# 1**BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**2Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law 30-42 is amended to read as follows:3"Section 2. Appropriation and Authorization for Payment of4Overtime to the Department of Administration. The sum of Two

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1 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the 2 Indirect Cost Fund to the Department of Administration for overtime, 3 supplies and postage for the processing and mailing of COLA and income tax refunds, and for training of Department of Education personnel at the 4 Financial Services Division and Personnel Services Division specifically to 5 6 deficiencies in personnel management and the financial address 7 administration of all funds under the purview of the Department of 8 Education and any other operational costs. Employees of the following 9 agencies may be compensated by this appropriation for assisting the 10 Department of Education:

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The Department of Administration; (a)

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The Bureau of Budget and Management Research." (b)

Section 7 of Chapter VIII of Public Law 30-55 is hereby 13 Section 2. 14 amended to read as follows:

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"Section 7. Grounds Maintenance for School. Subject to approval 16 and scheduling of the public school principals, the Mayors are responsible for the eighteen (18) cuts of regular grounds maintenance of DOE school 17 18 grounds in their respective districts where ground maintenance is *not* already subject to an existing contract. Subject to approval of scheduling with the 19 20 public school principals, the Mayor may contract with a private entity to 21 provide the services authorized by this Section.

22 The sum of Four Hundred Seventy-four Thousand Seven Hundred 23 Twenty Dollars (\$474,720) is appropriated from the General Fund to the 24 Community Development Fund for the grounds maintenance of specified schools of the Department of Education below to be allocated as follows: 25

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

#### I. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs finds that Section 67107 of Chapter 67, of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated established the Guam Veterans Commission which, as currently written, consists of "one (1) member each from the currently officially chartered Guam chapters of the Recognized Service Organizations as recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs."

The Committee finds that Guam chartered veterans service organizations desire to participate on the Veterans Commission, which advocates and advances issues facing veterans. However, these organizations are not recognized by the U.S. Veterans Affairs office and therefore are not eligible to be members of the Veterans Commission. In order to achieve the greatest participation of veteran service organizations, Section 67107 of Chapter 67, of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated should be modified to remove the requirement that only U.S. Veterans Affairs Office recognized organizations may be members on the Guam Veterans Commission. The Committee finds that membership on the Guam Veterans Commission should be open to all Guam Chapters of multi-branch veterans service organizations and a total of four (4) members representing the respective veterans or retirees association for each branch of the U.S. Armed Forces, i.e. U.S. Army Retirees (or Veterans) Association, U.S. Air Force Retirees (or Veterans) Association, U.S. Navy Retirees (or Veterans) Association, and USMC Retirees (or Veterans) Associations. In addition, all organizations with members on the Guam Veterans Commission must be duly registered as a non-profit organization with the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation in accordance with Title 18 Guam Code Annotated relative to non-profit organizations and shall furnish the Guam Veterans Affairs Office each year a copy of the Non-profit Annual Report filed with the Department of Revenue and Taxation.

The Committee finds that the definition of a quorum required modification to address the potential change in the number of members on the Veterans Commission. The Committee has modified the language in the bill to provide flexibility in the event the Veterans Commission membership changes.

The Committee further finds that the Veterans Commission enabling act does not provide a clear process on how a new member is added to the Commission. A new section 67107.1 New Membership Process has been added to the bill to clarify the process in which a new member is added to the Veterans Commission. The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs, hereby reports out Bill No. 260-30 (COR) As Substituted by the Committee, with the recommendation **TO PASS**.

#### II. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs convened a public hearing on December 3, 2009 at 9:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was consideration of Bill No. 260-30 (COR) "An act to amend Section 67107 of Chapter 67, of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to allowing greater participation of veteran service organizations in the Guam Veterans Commission." sponsored by Senator F.F. Blas, Jr.

#### Bill Cundiff

#### Provided oral testimony

Mr. Cundiff is in support of Bill 260-30 and provided a recommendation to include any other entities mandated to provide veteran services. Mr. Cundiff is appointed Director of Andersen Air Force Base Retiree's Office and works for the Wing Commander on retiree issues.

