Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 1 2 that there was no statute of limitations on the collection of the Gross Receipts Tax 3 until, on November 14, 1987, Governor Joseph F. Ada approved Public Law 19-4 10, which established a seven year statute of limitations.

I Liheslatura finds that, in contrast to the seven year statute of limitations on 6 collections of the Gross Receipts Tax, now called the Business Privilege Tax, the 7 statute of limitations for collections by the Department of Revenue and Taxation 8 pursuant to taxes under the mirror tax, established by the Organic Act, is ten years. The Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land convened a public hearing on June 13, 2013 at 2:30 pm in *I Liheslatura's* public hearing room.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Pangelinan. The next item on the agenda is Bill No. 138, introduced by myself, "An Act to Amend Section 1515(i)(2)(G), Article 5, Chapter 1, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to the repair and improvements to the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative". I have signed up to testify this afternoon, Mr. Manny Duenas, Jess Rosario, and Mr. Victor Artero.

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary. Briefly, Bill No. 138 is a bill that would change the funding for the Guam Fishermen's CoOp improvements from a \$5M loan from the proceeds of the Guam Hotel Occupancy Tax bond issuance to a \$2M grant of which would be available to the Fishermen's CoOp to use in the construction and improvements of the facility to include leveraging that amount with any additional grants that may be available to them. I know they are very creative in that area. They will then be able to put into play the plans that have been developed for the rehabilitation and construction, repair and improvements of the Fishermen's CoOp.

At this time, we will proceed to receive public testimony.

(b) Testimonies.

Mr. Jesse Rosario. Buenas and Hafa Adai, Mr. Chairman, Madam Speaker and members of the 32^{nd} Guam Legislature. My name is Jesse Rosario, I am a *Peskadot* through generations. The funny thing is, I have visited you guys several times – if you look around there are not too many folks, which I think is a good thing for what's on the table, Bill 138. Otherwise, if it is not a good bill, you will see a lot of folks here. I think they have their confidence enough to present to you the importance of the bill. Basically, I am not complete with my written testimony and I will send that to you at later date. I can read from what I have to will share with you.

Today marks a significant, affordable forward movement for the Fishermen's Cooperative Association facility. Since 1977, the Guam Fishermen's CoOp has been operating at its location serving the fishermen, the boaters, the anglers, tourism and the great community of this island, Guam. Your efforts to endorse Bill 138-32 and approving this bill will strengthen the foundation, and in this case the facility in its entirety at its present location, located in the heart of our island, Hagatna and also the Gregorio D. Perez Marina. Guam Fishermen's CoOp has continually operated under many challenges, yet they stand prepared to serve our community

with the best seafood caught on Guam. The Fishermen's CoOp motto is, "Our Oceans' Best and they stick to that. They provide our ocean's best in seafood. If you look at their showcase display, you see all that. They get a lot of people coming in because of the seafood they provide, the quality of the food and we know it is totally safe.

Today Fishermen's CoOp's membership has grown and will continue to grow. But, to serve our community and showcase our ocean's best products, we need to have a facility that meets this demand. By endorsing and approving Bill No. 138 and providing immediate funding we are looking at modern and energy savings operating the cooperative association with its members to continually provide fresh seafood from our ocean's best to the great community of Guam. The people, like myself use the Guam Fishermen's CoOp to recover our costs and in a lot of cases, when we give our fish to the Guam Fishermen's CoOp, it turns around and goes to our *Manamko*, family and friends who do not how to fish, but love to eat the fish.

The Guam Fishermen's CoOp has a huge reputation and has become a model, not only on this island but also for the other regional areas from Saipan to the other islands, Palau, Phonpei. We would like to continue this trend in terms of supporting the Guam Fishermen's CoOp facility. We have waited a long time and we continue to wait. The bill is in your hands to really get it moving forward and I solicit your support in approving Bill 138 to build a facility for this island of Guam and to continue to provide the best ocean seafood that we have. Again Mr. Chairman, thank you for listening to me and I hope that this bill will be processed with the entire support from the Guam Legislature. Si Yu'os Ma'ase.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much Mr. Rosario. Mr. Duenas.

