Re: Bill No. 408-35 (COR) – An Act to Amend § 4401(c) of Article 4, Chapter 4, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated, and to Amend § 40.50(a) of Chapter 40, Title 8, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Expanding the Powers of the Superior Court of Guam Magistrates to Include the Authority to Preside Over Additional Non-Dispositive Hearings and to Modify Bail Conditions

Dear Madame Speaker:

The job of ensuring that justice is fairly, efficiently, and effectively dispensed is the primary responsibility of our third, co-equal branch of government, the Judiciary. As a community, we welcome efforts to ensure that the Judiciary is equipped with the necessary tools to achieve this goal. This slight expansion to the powers and duties of the magistrates, to allow them to preside over non-dispositive motions proceedings, issue search and arrest warrants, take grand jury returns and solemnize marriages, will assist the Judiciary in managing its growing docket. In the more immediate term, it will assist with dispensing of any backlog that has resulted from temporary suspensions of proceedings while Guam has dealt with the public health emergency presented by COVID-19. For all these reasons, I have signed Bill No. 408-35 into law as **Public Law No. 35-113**.





AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 4401(c) OF ARTICLE 4, CHAPTER 4, TITLE 7, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND TO *AMEND* § 40.50(a) OF CHAPTER 40, TITLE 8, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE POWERS OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OF GUAM MAGISTRATES TO INCLUDE THE AUTHORITY TO PRESIDE OVER ADDITIONAL NON-DISPOSITIVE HEARINGS AND TO MODIFY BAIL CONDITIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent and Findings. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds

that there are certain non-dispositive hearings over which Superior Court judges

1 currently preside which are appropriate for a magistrate to decide. The expansion of
2 the statutory authority of the magistrates of the Superior Court of Guam will provide
3 the courts with an efficient supplemental judicial resource to assist in expediting its
4 workload.

5 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to expand the powers of
6 the Superior Court of Guam magistrates to allow them to perform additional duties,
7 such as disposing of pretrial matters, issuing search warrants and warrants of arrest,
8 performing marriages, and hearing bail redetermination motions. This additional
9 authority will allow Superior Court judges to preside over criminal trials more
10 efficiently and effectively and ensure the timely and fair adjudication of all matters
11 before the Superior Court of Guam.

12 **Section 2.** § 4401(c) of Article 4, Chapter 4, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated,
13 is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

14 “(c) As assigned by the Chief Justice, a magistrate *shall*:

15 (1) preside over and render decisions and judgments in small
16 claims cases, traffic cases, change of name petitions, and collection
17 cases, and may grant uncontested divorces in cases where there is a
18 notarized consent on file;

19 (2) enter judgment upon confession of judgment or default
20 judgment in a civil case when a party alleges a sum certain is due;

21 (3) preside over post-judgment collection proceedings in civil
22 cases and restitution judgments in criminal cases, and issue writs of
23 execution and other orders in such proceedings;

24 (4) preside over first appearances of criminal defendants and
25 arraignments in criminal cases, set or modify bail and order pre-trial
26 release conditions or detention, take pleas, including accepting guilty

1 pleas in misdemeanor cases, sentencing misdemeanants, and entering
2 judgments accordingly;

3 (5) issue summons, issue bench warrants, and hear return of
4 warrants in all cases;

5 (6) preside over any matters which may be heard by a Referee
6 of the Superior Court of Guam;

7 (7) serve as a Special Master upon appointment by the
8 Presiding Judge;

9 (8) serve as Judge *Pro Tempore* upon appointment by the
10 Chief Justice;

11 (9) serve as a settlement judge in a civil or domestic case upon
12 appointment by the Presiding Judge;

13 (10) conduct criminal trial setting hearings;

14 (11) preside over preliminary hearings in criminal cases, and
15 render decisions and judgments over procedural and discovery motions
16 in criminal matters;

17 (12) preside over initial scheduling conferences in civil
18 matters, to include, but not limited to: initial pretrial conferences, case
19 scheduling, discovery disputes, motions, and settlement efforts;

20 (13) preside over unlawful detainer proceedings;

21 (14) hear and determine any pretrial matter, other than case
22 dispositive motions, and preside over status hearings in all matters;

23 (15) issue search warrants and issue arrest warrants in all cases;

24 (16) take grand jury returns; and

25 (17) solemnize marriages.”

26 **Section 3.** § 40.50(a) of Chapter 40, Title 8, Guam Code Annotated, is
27 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

1 “(a) A person for whom conditions of release are imposed pursuant
2 to this Chapter, and who after twenty-four (24) hours from the time of release
3 hearing continues to be detained as a result of his inability to meet the
4 conditions of release, shall, upon application, be entitled to have the
5 conditions reviewed by the Court. The conditions are to be reviewed by the
6 judge or magistrate who imposed them, or by another judge. Unless the
7 conditions of release are amended and the person is thereupon released, the
8 judge or magistrate shall set forth in writing the reasons for requiring the
9 conditions imposed.”

10 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
