


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



AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 61541(a)(5), 61541(b)(3), AND 61541(c)(3); TO REPEAL § 61542; AND TO ADD A NEW § 61541(e), ALL OF SUBARTICLE 5, ARTICLE 5, CHAPTER 61, DIVISION 2, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF POLITICAL SIGNS.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** § 61541(a)(5) of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2,
3 Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

4 “(5) Political signs that advocate voting for or against candidates, or
5 other matters to be considered by the electorate; provided, that such signs *shall*
6 *only* be posted on private property. If such private property is adjacent to any

1 roadway, political signs *shall* be at least eight (8) feet from the paved portion
2 of the roadway, and posted in such a manner that would *not* impede traffic or
3 a driver’s visibility. Political sign means all free-standing billboards, posters,
4 banners, or displays that advocate a candidate for political office or any matter
5 to be presented to the electorate for vote, and all items put on property to erect
6 or secure the billboard, poster, banner, or display in place, including rebars
7 and wires.”

8 **Section 2.** § 61541(b)(3) of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2,
9 Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

10 “(3) Political signs that advocate voting for or against candidates, or
11 other matters to be considered by the electorate; provided, that such signs *shall*
12 *only* be posted on private property. If such private property is adjacent to any
13 roadway, political signs *shall* be at least eight (8) feet from the paved portion
14 of the roadway, and posted in such a manner that would *not* impede traffic or
15 a driver’s visibility. Political sign means all free-standing billboards, posters,
16 banners, or displays that advocate a candidate for political office or any matter
17 to be presented to the electorate for vote, and all items put on property to erect
18 or secure the billboard, poster, banner, or display in place, including rebars
19 and wires.”

20 **Section 3.** § 61541(c)(3) of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2,
21 Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

22 “(3) Political signs that advocate voting for or against candidates, or
23 other matters to be considered by the electorate; provided, that such signs *shall*
24 *only* be posted on private property. If such private property is adjacent to any
25 roadway, political signs *shall* be at least eight (8) feet from the paved portion
26 of the roadway, and posted in such a manner that would *not* impede traffic or
27 a driver’s visibility. Political sign means all free-standing billboards, posters,

1 banners, or displays that advocate a candidate for political office or any matter
2 to be presented to the electorate for vote, and all items put on property to erect
3 or secure the billboard, poster, banner, or display in place, including rebars
4 and wires.”

5 **Section 4.** § 61542 of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2, Title
6 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *repealed*.

7 **Section 5.** A new § 61541(e) is *added* to Subarticle 5 of Article 5, Chapter
8 61, Division 2, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

9 “(e) The provisions of this Section *shall not* apply to any political sign
10 used in connection with roadside waving on property by person(s) who
11 actively attend said roadside waving.”