Mr. Manny Duenas. Thank you Mr. Chairman. My name is Manny Duenas and speaking on behalf of the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative on Bill 138-32. We support the bill, of course. It has been a long hard road. We were offered \$5M as a loan which we requested for, not a grant in the beginning because we wanted to rebuild the Farmer's and Fishermen's Revolving Fund. But, seeing that there are some issues with the HOT bonds, we are going down to \$2M and then we are looking at borrowing – seeking private financing for the balance. So, this is how we are approaching this exercise. We have been shovel-ready since 2005. We are the only project in the HOT bond issue that has been shovel-ready. Now, after 7-8 years we have to revisit our plans to make sure they are in compliance with current building codes and other issues.

We just have a few concerns regarding the bill:

(1) Line 12 & 13; the money shall be made available... is one of the concerns. Does that mean the \$5M? I don't want to go through this exercise of visiting my good friends at GEDA, even though I love them so much and enjoy their company, but if the monies are available, what do we do? Do I have to go to GEDA every time I need a drawdown? What I am asking for is to trust us because we are going to have to be accountable for this. I believe there is a caveat with this exercise that requires a 3-month recording; every 3 months on a drawn down. We can have a joint signature account – audited account. The thing is - my wish to have the money be placed in a separate account under the Fishermen's Cooperative Association. We can make an agreement with GEDA that it takes their administrator and one of our representative to

sign off on the disbursements; just for control procedures. That is the whole reason why we asked for the loan to begin with because we wanted to establish controls. So, that's one of the concerns. If you leave it at GEDA and we move along and in six months I go back to GEDA and tell them we borrowed \$3M and GEDA says, oh sorry no money because we paid all our consultant fees, we are back to square one.

(2) Line 15 & 16: It says; No portion of the grant shall be used for fees. I know GEDA, according to the law cannot use – which they may not be too happy about – for consultant fees and their administrative fees. However when we have to revisit the fact that we have to re-do the plans, there will be fees for consultant fees, architect fees, engineering fees, compliance fees, Public Works' fees – all the permitting process will have some sort of fees. I would like to think I can drawn down on the money to complete those tasks because the banks won't loan the CoOp \$3M or \$2M, whatever the need is to pay for fees. They want to pay for the hard construction and I recognize the Legislature's concern regarding the hard construction but we don't have the money for paying the soft portion and we don't know how far that is going to go.

Those are the two major issues regarding this legislation. Again, we appreciate the continued support by Senator Pangelinan and all of you because I have seen you sign and approve – there has never been a negative connotation in the voting docket. As far as we in the community, we appreciate all you have done. Now, let us take charge and do it for you, do it for the community, do what is best for everybody. Thank you. Si Yu'os Ma'ase.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much, Mr. Duenas. For the record, GEDA submitted testimony and they pointed out some of those clarifications. The intent in the bill of the fees was that GEDA – we saw that in the other projects after paying the project manager \$2.1M, then letting out the bids for the projects individually was still charging GEDA fees for that project, so they were taking fees out of the fund for their own fees and then taking more fees for the project management on top of the \$2.1M that they already got. The intention was those fees would not be taken out of the \$2M before being transferred for the project. The intent was not to prevent the Fishermen's CoOP from paying for engineering fees associated with the construction, design fees, renovation – so in this case, re-design fees.

How soon do you think you would be able to re-do those design plans – when you say you are shovel ready, you need a review to update the plans – how soon do you anticipate being able to go out with doing something like that?

Mr. Manny Duenas. Based on our initial project, it took us less than six months – it actually took us four months to do the original design for the A&E and all the consultant work and permits and clearances. We have everyone on stand by. I expect to get this done, the whole A&E maybe in three months review. Our designer is no longer with us; our primary consultant Joe Morcilla has passed on. I have to find another one who is capable and qualified and concerned with the project. A lot of design people like to design things but they look at what the needs are instead of thinking what the needs should be. That's why Joe was an intrical part in our design plans. So, I have to find that same caliber person, which is difficult. But, I estimate – hopefully in six months; banking and issues and all that, maybe we can be shovel ready by then. I am hopeful this year. I pledge to the membership that if we don't get started with the CoOp

project by the end of the year, there is no way this CoOp can continue next year. Honestly, I am thankful for my new job because I think my shoes can last maybe a month, but it is a frightening experience when something happens in the marina being in that building. I appreciate the urgency and the assistance, especially because it has been long overdue. Again, I hope to get it going in six months – don't put my word on it, but I will try my best. I have the full support of the CoOp members for this project and I think they will all lend a hand and we will all work on it.

