

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 12420 TO CHAPTER 12 OF PART 1, ARTICLE 4, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MILITARY LIMITED VOLUNTEER DENTAL LICENSE FOR DENTISTS LICENSED WITH THE GUAM-BASED MILITARY CREDENTIALING OFFICE TO ENABLE THEM TO VOLUNTEER IN THE CIVILIAN COMMUNITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan acknowledges that the military medical community has a long and proud continuing history on Guam beginning in August of 1899 with the arrival of the Medical Officer of the USS Yosemite, Surgeon Philip Leach, and Assistant Surgeons Mark V. Stone

1 and Alfred G. Grunwell. By 1940, one (1) dentist was among other healthcare

2 professionals assigned to the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam. Special acknowledgment

3 goes to Captain Joe Commette, former Commanding Officer of the Naval Dental

Center, who had an interest in history that piqued during his duties as the U.S.

Navy's Fiftieth (50th) Anniversary 1994 Golden Salute Commemoration Liaison

Officer. Veterans inundated him with artifacts when they came that year, making it

necessary to bring in a twenty (20)-foot container as the first "temporary" museum.

This legacy of military dental personnel working in the Guam community is marked with many significant events that built the camaraderie we experience today.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further acknowledges that the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) deems Guam as a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA). Though the island is currently not experiencing a critical shortage in dental professionals, a Department of Defense Inspector General audit report shows the upcoming transfer of Marines from Okinawa may impact the island's dental community.

Access to dental care by the indigent population is limited and often neglected by this patient population. The provision of simple screening exams has proved effective at early detection of oral cancers and other conditions. Early detection is important to successful outcomes. Therefore, the addition of volunteer military dentists to our community will greatly benefit the health of our people.

In recognition of the invaluable contributions made by our military health care system and the recognized need to increase the early detection of dental disease, it is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish an expedited Military Limited Volunteer Dental License within the Guam Board of Examiners. This license will be made available, at no cost, to a dentist who is authorized to treat personnel enlisted in a branch of the United States armed forces or veterans, and is

| 3 | Section 2. A new § 12420 is added to Article 4 of Part 1, Chapter 12, Title |
| 4 | 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read: |

| 6 | Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any |
| 7 | person or circumstance is found to be invalid, or contrary to law, such invalidity |
| 8 | shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect |
| 9 | without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this |
| 10 | Act are severable. |

11 Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon 12 enactment.