#### Alan G. Van Aken

#### Provided oral testimony

Mr. Van Aken is in support of Bill 260-30. Mr. Van Aken is a member of the Guam Chapter of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Marine Division and Chairman of the Guam Veterans Commission. Mr. Van Aken stated there were other veteran advocacy organizations not recognized by the Veterans Affairs office that want to participate on the Commission. Mr. Van Aken further stated he was in support of Mr. Cundiff's proposed amendment.

#### Art Mesa

#### Provided oral and written testimony

Mr. Mesa is in support of Bill 260-30. Mr. Mesa stated in his written testimony there were several active veterans service organizations not eligible to be members on the Veterans Commission based on current law. Mr. Mesa further stated the amendment is in keeping with the spirit of the late Speaker Antonio Unpingco.

#### Mr. Fred Gofigan

#### Provided written testimony

Mr. Gofigan is in support of Bill 260-30. Mr. Gofigan is the Administrator of the Guam Veterans Affairs Office. In his written testimony, Mr. Gofigan stated there were only five (5) veteran organizations that are recognized by the U.S. Veterans Affairs Office which under the current law, is a requirement to be a member on the Guam Veterans Commission. According to Mr. Gofigan, all Guam veteran service organizations should be given equal membership and voting rights on the Guam Veterans Commission.

#### PCol Adolf Sgambelluri

#### Provide written testimony

PCol Sgambelluri is in support of Bill 260-30. Mr. Sgambelluri agreed that each organization with a member on the Veterans Commission be registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation.

#### **Question and Answer**

Senator Aguon: Asked if Mr. Van Aken was the Chairman of the Guam Veterans Commission and if he was appointed by the Chief Executive. Mr. Aken: Confirmed that he was the Chairman of the Guam Veterans Commission and was duly elected by members of the Guam Veterans Commission, not appointed by the Chief Executive.

Senator Aguon: Pledged his support of the bill.

Senator Muna-Barnes: Asked how many veterans organizations are on Guam and how many would be eligible to participate on the Guam Veterans Commission if the bill were signed into law.

Mr. Art Mesa: Responded that there were approximately 15 veteran service organizations and 2 auxiliary organizations. Mr. Mesa noted there were approximately 8 Guam Chapters recognized by the U.S. Veterans Affairs. The bill would allow for 7 additional organizations to participate on the Guam Veterans Commission if the bill were signed into law.

Senator Ada: Asked Mr. Cundiff if his organization was funded and a counterpart to the Guam Veterans Affairs Office.

Mr. Bill Cundiff: Responded that his office was not funded and that he was appointed to the Wing Retired Activities Office. Mr. Cundiff stated his office was not the counterpart of the Guam Veterans Affairs Office but rather an additional conduit to the Guam Veterans Affairs Office and Guam Veterans Commission. Mr. Cundiff asked if there was a Guam website that provides general and benefits information specifically for Guam veterans.

Senator Ada: Raised concerns regarding the Guam Veterans Commission quorum established by public law. Currently, a quorum of 5 is required. If the Commission expands its membership, the minimum requirement for a quorum should be revisited.

#### AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 67107 OF CHAPTER 67. OF TITLE 10 OF THE **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ALLOWING GREATER PARTICIPATION OF VETERAN SERVICE **ORGANIZATIONS** IN THE **GUAM** VETERANS COMMISSION.

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#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 3 the Guam Veterans Commission is the "voice" of the many veterans that reside on 4 Guam. There are some Veteran Service Organizations that are not recognized by the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs; however, these Veteran Service Organizations 5 6 continue to provide support and resources to Guam's veterans and provide and invaluable service. These Veteran Service Organizations deserve to be represented on 7 8 the Guam Veterans Commission which is tasked to provide veterans and their families 9 information regarding benefits and services to the Guam veteran population. By 10 allowing all veteran Service Organizations to be represented on the Commission, more 11 Guam veterans and their families will receive information about the services and 12 benefits available to them.