Chairman Pangelinan. What do you estimate to be the total construction cost?

Mr. Manny Duenas. The total construction cost, based on the last conversation with the contractor is close to \$4.5M. A major cost is going to be the shoreline issue. In the Agana marina, there are 1100-1200 tourists tramping on those docks daily. I have asked the government time and time again, that we need to set up a commercial loading and off-loading area. So, in the design of the CoOp we decided to take that up on ourselves and offer it to the tour companies that want to use our docks. We will also have bus areas. Right now when you go there, there is a big cluster. We want to organize the area a little bit to make it more functional, make it more people friendly and offer amenities that can be shared with the Chamorro Village. We can ask tour companies that when the tourists have down time, instead of waiting in the sun under a canopy, they can walk through the CoOp facility or go over to Chamorro Village for 20-30 minutes of down time. Then, they can go on to their next activity.

That's what the CoOp idea is all about. Sharing the wealth with the community. I don't think anyone will argue with that.

Chairman Pangelinan. You are confident you can get the financing over and above the \$2M provided for as a grant for that project?

Mr. Manny Duenas. Yes, I am very confident. I was assured by several loan guarantee programs. With the \$2M we have a better stake in the game. Finance is normally 80/20, 75/25 depending how bad you are. In the CoOp's case, I think it will be about a 75/25 or 70/30 and with the \$2M that makes the odds in favor of our endeavor.

Chairman Pangelinan. \$2.5M would be better?

Mr. Manny Duenas. It would have been better, but when I went to GEDA, they kept chipping away the number, so I stopped at \$2M and this is where that whole exercise comes from.

Chairman Pangelinan. We reserved \$5M and from the allocation based on the projects, this would go to other projects. There may be a little bit of movement but we will get a number – not less than \$2M and will look at the other allocations within the projects. Mr. Artero?

Mr. Victor Artero. I submitted written testimony. Thank you Mr. Chairman, Speaker and all of you. I just wanted to add to my written testimony. I know there are things that need to be tweaked in terms of the language of the law and what GEDA is charged to carry on. I am here

mostly because the facility also doubles as an educational outlet for our people at the University with the 4H Program. We rely on that facility, not only to send our kids on a boat to go out, but when they come back, they go to the CoOp to see how they process and handle the fish properly. That in itself is a very educational aspect of the program. We have this program called CariPac – the Caribbean and the Pacific – where we bring kids here in the summer from other places like Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Northern Marianas and some from Micronesia to come here to spend a 4-week internship and they go through the CoOp to experience the processing, handling and marketing of the fish.

The CoOp really needs help. It must be 30 years, maybe closer to 40, but it really needs help. Any kind of help this Legislature can lend to us - and I am pretty sure the Governor is supporting our needs, as well. We welcome that. I just want to echo that sentiment. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much, Mr. Artero. Senator Duenas?

Senator Chris Duenas. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Manny, when you said shovel ready, I wondered how did we miss AARA on this. The only thing you are fortunate about now with the 8 years is that the interest rate is good now that you are borrowing.

The two questions I primarily have are: are there any issues with regard to the land. Is that all secured in terms of – you have secured that property?

Mr. Manny Duenas. Yes, that was addressed several years ago and we have a longerterm lease. We just have to notify the rest of GovGuam because every time they want to kick out the paddlers, kick out the canoe people, we have to remind them, sorry we allowed them to be there. They are part of our community.

Senator Chris Duenas. The other issue I have and I have not seen the most up to date, but I have seen the prior one – does this include the refurbishment and inclusive of the fuel pier?

Mr. Manny Duenas. Yes, our whole plan is to extend the fuel pier 200 feet to provide proper amenities for our tourists. Maybe a couple of months ago, I was here to testify that some of the GVB money should be set aside for capital improvements for the tourism industry. Our marinas are fully funded by fisheries money and they are not benefiting the fishermen. Such in the case with our CoOp. The CoOp belongs to the community. If I take pride in it once in a while it is because I spend a lot of time on it. At the end day, it is a 200-foot pier that would provide the proper docking area for our tourists; proper off-loading and taking care of our tourists. If you go down there on any given day between Agat and Agana, it is really sad. The tourists down in Agat are getting hurt walking on the dock and nobody can help. The fisheries money is being put into that a project again to support tourism. The people that are always criticizing are the fishing community. That is my frustration. At the end of the day, it is all about how we can all work together on marine issues.

