





AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 9301(g), (h), AND (i) OF ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 9, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO INCREASING PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** Subsections (g), (h), and (i) of § 9301 of Article 3, Chapter 9,
3 Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, are *amended* to read:

4 “(g) The provisions of this Section are also applicable to any
5 department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality of the

1 government of Guam, which is proposing to impose or increase any fee for
2 service.

3 (h) An economic impact statement *shall* be produced by the
4 department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality of the
5 government of Guam which has proposed the rule, regulation, fee, or increase
6 of fees for services.

7 (i) Exemptions. Any proposed rule, change of rule, regulation or
8 request to impose or raise fees or rates *shall* be exempted from the economic
9 impact statement requirements of Subsections (d), (e), (f), (g), and (h) of this
10 Section if the annual economic impact to the general public is Five Hundred
11 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) or less, as determined by a preliminary cost
12 impact assessment performed by the Bureau of Budget and Management
13 Research, or the department, agency, autonomous agency, office or
14 instrumentality proposing the rule, change of rule, regulation or request to
15 impose or raise fees. The preliminary cost impact assessment must be
16 completed and made available to the public prior to any required hearings on
17 the proposed rules or regulations, and must be transmitted to *I Liheslatura* (the
18 Legislature) as part of the agency record.”
