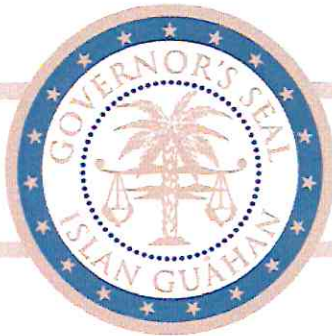

Re: (VETOED) Bill No. 215-35 (COR) - An Act to Amend § 6301(b) of Article 3, Chapter 6, Division 1, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Maximum Limits of Governmental Liability

Dear Madame Speaker:

Bill No. 215-35 seeks to increase the recovery cap on the government's liability for tort claims, a 100% increase on the limits on wrongful death damages, and a 67% increase on the limits in any other tort action. Since the last adjustment to this cap in 1983, our government has broadened the regulatory and service activities it has made available to the public. While protecting our citizens and providing avenues to recovery for legitimate claims is important, it is vital to our continued ability to provide these important services that reasonable limitations on liability continue to apply, particularly with regard to health care services provided during the COVID-19 pandemic. Unless substantial funding is made available to support Bill No. 215-35, an increase of potential liability of hundreds of thousands of dollars, would gravely disrupt our government's ability to provide important services and threaten the continued viability of critical programs. For these reasons, I must veto this bill.

**AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 6301(b) OF ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER
6, DIVISION 1, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED,
RELATIVE TO MAXIMUM LIMITS OF
GOVERNMENTAL LIABILITY.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
that the “Medical Malpractice Reform Act of 1975” was enacted by Public Law 13-
116 on December 24, 1975, which limited claims against the government of Guam
to Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) in an action for wrongful death, and not

1 more than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in any other tort action. The
2 Government Claims Act was later repealed and re-enacted by the Seventeenth (17th)
3 Guam Legislature through Public Law 17-29 on November 9, 1983. Public Law 17-
4 29 increased the limits on claims against the government of Guam by sixty-five
5 percent (65%) or One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in an action for
6 wrongful death, and by sixty-seven percent (67%) or Three Hundred Thousand
7 Dollars (\$300,000) in any other tort action. Historically, “The tort limitations [were]
8 raised to take into account inflation, increased court awards and the needs of the
9 victims of the torts.” 5 GCA § 6301, Comment GC § 6500.13.

10 *I Liheslatura* also finds that the current limits of governmental liability have
11 not been adjusted for nearly forty (40) years and the limits fail to adequately
12 recognize that the cost of health insurance, legal defense and court fees, and other
13 goods and services have continued to increase.

14 Consistent with the actions of its predecessors, it is, therefore, the intent of *I*
15 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* to account for inflation and increase the current limits on
16 claims against the government of Guam to Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
17 (\$200,000) for wrongful death, and Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) in
18 any other tort action.

19 **Section 2.** § 6301(b) of Article 3, Chapter 6, Division 1, Title 5, Guam Code
20 Annotated, is *amended* to read:

21 “(b) The government of Guam, in the case of line agencies, shall be
22 liable in tort for not more than Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) in
23 an action for wrongful death, nor for more than Five Hundred Thousand
24 Dollars (\$500,000) in any other tort action.”

25 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment, and
26 the provisions of this Act shall be given retroactive application to any claim which

has accrued, is pending, or on appeal at the time of enactment which is not otherwise time barred by the applicable statute of limitations.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