Senator Chris Duenas. Mr. Chair I also asked that question for the benefit of the Committee. It is very important, other than the safety of the pier - the fuel issues have been

issues for a long time in terms of coast guard regulations as well as the overall flow and usage of the marina. The CoOp is doing so much more than just providing for the fishermen, it really is much more expansive. Thank you Mr. Chair and thank you Manny for continuing your efforts and the entire board that supports you.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much, Senator Duenas.

Mr. Manny Duenas. I just want to comment on what Mr. Artero mentioned earlier. Of all non-profit organizations on Guam, this organization does more for this island. I challenge anyone to beat this organization. We waited long enough for help. I am asking to please help us. We help kids on a monthly basis, we help medical referrals on a daily basis. The CoOp has never said no.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you, Mr. Duenas. I also have Mr. Joseph Artero Cameron who has signed up to testify.

Mr. Joseph Artero Cameron. Thank you Senators and thank you Mr. Chairman. I am Joseph Artero Cameron, the point of contact for the Office of the Governor for all coral reef conservation programs here on Guam for fisheries and also for ocean matters. I just wanted to congratulate the efforts of your office and most especially the hardworking folks that are here who are in full support of this particular bill. I might also add that something that is coming up the pikes very soon would be to also enhance the area where the Fishermen's CoOp is, just to the side of it is the actual fishing platform that will be funded by Sports Fish Restoration money. It will be a great opportunity for viewing, not just fishing but also for viewing. We like to look at it as a fishing and viewing platform for our tourists, more especially when the atulai season comes, folks are not standing on boulders of rocks. I walk at the Paseo after work every day and I notice a lot of dangerous areas. We are also very excited about partnering with the Port Authority of Guam and enhancing their area as well with Sports Fish Restoration monies to add additional platform areas verses wood and get them that necessary platform. We also have money

Thank you very much for this opportunity.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you and Si Yu'os Ma'ase Mr. Cameron. Mr. Tom Camacho. Thank you for coming to testify on Bill 138. I would also like to recognize the presence of the Mayor of Santa Rita, Mr. Dale Alvarez. Thank you very much for joining us.

Mr. Tom Camacho. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I just want to express my support for the bill. I think it is long overdue.

Chairman Pangelinan. This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 138-32. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. 

Bill 138-32 – "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1515(i)(G), ARTICLE 5, CHAPTER 1, TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE REPAIR AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE GUAM FISHERMEN'S COOPERATIVE

Hafai Adai Senator Pangelinan and members of the Committee on Appropriations, Taxation, Public Debt, Banking Insurance, Retirement and Land. My name is Mana Silva Taijeron, Acting Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), and I hereby submit this written testimony on Bill No.138-32.

Bill 138 intends to change law applicable to the Hotel Occupancy Tax bond to require the repair and renovation of the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative facility. The original statute required the issuance of a \$5 Million loan to accomplish repair, renovation and new construction. This bill replaces the loan requirement with a grant of \$2 Million. Governor Calvo's Blueprint 2020 states: "Build the Guam Fisherman's Cooperative Building: We will finally move forward and utilize HUD funding and provide a modern state of the art facility for island fishermen to sell their local catch," As the fishing industry provides significant economic benefits to the island economy, GEDA supports the intent of the bill.

The bill raises two concerns which GEDA hopes will be clarified in the final version. The bill states "No portion of the grant shall be used for fees." While we understand the prohibition on utilizing any portion of the grant for project management fees, we are concerned that such language will prevent use of grant funding for architectural and engineering, archaeological investigations, environmental investigations or other such activities integral to obtaining permits should the need exist.

GEDA also suggests that clarification be provided in the bill on whether it is the Legislature's intent that grant funding will be transferred to the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association or whether GEDA will be responsible for managing the funds. Our concern stems from the need to maintain all records to support financial audits of the Hotel Occupancy Tax Bond program.

