**AN ACT TO CANCEL THE 2020 PRIMARY ELECTION  
AND ALLOW ALL QUALIFIED CANDIDATES FOR THE  
2020 PRIMARY ELECTION TO ADVANCE TO THE 2020  
GENERAL ELECTION.**

1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds  
3 that the 2020 Primary Election consists of contests for mayoral and vice mayoral  
4 seats in nine (9) of the nineteen (19) villages, and the elimination of one (1)  
5 congressional candidate. With the COVID-19 pandemic still a concerning public  
6 health issue, it is vital that the government of Guam seek all options for minimizing  
7 large social gatherings and reducing the exposure of the disease. While no one can  
8 discount the fundamental rights and importance in holding elections, by canceling  
9 the 2020 Primary Election, all candidates and contests would advance to the General  
10 Election in November 2020, providing the government of Guam with additional time  
11 to plan and implement safety measures. Further, this Act would save the government  
12 of Guam an estimated Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000).

13           **Section 2. Cancellation of the 2020 Primary Election.**

14           Notwithstanding any other provision of law, or rule or regulation, the 2020

1 Primary Election shall be canceled, and all qualified candidates for the 2020 Primary  
2 Election shall advance to the 2020 General Election.

3 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any  
4 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall  
5 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without  
6 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are  
7 severable.

8 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
