrete works in connection with the above-mentioned fixed works.

(c) A general building contractor is a contractor whose principal contracting business is in
connection with any structure built, being built or to be built, for the support, shelter and enclosure
of persons, animals, chattels or movable property of any kind, requiring in its construction the use of
more than two unrelated building trades or crafts, or to do or superintend the whole or any part
thereof.

(d) A specialty contractor is a contractor whose operations as such are the performance of
 construction work requiring special skill and whose principal contracting business involves the use
 of specialized building trades or crafts.

(e) A Responsible Management Employee is an individual who has proved his contractingknowledge by written examination.

30 § 70107. Powers to Classify and Limit Operations.

(a) The Contractors License Board may adopt rules and regulations necessary to effect the
classification of contractors and shall require a written examination in a manner consistent with
established usage and procedure as found in the construction business, and may limit the field and
scope of the operations of a licensed contractor to those in which he is classified and qualified to
engage, as defined in § 70106.

6 (b) A licensee may make application for classification and be classified in more than one
7 classification if the licensee meets the qualifications prescribed by the Board for such additional
8 classification. For qualifying or classifying in additional classifications, the licensee shall pay the
9 appropriate application fee but shall not be required to pay any additional license fee.

10 (c) This Section shall not prohibit a specialty contractor from taking and executing a contract 11 involving the use of two or more crafts or trades, if the performance of the work in the crafts or 12 trades, other than in which he is licensed, is less than thirty-five percent (35%) and supplemental to 13 the performance of work in the craft for which the specialty contractor is licensed.

14 § 70108. Licenses Required.

No person within the purview of this Chapter shall act, or assume to act, or advertise, as general engineering contractor, general building contractor or specialty contractor without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this Chapter and the rules and regulations of the

18 Contractors License Board.

19 § 70108.1. Advertising

- 20 (a) A Contractor may advertise in print or broadcast medium only if the contractor includes in the
- 21 advertisement or listing the contractor's applicable and current license number, and provides proof
- 22 of the number's to validity to the publisher or producer of the advertising medium. The publisher or
- 23 producer of a print or broadcast advertising medium shall refuse to publish or broadcast an
- 24 advertisement or listing for a contractor who does not comply with this subsection.

25 § 70109. Investigation Permitted.

- The Contractors License Board may investigate, classify and qualify applicants for contractors
 licenses.
- 28 § 70109.1. Investigation Citation Authority .
- 29 (a) In addition to any other remedy available, the investigator of the contractors license board may
- 30 issue citations to persons in violation of the provisions of this chapter and rules promulgated.

1 (b) Each citation shall be in writing and shall describe the basis of the citation, including the

2 statutory provisions alleged to have been violated. The citation shall also contain and order to cease

3 and desist from the violation, and an assessment of civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand

- 5 § 70109.2. False complaints against contractors; Penalties.
- 6 (a) Any person who reports to, or causes a complaint to be filed with, the Contractors License Board
- 7 that a person licensed by that entity has engaged in professional misconduct, knowing the report or
- 8 complaint to be false, is guilty of an infraction punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand
- 9 <u>dollars (\$1,000).</u>
- 10 (b) The board may notify the Attorney Generals Office that a person has made or filed what the

11 entity believes to be a false report or complaint against a licensee.

- 12 § 70109.3. Cease Work Order Permitted.
- 13 The investigator may issue a cease work order to any person's construction activity if found to be in
- 14 violation of this chapter.
- 15 § 70110. No License Issued When.
- 16 No license hereunder shall be issued to:
- 17 (1) Any person unless he has filed an application <u>and paid the applicable fees</u> therefore;
- (2) Any person who does not possess a good reputation for honesty, truthfulness, financial
 integrity and fair dealing;
- (3) Any copartnership or joint venture who does not actively participate in at least one
 construction job in the course of the license year in the contracting business and thereof does not
 hold an appropriate license;
- (4) Any corporation unless the contracting business thereof is under the direct management
 of an officer or employee thereof and unless the officer or employee holds an appropriate
 Responsible Management Employee license;

(5) Any individual, unless he is of the age of eighteen (18) years or more;

- 27 (6) Any person who employs any employees in addition to himself unless he submits28 satisfactory proof that he has a current workers' compensation insurance policy.
- 29 § 70111. Application: Fees.
- 30 (a) Every applicant for a license under this Chapter shall file an application with the Contractors
- 31 License Board in such form and setting forth such information as may be prescribed or required by