For the information of the Legislative Committee, bond counsel has advised that there are limitations on use of bond proceeds, particularly if projects are to be managed by "non-governmental persons." (See enclosed letter from bond counsel.) Currently, Public Law 30-228 as amended by Public Law 31-196 appropriates HOT bond funding for two projects that will be managed by "non-governmental persons," namely the Guam Farmers' Cooperative Association and the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association. As \$3.9 Million is already allocated to the Farmers project and \$2 Million is allocated to the Fishermen's project by this bill, the threshold identified by bond counsel has NOT been exceeded. However, any future consideration to place the management of any HOT bond project under nongovernmental persons must take into account bond counsel advice.



As the Legislature is aware, Public Law 30-228 appropriated \$68.5 Million for over 20 projects. Bond proceeds actually netted \$55,569,000 for these projects, after other bond-related expenses were paid as required by the law. While GEDA has been following the priorities established by law, we have had difficulty identifying where the original \$5M loan amount was to come from because the GFCA project was an addition to the list and which projects potentially would have been eliminated or continued with a reduced scope because of it. Now that only \$2M is needed the job should be easier.

In closing, GEDA supports the intent of Bill 138 as it is in line with the Governor's policy and because the Fisherman's Coop provides significant economic benefit for the island and its members. Si Yu'os Ma'ase for the opportunity to provide testimony.

Dear Mr. Pangelinan:

This letter is in reply to your memorandum of June 6, 2012 relaying certain questions concerning the implementation of the projects to be funded with the proceeds of the above-captioned bonds.

Guam Fishermen's Coop

You asked us to evaluate whether the Government may implement a project added by PL 31-196 which describes the additional appropriation of bond proceeds as follows: "for the purposes of issuing a loan of no less than Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) to the Guam Fisherman's Cooperative Association (GFCA) for the development of the Greg D. Perez Marina Economic Enhancement Master Plan. The loan shall be structured and administered by the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA) for the term of up to forty (40) years at maximum interest rate of no more than Four percent (4%) per annum. Proceeds from the repayment of the loan shall be deposited into the Agricultural Development Fund."

The supplemental indenture authorizing the issuance of the bonds authorizes the bond proceeds to be spent on the projects listed in Exhibit A, which were the projects for which bond proceeds were appropriated by the statute authorizing the issuance of the bonds. Subsections (27) and (28) authorize the Government to add projects to the list by statute. So the first part of the answer is that the Fisherman's Coop project may be implemented with bond proceeds.

However, the Tax Certificate signed by the Government in connection with the issuance of the bonds contains certain limitations that reflect the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and regulations applicable to tax-exempt bonds. Among these is the following paragraph:

"2.4 Governmental Bond Status. Absent an Opinion of Counsel, the Issuer will not loan more than \$5,000,000 of the Bond proceeds to one or more Nongovernmental Persons. Absent an Opinion of Counsel, the Issuer will not allow more than 10% of the Project or of the Sale Proceeds and Investment Proceeds of the Bonds to be used directly or indirectly by any Nongovernmental Person in any trade or business, other than as a member of the general public. Absent an Opinion of Counsel, for purposes of this Section 2.4, a Nongovernmental Person will be treated as "using" Bond proceeds to the extent the Nongovernmental Person:

- (i) borrows Bond proceeds,
- (ii) uses the Project (e.g., as owner, lessee, service provider, operator or manager), or
- (iii) acquires or uses technology developed at the Project."

As you may recall, at the time of issuance of the bonds we reviewed each of the projects to be implemented with bond proceeds to determine that it did not violate this limitation. As you noted in your memorandum, among those original projects was a project "for the design and construction of a Guam Farmers Cooperative Association facility and the relocation of the Dededo Flea Market." Our understanding was that this was the only project that would not be owned by the Government and would be used by nongovernmental persons other than as members of the general public. We also understood that the amount of the assistance to the Farmer's Coop was to be within the above limitations and would be implemented by a grant, rather than a loan.

