





**AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 7120 OF CHAPTER 7, TITLE 7,
GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE PRESER-
VATION AND DISPOSITION OF COURT RECORDS.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Intent.** It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to
3 provide that the appropriate disposition and preservation of court records be
4 governed by court rules and policies promulgated by the Supreme Court of Guam,
5 and any laws that apply specifically to certain types of cases and/or certain types of
6 court records.

7 **Section 2.** § 7120 of Chapter 7, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
8 *amended* to read as follows:

1 **“§ 7120. Copying and Disposition of Court Records.**

2 (a) The clerk of the Superior Court and of the Supreme Court,
3 respectively, may cause any record, paper, or document in their care and
4 custody, to be photographed, microphotographed, or otherwise reproduced on
5 film or in digitized form. The storage media shall be durable and the document
6 as recorded shall be one which accurately reproduces the original thereof in
7 all material details.

8 (b) Such photograph, or microphotograph, or digitized reproduction
9 shall be deemed to be an original record for all purposes, including
10 introduction in evidence in all courts or administrative agencies. A transcript,
11 exemplification, facsimile, or certified copy thereof shall, for all purposes
12 recited herein, be deemed to be a transcript, exemplification, facsimile, or
13 certified copy of the original record.

14 (c) Such photograph, or microphotograph, or reproduction shall be
15 placed in safe, conveniently accessible files, or in safe computer storage, and
16 the clerk shall make provisions for preserving the same, and for the public’s
17 examining, copying, and using of the same. The original record, paper, or
18 document shall be preserved or disposed of in accordance with court rules of
19 court and policies promulgated by the Supreme Court of Guam and applicable
20 law.

21 (d) The Supreme Court of Guam may promulgate rules to effectuate
22 this Section; provided, that any existing rule promulgated by the Supreme
23 Court of Guam shall be deemed to be in compliance with this Section and no
24 additional rules need to be promulgated to enforce this Section.”
