

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 15 TO TITLE 2 OF GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE GUAM COUNCIL ON CLIMATE CHANGE PREPAREDNESS AND RESILIENCY (GUAM C<sup>3</sup>PR).

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that the impacts of climate change on the people and island of Guam will continue
- 4 to require a coordinated response by the government of Guam from all branches of
- 5 government, and that such policy had been adopted by the United States Government

1	pursuant to President Barack H. Obama's Executive Order 13653 on preparing the			
2	United States for impacts of climate change.			
3	I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Governor Edward J.B. Calvo was			
4	named to the State, Local and Tribal Leaders Task Force on Climate Preparedness			
5	and Resilience, which was created pursuant to Presidential Executive Order 13653			
6	and established in the June 2013 Report of the Executive Office of the President			
7	The President's Climate Action Plan. Subsequent to such appointment, Governor			
8	Calvo signed Executive Order No. 2015-08, which established the Guam Climate			
9	Change Task Force and the Climate Change Advisory Committee such that the			
10	government of Guam could begin system-wide coordination and long-range			
11	planning efforts to mitigate the potential adverse environmental and socioeconomic			
12	impacts of climate change.			
13	I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that on March 28, 2017, President Donald			
14	J. Trump signed an Executive Order (Trump Executive Order) that rescinded certain			
15	energy and climate-related Presidential and regulatory actions and reports approved			
16	by the President Barack H. Obama administration, such as:			
17	(a) Executive Order 13653 of November 1, 2013 (Preparing the			
18	United States for the Impacts of Climate Change);			
19	(b) the Presidential Memorandum of June 25, 2013 (Power Sector			
20	Carbon Pollution Standards);			
21	(c) the Presidential Memorandum of November 3, 2015 (Mitigating			
22	Impacts on Natural Resources from Development and Encouraging Related			
23	Private Investment);			
24	(d) the Presidential Memorandum of September 21, 2016 (Climate			
25	Change and National Security);			
26	(e) the Report of the Executive Office of the President of June 2013			
27	(The President's Climate Action Plan); and			

1 (f) the Report of the Executive Office of the President of March 2 2014 (Climate Action Plan Strategy to Reduce Methane Emissions). 3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that notwithstanding the Trump 4 Executive Order that rescinded the President Obama climate change policies, I 5 Liheslaturan Guåhan continues to support I Maga'låhi's Executive Order No. 2015-6 08 and recognizes the importance of preparing and planning for, as well as 7 mitigating, the adverse impacts climate change will have on the people and island of 8 Guam. 9 Therefore, I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends on continuing to support the efforts 10 of I Maga'låhi's Guam Climate Change Task Force and Climate Change Advisory 11 Committee through the creation of the Guam Council on Climate Change 12 Preparedness and Resiliency as a policy-recommending body of I Liheslaturan 13 Guåhan to further craft policy and legislation to ensure that focus is placed on 14 addressing the adverse impacts of climate change on the island and people of Guam. 15 Section 2. Authority. Government of Guam agencies and departments, including autonomous 24 25 entities, shall make available to the Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR in a timely manner such data and 26 technical support as is necessary for it to perform its duties as provided in this

Chapter. The Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR shall be authorized to:

- (a) receive, compile, and examine the records and work products of the Task Force and the Advisory Committee created pursuant to Executive Order 2015-08;
  - (b) request, receive, and examine reports, data, and information from government of Guam departments and agencies, including autonomous agencies, relating to fiscal, environmental, and socioeconomic impacts of climate change on the people and island of Guam in association with the duties set forth in this Chapter;
  - (c) solicit information and advice from various sources on the technical and scientific impacts of climate change on a local, regional, national, and international level;
  - (d) meet from time to time pursuant to this Chapter, as determined by the Chairperson, to execute its duties; and
  - (e) create and establish subcommittees as deemed appropriate to facilitate the work of the Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR.

### § 15107. Administration.

For administrative purposes, clerical support, and necessary funding, the Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR *shall* be accommodated as necessary by *I Liheslatura*.

### § 15108. Conduct of Meetings, Quorum.

The Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR *shall* meet quarterly to discuss and assess the progress of providing recommendations to *I Liheslatura*. A simple majority of the members of the Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR *shall* constitute a quorum to do business, and any action taken by the Guam C<sup>3</sup>PR *shall* be by a simple majority of the members present.

### § 15109. Severability.

If any provision of this Chapter or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid, or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Chapter that can be given effect without

- the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Chapter are severable."
- 3 Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
- Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid, or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
- 7 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 8 Act are severable.