If we add a loan to the Fisherman's Coop to the list, at exactly \$5,000,000 (the minimum authorized by PL 31-196), we will at a minimum be treading perilously close to the limitations described above, and may be exceeding them. Violating these limitations would be a breach of the Government's covenant under the supplemental indenture to "... do and perform all acts and things permitted by law, the Indenture and this Supplemental Indenture which are necessary or desirable in order to assure that interest paid on the Series 2011A Bonds (or on any of them) shall be excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes"

There may be alternatives that will permit assistance to the Fisherman's Cooperative, but they need to remain within the limitations described above, taking into account all of the projects (including the museum project).

Tumon Flooding

Under the original statute (and the supplemental indenture), bond proceeds can be used "for resolution of the San Vitores flooding caused by storm water runoff along San Vitores Road north of the Fujita Pump Station by collecting and removing storm runoff via transmission to the Fujita Pump Station to be discharged at a suitable location." Your memorandum states that in order to determine whether any particular project, including the one described by the statute and the indenture, actually can be expected to "resolve" the flooding, an engineering study may be necessary.

We are of the view that such a study, aimed at identifying the causes of and the improvements needed to effect the "resolution of the San Vitores flooding caused by storm water runoff along San Vitores Road north of the Fujita Pump Station," would be a preliminary engineering cost of the project and therefore can be funded with bond proceeds.

That study might identify facilities that are needed beyond those that would "[collect] and [remove] storm runoff via transmission to the Fujita Pump Station to be discharged at a suitable location." If it does, then we should discuss the additional needed facilities in the context of the statute to determine which if any of the identified facilities would be eligible for funding with bond proceeds, with or without an amendment to the statute. It would not be appropriate to use bond proceeds for any detailed design work for facilities that would not themselves be eligible for funding with bond proceeds.

GEDA Management Fees

This will confirm that it is our view that GEDA costs to manage the bond program should be allocated to each project being implemented, i.e., treated as costs of the individual projects.

AN ACT TO AMEND §26205 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 26, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS ON THE COLLECTION OF UNPAID BUSINESS PRIVILEGE TAX TO TEN (10) YEARS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Short Title. This Act *shall* be cited as the "Responsible
Business Privilege Tax Statutes of Limitations Act."

Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*finds that there was no statute of limitations on the collection of the Gross
Receipts Tax until, on November 14, 1987, Governor Joseph F. Ada
approved Public Law 19-10, which established a seven (7) year statute of
limitations.

9 *I Liheslatura* finds that, in contrast to the seven (7) year statue of 10 limitations on collections of the Gross Receipts Tax, now called the 11 Business Privilege Tax, the statute of limitations for collections by the 12 Department of Revenue and Taxation pursuant to taxes under the mirror 13 tax, established by the Organic Act, is ten (10) years. The government of Guam has three (3) extra years to collect for taxes under the Internal
 Revenue Code mirror tax, as compared to businesses taxed under the
 Business Privilege Tax.

I Liheslatura further finds that the extension of the statute of limitations for collections of the Business Privilege Tax would result in \$5,794,530.62 in additional potential revenue, which could be used to support vital public services.

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the recent performance audit report 9 by the Office of Public Accountability on Gross Receipts Tax Exemptions 10 reveals significant challenges with the monitoring, reporting and collection 11 of the Gross Receipts Tax, which underline the usefulness in extending the 12 statute of limitations because it applies from the time when the tax return is 13 filed.

14 It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslatura* that the statute of limitations 15 for collections be standardized within the Department of Revenue and 16 Taxation by adopting a ten (10) year statute of limitations for the collection 17 of the Business Privilege Tax.

Section 3. Statute of Limitations for Collections of the Business
Privilege Tax. § 26205, Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code
Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

21 *"§* 26205. Statute of Limitations for Collections.

The statute of limitations for collections of unpaid taxes due on business privilege tax returns *shall* be <u>ten (10)</u> seven (7) years after the

return is filed. For amendment, correction, adjustment, challenge, 1 determination of correctness of the amount of taxes paid, or audit of 2 income reported and the correctness of the amount of tax liability shown 3 on the business privilege tax returns, the statute of limitations *shall* be three 4 (3) years after filing and payment of taxes due. There shall be no statute of 5 limitations on unfiled business privilege tax returns or on the collection of 6 7 taxes on revenues not shown or reported on Business Privilege Tax 8 Returns."

9 Section 4. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act, or the 10 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid, such 11 invalidity *shall* not affect any other provision or application of this Act 12 which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and 13 to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
