Re: Veto of Bill 259-35 (COR), "An Act to Amend § 13106 and Add a New § 13106.1 to Chapter 13 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Permanent and Temporary Vacancies in the Municipal Offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor; And to Amend §§ 40110, 40124, and 40127 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Filling Vacancies of Mayors, the Establishment of a Municipal Planning Council (MPC) Within Each District of Guam, and Filling Vacancies in the MPC"

Dear Madame Speaker:

I agree with your legislative counsel and I am therefore exercising my executive responsibility to veto Bill 259-35. There are provisions of this bill that encroach upon the core functions of the Executive branch. And I am unwilling to sign any legislation into law that compromises the delicate balance between the three branches of government.

For nearly four months now, the village of Yona has been able to address the needs of its people with the help of the Mayors' Council of Guam. And although it has done so without the physical presence of a mayor, this is a unique issue that can be addressed. Bill 259-35 is the Legislature's attempt to address this issue. While I understand the desire to do the right thing, the right thing must also be done the right way. That is the central reason for this veto.

In fact, prior to 2013, Guam's laws provided a sound and organic process towards filling vacancies in the municipal offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor. This process was used several times and

provided Guam's villages with strong and reputable leaders in the interim. With this letter, I am transmitting a bill which proposes that we utilize the process that has so effectively served our villages in the past. I hope that the Legislature will agree with this view and consider my proposal in its next session.

Mayors and Vice Mayors *shall* be filled for the unexpired term by a majority vote of the Municipal Planning Council of the municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature).

- (b) Mayors. If by reason of death, resignation, removal from office, inability or failure to perform, as determined by the Guam Election Commission, there *shall* be a vacancy in the office of the Mayor *less than* two hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors:
 - (1) it *shall* be filled by the Vice Mayor in a municipality where there is a Vice Mayor, and there *shall* be a vacancy in the position of Vice Mayor until the end of the term; or
 - (2) if there is no Vice Mayor and the vacancy is *less than* two hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors, the vacancy for the remaining term *shall* be filled by a majority vote of the Municipal Planning Council of the municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature); or
 - (3) if the Municipal Planning Council is not established within the municipality, the Executive Director of the Mayors Council of Guam *shall* be appointed to serve as the Acting Mayor of said municipality for up to ninety (90) calendar days. The Acting Mayor *shall* nominate members to establish the Municipal Planning Council of said municipality who *shall* be approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Mayors Council of Guam."

The occurrence of any event under (a) through (i) (j), with respect to a person or persons elected to office, after the election but before the term of office is to commence, constitutes a vacancy on the date the term commences, unless the person or persons so elected is the incumbent, in which case, the vacancy occurs on the date of such event."

Section 2. A new § 13106.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 13 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§ 13106.1 Temporary Vacancy.

If there is a temporary vacancy greater than (30) days in the office of Mayor, caused by other than official business, and there is no Vice Mayor, the vacancy shall be filled by the Governor by appointment after soliciting the non-binding recommendations of the Municipal Planning Council of the municipality."

Section 3. §40110 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

"§ 40110. Permanent Vacancies.

- (a) Vice Mayors. A vacancy in the office of the Vice Mayor *less than* two hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors shall be filled for the unexpired term by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* (The Governor) by appointment after soliciting the non-binding recommendations of a majority vote of the municipal planning council of the municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature).
- (b) Mayors. If by reason of death, resignation, removal from office, inability or failure to perform, there shall be a vacancy in the office of the Mayor, it shall be filled for the unexpired term. less than two hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors, it shall be filled by the Vice Mayor in a municipality where there is a Vice Mayor, and there shall be a vacancy in the position of Vice Mayor until the end of the term. In a municipality where there is no Vice Mayor and the vacancy is less than 240 days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors, the vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of the Municipal Planning Council of the

municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of I Liheslatura (The Legislature)." The vacancy shall be filled by I Maga'hågan Guåhan (the Governor) by appointment after soliciting the non-binding recommendations of the Municipal Planning Council of the municipality in which the vacancy occurred, subject to the advice and consent of I Liheslatura (the Legislature), provided, however, that in a municipality where there is a Vice -Mayor, the Vice-Mayor shall automatically assume the position of Mayor and there shall be a vacancy in the position of Vice-Mayor.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable."
