1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that the threats upon our coral reefs, marine ecosystems, and precious resources
- 4 are diverse and vary in scale. Such threats range from local fishing pressures and

1	human and natural pollution impacts, to global drivers of climate change and
2	ocean acidification.
3	I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that such threats, if gone unchecked
4	and without proper mitigation, pose great harm to marine life, investments in
5	critical infrastructure, defenses, and the lives of the people who live in and rely
6	upon our coastal areas.
7	I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that such threats are too great to be
8	managed and addressed by any single agency of the government of Guam. I
9	Liheslaturan Guåhan acknowledges that marine resources are not easy to fence
10	off, monitor and regulate, and that such resources are common property and
11	available to all.
12	I Liheslaturan Guåhan resolves that the protection and management of
13	these resources requires the support and cooperation of the local community
14	through a participatory approach grounded in community-based management to
15	address the full range of biophysical, socioeconomic, and governance issues
16	facing our coastal villages.
17	Section 2. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Marine
18	Conservation Act of 2018."
19	Section 3. A new Subsection (cc) is hereby added to § 63101 of Article
20	1, Chapter 63, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
21	"(cc) Community-Based Fisheries Management - a system in which
22	fishermen and their communities exercise primary responsibility for
23	stewardship and fisheries management, to include taking part in the decision-

Section 4. A new § 63117.1 is hereby *added* to Article 1 of Chapter 63, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§ 63117.1. Purpose of Community-Based Fisheries Management.

The purpose of a community-based fisheries management strategy is to empower coastal resource communities to protect, preserve, manage, and conserve aquatic life, habitat, and marine communities and ecosystems, and to ensure the health, welfare and integrity of marine resources for current and future generations through a more holistic ecosystem-based management approach, which *shall* be consistent with this Chapter and 9 GAR Chapter 12 (Fishing Regulations).

The Director of the Department of Agriculture, Mayors, and Municipal Planning Councils *shall* have the authority to designate community-based fisheries managed areas and develop fisheries management plans, along with rules and regulations subject to the Administrative Adjudication Law, 5 GCA Chapter 9. Such rules and regulations may be revisited annually for any revisions to be made through the Administrative Adjudication Law process."

Section 5. A new § 63117.2 is hereby *added* to Article 1 of Chapter 63, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§ 63117.2. Humatak Fisheries Managed Area and Plan.

The Director the Department of Agriculture and the Director of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans *shall* provide the necessary technical assistance to the Mayor and Municipal Planning Council (MPC) of *Humatak* to designate *Humatak* Bay, inclusive of adjacent reef areas as identified by the Mayor and the MPC of *Humatak*, as a community-based *Humatak* fisheries managed area, as well as for the development of a community-based *Humatak* fisheries management plan, consistent with the *Humatak* Revitalization Plan, the

1	Southern Development Master Plan, and any other development plan
2	approved by the community of Humatak. The plan shall be due within twelve
3	(12) months upon enactment. The plan and any resulting rules and regulations
4	shall be in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law (5 GCA
5	Chapter 9) to carry out the provisions of this Section. Such rules and
6	regulations may be revisited annually for any revisions that need to be made
7	through the Administrative Adjudication Law process.
8	In the event a final plan is not produced within twelve (12) months following
9	the enactment of this Section, an interim report shall be produced at the end of said
10	twelve (12) month period, and every six (6) month period thereafter. The interim
11	report shall be transmitted to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan (the Guam

Section 6. A new § 63117.3 is hereby *added* to Article 1 of Chapter 63, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

Legislature) and the Bureau of Statistics and Plans."

"§ 63117.3. No Effect to Existing Designated Marine Preserve Areas on Guam.

Nothing in §§ 63117.1 or 63117.2 shall allow for any changes to existing designated Marine Preserves on Guam, as provided in 9 GAR Chapter 12."

Section 7. Any fisheries management plan authorized by this Act shall acknowledge that the Department of Agriculture and the Guam Police Department shall have full authority to enforce the laws of Guam within community-based fisheries.

Section 8. The fisheries management plans authorized by this Act *shall* specify who shall be granted access to monitor fish and coral stock, or assess the success of management goals in other ways, and *shall* provide that all data will be

- 1 shared with the relevant Municipal Planning Council, the Department of Agriculture,
- 2 the Bureau of Statistics and Plans, and the University of Guam Marine Lab.
- 3 Section 9. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to
- 4 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid, or contrary to law, such invalidity
- 5 shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
- 6 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 7 Act are severable.
- 8 Section 10. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon
- 9 enactment.
