

AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 9141 AND *ADD NEW* §§ 9142(c), 9142(d), AND 9143(d), ALL OF CHAPTER 9, TITLE 22, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE COMPOSITION OF THE WORKERS’ COMPENSATION COMMISSION AND ALLOWING THE APPEARANCE AND PARTICIPATION OF COMMISSION MEMBERS AT MEETINGS AND HEARINGS BY TELEPHONE CONFERENCE OR VIDEO TELECONFERENCE OR LIVESTREAM.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** § 9141 of Chapter 9, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
3 *amended* to read:

1 **“§ 9141. Administration.**

2 (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided, the Workers’
3 Compensation Commission *shall* administer the provisions of this Title, and
4 for such purpose the Commission is authorized: (1) to make rules and
5 regulations in conformance with this Title; (2) to select such technical
6 assistants, medical advisors, and other officers and employees; and (3) to
7 make from appropriated funds such expenditures (including expenditures for
8 personal services, rent, law books, books of reference, periodicals and
9 printing, binding and other necessities) as may be necessary in the
10 administration of this Title.

11 (b) The Workers’ Compensation Commission *shall* be under the
12 cognizance of the Department of Labor and *shall* consist of the Commissioner
13 or the Commissioner’s designee; six (6) members to be appointed by *I*
14 *Maga’håga* (the Governor) to include:

15 (1) one (1) member appointed from a list of three (3) nurse
16 practitioners or registered nurses recommended by the Guam Board of
17 Nurse Examiners;

18 (2) one (1) member appointed from a list of three (3) medical
19 doctors recommended by the Guam Board of Medical Examiners;

20 (3) one (1) member appointed from a list of three (3) attorneys
21 recommended by the Guam Bar Association;

22 (4) one (1) member appointed from a list of three (3) human
23 resource practitioners recommended by the predominant Guam civic
24 organization for human resources professionals;

25 (5) one (1) government of Guam employee; and

26 (6) one (1) member of a labor union; and

1 (7) at the Director's option, two (2) members from the
2 general public. At all times, the total number of members *shall* be
3 an odd number.

4 (c) Quorum *shall* constitute at least four (4) members of the
5 Commission.

6 (1) A member of the Commission, if physically unable to
7 attend a meeting or hearing, may appear and participate in a meeting or
8 hearing via telephone conference or video teleconference or video
9 livestreaming in accordance with 5 GCA § 43122 and the
10 accompanying rules and regulations adopted pursuant to the same;
11 provided, that all parties in the meeting or hearing are able to adequately
12 hear and communicate with such member. All relevant documents *shall*
13 be transmitted to all members of the Commission at least twenty-four
14 (24) hours prior to a hearing via telephone conference or video
15 teleconference or video livestreaming.

16 (2) Meetings and hearings *shall* be electronically recorded in
17 audio file or audio and video file format if conducted by video
18 teleconference or video livestream; but, notwithstanding any other
19 provision of law, rule, or regulation, they *need not* be stenographically
20 recorded. All audio and video files *shall* be properly stored within the
21 office of the Commission to ensure safekeeping and availability to the
22 public consistent with existing laws.

23 (d) The Commission *shall* maintain and keep open during
24 reasonable business hours, an office for the transaction of business. If any
25 member of the Commission is removed from office or for any reason ceases
26 to act as a member, all of his or her official records and papers *shall* be
27 transferred to his or her successor in office or to the Commission. No member

1 nor any business associate of a member shall appear as attorney in any
2 proceedings under this Title, and no member shall act in any such case in
3 which he or she is interested, or when he or she is employed by any party in
4 interest or related to any party in interest by consanguinity or affinity within
5 the third degree as determined by the common law. Members of the
6 Commission, except the Commissioner, *shall* receive Fifty Dollars (\$50) per
7 meeting or hearing attended, *not to exceed* One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per
8 month, and reimbursed for any reasonable expenses incurred in the
9 performance of their duty.

10 (e) The Commission *shall* direct the vocational rehabilitation of
11 permanently disabled employees and *shall* arrange with the appropriate public
12 or private agencies for such education. The Commission may in its discretion
13 furnish such prosthetic appliances or other apparatus made necessary by an
14 injury upon which an award has been made under this Title to render a
15 disabled employee fit to engage in a remunerative occupation.”

16 **Section 2.** A new § 9142(c) is hereby *added* to Chapter 9, Title 22, Guam
17 Code Annotated, to read:

18 “(c) Civil Penalties. The Commission *shall* impose a civil penalty of
19 *not less than* Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) and *not more than* Twenty-
20 five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), per violation, on any employer found in
21 violation of the statutory obligations required in this Chapter or any applicable
22 administrative rules and regulations, unless the statute requires criminal
23 penalties, in which case the Commission *shall* investigate the matter,
24 document its findings and refer the matter to the Office of the Attorney
25 General for prosecution. The employer may appeal any assessed civil
26 penalties within fifteen (15) calendar days from the issuance of a Notice of
27 Violation to the Commissioner who *shall* be the Hearing Officer.”

1 **Section 3.** A new § 9142(d) is hereby *added* to Chapter 9, Title 22, Guam
2 Code Annotated, to read:

3 “(d) Notwithstanding Subsection (c) of this Section, all civil penalties
4 enumerated under this Chapter *shall* remain in full force and effect.”

5 **Section 4.** A new § 9143(d) is hereby *added* to Chapter 9, Title 22, Guam
6 Code Annotated, to read:

7 “(d) Disposition of Civil Penalties. Fines collected by the Department
8 under the provisions of this Chapter *shall* be deposited in the special fund,
9 pursuant to this Section; and, notwithstanding Subsection (b) of this Section,
10 may be accessed by the Director to be used exclusively for the operation of
11 the Workers’ Compensation Commission. The Director of the Department
12 *shall* include data in his or her annual report on all expenditures under this
13 Subsection to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.”

14 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

15 **Section 6. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any
16 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall*
17 *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
18 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
19 severable.
