AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT § 12212.1, AND TO REPEAL §§ 12212.2 AND 12212.3, ALL OF ARTICLE 2, PART 1, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING ACCESS TO PHYSICIANS' PROFESSIONAL PROFILES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that there is a need for patients to have access to professional information about
- 4 physicians licensed on Guam in order to make an informed decision when choosing

1	a medical care provider, and to further promote a culture of trust when selecting
2	healthcare professionals.
3	Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to require the Guam Board
4	of Medical Examiners to upgrade the information found on its website by providing
5	pertinent information on medical professionals it licenses on Guam.
6	Section 2. § 12212.1 of Article 2, Part 1, Chapter 12, Title 10, Guam Code
7	Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read:
8	"§ 12212.1. Public Disclosure of a Physician Profile.
9	(a) The Board shall establish and maintain a searchable website that
10	shall contain a separate profile page for all current and former licensees,
11	whether active or inactive.
12	(b) Current Status. The Board shall post on the profile page of the
13	licensee the following information on the current status of the licensee, along
14	with the full name and all aliases or other names ever used as reported by the
15	licensee pursuant to § 12205 of this Article:
16	(1) whether or not the licensee is presently in good standing;
17	(2) the current American Board of Medical Specialties
18	certification, or equivalent, as certified by the Board. No licensee
19	profile shall contain certification information or words that imply
20	certification (i.e., "board certified"), unless such certification has been
21	reviewed and verified by the Board; and
22	(3) any of the following enforcement actions or proceedings
23	to which the licensee is actively subjected:
24	(A) temporary restraining orders;
25	(B) interim suspension orders;
26	(C) revocations, suspensions, probations, or limitations
27	on practice ordered by the Board, or the board of another state or

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1	jurisdiction, including those made part of a probationary order or
2	stipulated agreement;
3	(D) current accusations filed by the Attorney General,
4	including those accusations that are on appeal. For purposes of
5	this paragraph, "current accusation" means an accusation that has
6	not been dismissed, withdrawn, or settled, and has not been
7	finally decided upon by the Board unless an appeal of that
8	decision is pending; or
9	(E) citations issued that have not been resolved or
10	appealed within thirty (30) days.
11	(c) Historical Information. The Board shall post on the profile page
12	of the licensee the following historical information in the Board's possession,
13	custody, or control:
14	(1) approved postgraduate training;
15	(2) any final revocations and suspensions, or other equivalent
16	actions, taken against the licensee by the Board, or the board of another
17	state or jurisdiction, or the surrender of a license by the licensee in
18	relation to a disciplinary action or investigation, including the operative
19	accusation resulting in the license surrender or discipline by the Board;
20	(3) probation or other equivalent action ordered by the Board,
21	or the board of another state or jurisdiction, completed or terminated,
22	including the operative accusation resulting in discipline by the Board;
23	(4) any felony convictions; provided, that upon receipt of a
24	certified copy of an expungement order, the Board shall, within six (6)
25	months of receipt of the expungement order, post notification of the
26	expungement order and the date thereof on its website;

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(5) misdemeanor convictions resulting in a disciplinary action or accusation that is not subsequently withdrawn or dismissed; provided, that upon receipt of a certified copy of an expungement order from a licensee, the Board *shall*, within six (6) months of receipt of the expungement order, post notification of the expungement order and the date thereof on its website;

- (6) civil judgments issued in any amount, whether or not vacated by a settlement after entry of the judgment, that were not reversed on appeal, and arbitration awards issued in any amount, for a claim or action for damages for death or personal injury caused by the physician and surgeon's negligence, error, or omission in practice, or by his or her rendering of unauthorized professional services;
- (7) except as provided in subparagraphs (A) and (B) of this paragraph, a summary of any final hospital disciplinary actions that resulted in the termination or revocation of a licensee's hospital staff privileges for a medical disciplinary cause or reason. The posting *shall* provide any additional explanatory or exculpatory information submitted by the licensee.
 - (A) If a licensee's hospital staff privileges are restored and the licensee notifies the Board of the restoration, the information pertaining to the termination or revocation of those privileges *shall* remain posted on the website for a period of ten (10) years from the restoration date of the privileges, and at the end of that period *shall* be removed.
 - (B) If a court finds, in a final judgment, that a hospital disciplinary action was conducted in bad faith and the licensee notifies the Board of that finding, the information concerning that