# 13 Section 2. Section 67107 of Chapter 67 of Title 10 of the Guam Code 14 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

1 Guam Veterans Commission. There is hereby established, 2 in the Office of Veterans Affairs, a Guam Veterans Commission which shall 3 consist of one (1) member each from the currently officially chartered Guam 4 chapters of the Recognized Veteran Service Organizations. recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. The Commander or designee of each 5 6 Recognized Veteran Service Organization shall be the representative. Every 7 representative *shall* serve for the term of the Commander, but *not more than* 8 two (2) years. If the Commander's term exceeds two (2) years, the service organization shall appoint, by Chapter Executive Council vote, a successor to 9 10 serve during the term of the incumbent Commander. Should a Recognized 11 <u>Veteran</u> Service Organization have more than one (1) Chapter, then the 12 membership within the Commission *shall* be rotated among the Commanders of 13 those Chapters, with the order of the rotation decided among those Chapters. Five (5) members shall constitute a quorum. #### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Legislative findings and intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Guam Section 1. 3 Veterans Commission is the "voice" of the many veterans that reside on Guam. There are some 4 Veteran Service Organizations that are not recognized by the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs; 5 however, these Veteran Service Organizations continue to provide support and resources to Guam's 6 veterans and provide and invaluable service. These Veteran Service Organizations deserve to be 7 represented on the Guam Veterans Commission which is tasked to provide veterans and their 8 families' information regarding benefits and services to the Guam veteran population. By allowing 9 all veteran Service Organizations to be represented on the Commission, more Guam veterans and 10 their families will receive information about the services and benefits available to them.

11 <u>I Liheslaturan Guåhan</u> finds that only bona fide veteran organizations should participate in 12 the Guam Veterans Commission activities. As such, members of the commission should at 13 minimum be registered as a nonprofit organization and duly registered with the Department of 14 Revenue and Taxation.

#### Section 2. Section 67107 of Chapter 67 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is 16 hereby amended to read as follows:

17 **\*\*§67107.** Guam Veterans Commission. There is hereby established, in the 18 Office of Veterans Affairs, a Guam Veterans Commission which shall consist of: (1) four 19 (4)one (1) members representing the respective a veterans or retirees association for each 20branch of the U.S. Armed Forces, i.e. U.S. Army Retirees (or Veterans) Association, U.S. Air

- 1 Force Retirees (or Veterans) Association, U.S. Navy Retirees (or Veterans) Association, and 2 USMC Retirees (or Veterans) Associations, and (2) from the currently officially chartered 3 Guam chapters of multi-service the Recognized Veteran Service Organizations recognized by 4 the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Organizations to be represented on the Guam 5 Veterans Commission are required to be duly registered as a non-profit corporation with the 6 Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation in accordance with Title 18 of Guam Code 7 Annotated and shall furnish the Guam Veterans Affairs Office each year a copy of the Non-8 profit Annual Report filed with Department of Revenue and Taxation. The Commander or 9 designee of each Recognized Veteran Service Organization shall be the representative on the 10 Veterans Commission. Every representative *shall* serve for the term of the Commander, but 11 not more than two (2) years. If the Commander's term exceeds two (2) years, the Veteran 12 Service Organization service organization shall appoint, by Chapter Executive Council vote, 13 a successor to serve during the term of the incumbent Commander. Should a Recognized 14 Veteran Service Organization have more than one (1) Chapter, then the membership within 15 the Commission *shall* be rotated among the Commanders of those Chapters, with the order of 16 the rotation decided among those Chapters. A majority (50% plus one) of the number of Five 17 (5) members on the Commission *shall* constitute a quorum. The Commission *shall* meet 18 quarterly and *shall* advise the Veterans Affairs Officer regarding matters affecting veterans 19 and eligible claimants regarding Veterans Administration-related issues. The Commission 20 shall provide veterans and their families with the opportunity to air grievances for the 21 purpose of effecting corrective action or change to existing policies that affect delivery of 22 benefits and services to the Guam veteran population. The members of the Commission are 23 volunteers and *shall* not receive compensation."
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<u>"§67107.1 New Membership Process.</u> The process for new membership to the Guam Veterans Commission is as follows:

- 1. <u>The Guam Veterans Affairs Office shall receive new membership request and</u> <u>submit same to the Chairman of the Guam Veterans Commission.</u>