- 1 the Board, and shall furnish such additional information bearing upon the issuance of the license as it
- 2 shall require. Every application shall be sworn to before an officer authorized to administer oaths. In
- 3 the case of a copartnership, joint venture or corporation, any member or officer thereof may sign the
- 4 application and verify the same on behalf of the applicant.
- 5 (b) Every application, in the case of an individual, shall be accompanied by sworn certificates of not
- 6 less than two (2) persons who have known the applicant for a period of not less than six (6) months
- 7 certifying that the applicant bears a good reputation for honesty, truthfulness and fair dealings.
- 8 (c) Every application for a license hereunder shall be accompanied by

10 § 70112. Form of Licenses.

- 11 The form of every license shall be prescribed by the Contractors License Board and shall be issued
- 12 in the name of the Board.
- 13 § 70113. Place of Business and Posting of License.
- 14 A licensed contractor shall have and maintain a definite place of business in the Territory and shall
- 15 display therein his contractor's license.

16 § 70114. Fees; Annual.

- 17 (a) The annual fees for each license thereof prescribed by this Chapter shall be as follows:

(b) The annual fee or inactive license fee shall be paid on or before June 30 of each year for a license
year beginning on July 1. Failure, neglect or refusal of any licensee to pay the annual fee before such
date shall constitute a forfeiture of his license. Any such license may be restored upon written
application therefore within one (1) year from such date and the payment of the required fee plus an
amount equal to ten percent (10%) thereof.

6 (c) Upon written request by a contractor and for good cause the Board shall place an active license in
7 an inactive status. The license, upon payment of the annual inactive license fee, may continue
8 inactive for a period of three (3) years after which time it must be reactivated or shall automatically
9 become forfeited. The license may be reactivated at any time within the three-year period by
10 fulfilling the requirements for renewal, including the payment of the appropriate renewal fee.

11 § 70115. Action on Application.

Within forty-five (45) days after the filing of a proper application for a license and the payment ofthe required fees, the Contractors License Board shall:

(a) Conduct an investigation of the applicant and in such investigation may post pertinent
information, including but not limited to, the name and address of the applicant, and if the applicant
is associated in any partnership, corporation or other entity, the names, addresses and official
capacities of his associates; and

(b) Either issue a license to the applicant or else notify him in writing by registered mail of the
Board's decision not to grant the license and specifically notify applicant of his right to have a
hearing within fifteen (15) days from the receipt of the Board's decision. The hearing shall be
conducted in accordance with § 70117.

22 § 70116. Revocation, Suspension and Renewal of Licenses.

(a) The Contractors License Board may revoke any license issued hereunder, or suspend the right ofthe licensee to use such licenses, or refuse to renew any such license for any of the following causes:

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(1) Conviction of any felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude;

26 (2) Any dishonest or fraudulent or deceitful act as a contractor which causes a substantial
 27 damage to another;

(3) Pursuing a continued and flagrant course of misrepresentation or of making false
 promises through advertising or otherwise;

30 (4) Abandonment of any construction project or operation without reasonable or legal
 31 excuse;

1 (5) Wilful departure from or wilful disregard of plans or specifications in any material 2 respect without consent of the owner or his duly authorized representative, which is prejudicial to a 3 person entitled to have the construction project or operation completed in accordance with such 4 plans and specifications;

5 (6) Wilful violation of any law of the Territory or of any political subdivision thereof, 6 relating to building, including any violation of any applicable rule or regulation of the Department of 7 Public Health, or of any applicable safety or labor law;

8 (7) Failure to make and keep records showing all contracts, documents, records, receipts and 9 disbursements by a licensee of all his transactions as a contractor for a period of not less than three 10 (3) years after completion of any construction project or operation to which the records refer or to 11 permit inspections of such records by the Board;

(8) When the licensee being a copartnership or a joint venture permits any member of such
copartnership or joint venture who does not hold a license to actively participate in the contracting
business thereof;

(9) When the licensee being a corporation permits any officer or employee of such
corporation who does not hold a license to have the direct management of the contracting business
thereof;

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(10) Misrepresentation of a material fact by an applicant in obtaining a license;

(11) Failure of a licensee to complete in a material respect any construction project or
 operation for the agreed price if such failure is without legal excuse;

(12) Wilful failure in any material respect to comply with this Chapter or the rules and
 regulations promulgated pursuant thereto;

(13) Wilful failure or refusal to prosecute a project or operation to completion with
 reasonable diligence;