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hospital disciplinary action posted on the website *shall* be immediately removed;

(8) public letters of reprimand issued within the past ten (10) years by the Board, or the board of another state or jurisdiction, including the operative accusation, if any, resulting in discipline by the Board;

- (9) citations issued within the last three (3) years that have been resolved by payment of the administrative fine or compliance with the order of abatement.
- (10) All settlements within the last five (5) years in the possession, custody, or control of the Board *shall* be disclosed if there are four (4) or more settlements for that licensee within the last five (5) years.
 - (A) For the purposes of this paragraph, "settlement" means a settlement in an amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) or more of any claim or action for damages for death or personal injury caused by the physician and surgeon's negligence, error, or omission in practice, or by his or her rendering of unauthorized professional services.
 - (B) For the purposes of this paragraph, "settlement" does not include a settlement by a licensee, regardless of the amount paid, when (i) the settlement is made as a part of the settlement of a class claim; (ii) the amount paid in settlement of the class claim is the same amount paid by the other licensees in the same class or similarly situated licensees in the same class; and (iii) the settlement was paid in the context of a case for which

1	the complaint that alleged class liability on behalf of the licensee
2	also alleged a products liability class action cause of action.
3	(C) The Board shall not disclose the actual dollar
4	amount of a settlement, but shall disclose settlement information
5	by doing the following:
6	(i) comparing the settlement amount to the
7	experience of other licensees within the same specialty or
8	subspecialty, indicating if it is below average, average, or
9	above average for the most recent ten (10)-year period;
10	(ii) reporting the number of years the licensee has
11	been in practice; and
12	(iii) reporting the total number of licensees in that
13	specialty or subspecialty, the number of those who have
14	entered into a settlement agreement, and the percentage
15	that number represents of the total number of licensees in
16	the specialty or subspecialty.
17	(11) Appropriate disclaimers and explanatory statements shall
18	be developed by the Board to accompany any information disclosed
19	under paragraphs (1) through (10) of this subsection.
20	(d) Optional Disclosures. The Board shall post on the profile page
21	the following optional information upon request by the licensee:
22	(1) addresses and telephone numbers of the offices maintained
23	by the practitioner;
24	(2) office hours regularly maintained by the practitioner;
25	(3) affiliations with hospitals or clinics;
26	(4) whether a licensee provides services under a specified
27	private or public insurance plan, or health care plan;

1	(5) languages, other than English, fluently spoken by the
2	practitioner or a person in the practitioner's office;
3	(6) an otherwise lawful image of the licensee;
4	(7) names of schools or postgraduate clinical training
5	programs from which the practitioner has graduated, together with the
6	degrees received;
7	(8) publications authored by the practitioner; and
8	(9) teaching positions currently or formerly held by the
9	practitioner, together with pertinent dates.
10	The Board shall develop and provide appropriate disclaimers and
11	explanatory statements to accompany any of the information disclosed under
12	paragraphs (1) through (9) of this subsection.
13	(e) Web Links. The Board shall provide links to websites that
14	provide information on board certifications. The Board may also provide links
15	to any other websites that provide information on the affiliations of licensed
16	physicians and surgeons. The Board may provide links to other websites that
17	provide information on health care service plans, health insurers, hospitals, or
18	other facilities.
19	(f) Funding. The Board shall be authorized to utilize funds collected
20	from licensees through application fees, licensing fees, or other fees, for the
21	purpose of developing and maintaining the website established under this
22	Section; provided, that the website is developed and maintained pursuant to
23	the requirements of this Section.
24	(g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Board shall
25	disclose to an inquiring member of the public within four (4) working days,
26	by traditional or electronic means, any information made publicly available
27	under subsections (a) through (d)."
