Bill No. 306-35 adds feral pigs to the statutory list of unprotected animals and removes administrative regulations requiring licenses to take feral pigs. It is now known as Public Law No. 35-106.

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that there has been an explosion in the population of feral pigs to levels that are

1	unsafe and unsusta	ınable	. Feral pigs are an invasive species that are a threat to public		
2	safety and the env	ironm	ent. Not only have feral pigs been found to cause physical		
3	harm to people ar	nd proj	perty in our community, but feral pigs also feed on local		
4	farmers' crops as	well as	s on many native species of plants that must be protected.		
5	Furthermore, feral	pigs'	consumption of many root plants prevents these plants from		
6	retaining soil. Thi	s incre	eases erosion, causing sediment to runoff into our oceans,		
7	choking out our co	ral fro	m much-needed sunlight and exacerbating coral bleaching.		
8	The increased sedimentation contributes to fish kill events.				
9	I Liheslatur	ran G	uåhan further finds that feral pigs are not listed as an		
10	unprotected specie	es, pro	viding a barrier for the community to take action for the		
11	extraction or culling	ng of f	eral pigs, whether it be individuals on their private property		
12	or people contracted as a form of pest control.				
13	I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that because of the danger feral pigs cause, fees				
14	for their trapping are not beneficial for our community and should be removed.				
15	Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to place feral pigs on the				
16	unprotected specie	es list a	and to eliminate restrictions and fees for their capture; and,		
17	to ban the release	of pigs	s, both domesticated and feral, in the hopes of reducing this		
18	threat to public sa	fety an	d our natural environment.