(14) Wilful failure to pay when due a debt incurred for services of materials rendered or purchased in connection with his operations as a contractor when he has the ability to pay or when he has received sufficient funds therefor as payment for the particular operation for which the services or materials were rendered or purchased;

(15) The false denial of any debt due or the validity of the claim therefor with intent to secure
for licensee, his employer or other person, any discount of such debt or with intent to hinder, delay
or defraud the person to whom such debt is due;

(16) Failure to secure or maintain workmen's compensation insurance;

2 (17) Knowingly entering into a contract with an unlicensed contractor involving work or 3 activity for the performance of which licensing is required under this Chapter; or

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(18) When the Responsible Management Employee and/or the majority stockholders have, under another corporate or company structure, caused the non-payment of employees wages and/or 5 6 the abandonment of alien workers to become a burden on the Government.

7 (19) willful failure to pay when due a debt or penalty incurred for damaging a public utility 8 operated by the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority or the Guam Waterworks 9 Authority and the Department of Public Works.

10 (20) Knowingly taps into any power, water or sewer line belonging to the Guam Power 11 Authority and Guam Waterworks Authority without the prior written permission.

(b) No license shall be suspended for longer than two (2) years and no person whose license is 12 13 revoked shall be eligible for a new license until the expiration of two (2) years.

(c) For purposes of this Section, the Contractors License Board in cooperation and in conjunction 14

15 with the Department of Public Works, Department of Revenue and Taxation and the Department of

Labor may have investigative powers for purposes of carrying out the intent of this Section. 16

17 § 70117. Hearings.

18 (a) In every case where it is proposed to refuse to grant a license or to revoke or suspend a license or

19 to refuse to renew a license, the Contractors License Board shall give the person concerned notice

and hearing in conformity with the Administrative Adjudication Law. The notice shall be given in 20

21 writing by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested at least fifteen (15) days before 22 the hearing.

23 (b) In all proceedings before it, the Board and each member thereof shall have the same powers respecting administering oaths, compelling the attendance of witnesses and the production of 24 documentary evidence and examining witnesses as are possessed by circuit judges at chambers. In 25 case of disobedience by any person of any order of the Board, or any member thereof, or any 26 subpoena issued by it, or him, or the refusal of any witness to testify to any matter regarding which 27 he may be questioned lawfully, any judge of the Superior Court, on application by the Board thereof, 28 29 shall compel obedience as in the case of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena issued by 30 the Superior Court, or a refusal to testify therein.

- § 70118. Appeal to Superior Court. 31

- 1 An applicant who has been refused a license and every licensee whose license has been suspended,
- 2 revoked or not renewed may appeal the Contractors License Board's decision to the Superior Court
- 3 in the manner provided in the Administrative Adjudication Law.

4 § 70119. Disposition of Fees, Refunds.

5 (a) All fees received by the Contractors License Board under this Chapter shall be deposited by the

- 6 Executive Secretary with the Treasurer of Guam to the credit of the General Fund.
- 7 (b) The Board may request the Treasurer of Guam to have any fee erroneously paid to it under this8 Chapter refunded when the Board deems it just and equitable.

9 § 70120. Death or Dissociation.

10 No copartnership, joint venture or corporation shall be deemed to have violated any provision of this

- 11 Chapter by acting or assuming to act as a contractor after the death or dissociation of a licensee who
- 12 had the direct management of the contracting business thereof prior to final disposition by the
- 13 Contractors License Board of an application for a license made within thirty (30) days from the date
- 14 of the death or dissociation.

15 § 70121. Violation, Penalty.

Any person who violates or omits to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined
not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000).

18 § 70122. Injunction.

The Contractors License Board may, in addition to any other remedies available, apply to a judge of the Superior Court for a preliminary or permanent injunction restraining any person from acting or assuming to act or advertising as general engineering contractor, general building contractor or specialty contractor, without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this Chapter and the rules and regulations of the Board and upon hearing and for cause shown, the judge may grant the preliminary or permanent injunction.

25 § 70123. Exemptions for Prior Licensees.

Any contractor who obtained a valid contractor's license under the existing license statute prior to July 1, 1977 shall be exempt from provision of this Chapter relative to application, investigations and examinations. Any contractor with a valid license issued prior to July 1, 1977 with a classification different from those enumerated in § 70106 shall be automatically placed in the appropriate classification without the necessity of complying with the application, investigation and examination provisions of this Chapter. All other provisions shall apply."
