AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000) FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION FOR CONTINUED OPERATION OF THE GUAM AUTISM CENTER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 3 that a Guam Autism Center was authorized pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 33-227. I Liheslaturan Guåhan appropriated One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 4 5 (\$150,000) to the Department of Administration for the non-profit organization, 6 HunterSpeaks, in Fiscal Year 2018 pursuant to Chapter V, Section 1(g)(12) of Public Law 34-42, as an initial investment by the government of Guam to set up the Guam 7 8 Autism Center, prior to the establishment of the DISID Business Center and One 9 Stop Community Resource and Wellness Center. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that in early November 2018, the Guam 10 11 Autism Center has taken in its first group of clients and has begun billing health 12 insurance providers under the *Hunter's Law of 2017* (Public Law 34-06) as a means 13 of long-term sustainability. Initial seed funding has been utilized to cover the cost of 14 training technicians, recruitment and operational costs. However, it may take

- approximately two (2) years before the Guam Autism Center is completely self-
- 2 funded; and, seed funding will run out by April 2019. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further
- 3 finds that the services provided by the HunterSpeaks non-profit organization for the
- 4 Guam Autism Center are vital to the quality of life of children living with autism
- 5 spectrum disorder in our community.
- 6 It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to appropriate additional
- 7 funding to ensure the continuation of vital autism services provided by the
- 8 HunterSpeaks non-profit organization.
- 9 Section 2. Appropriation. The sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand
- Dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from any excess General Fund revenues in FY
- 11 2019 to the Department of Administration (DOA) for the Guam Autism Center,
- operated by the HunterSpeaks non-profit organization in Fiscal Year 2019. This
- appropriation *shall* be used by the government of Guam to provide payment for
- 14 autism spectrum disorder services, training, and operation of the Guam Autism
- 15 Center, and *shall not* be transferred, used, or expended for any other purpose than
- what is specified in this Act.
- 17 Section 3. Reporting Requirement. The HunterSpeaks non-profit
- organization shall submit a status report every ninety (90) days to the Speaker of I
- 19 Liheslaturan Guåhan on the utilization of funds appropriated by this Act until such
- 20 funds are fully expended.
