WHEREAS, Joseph "Joe" Blas Peredo became a CHamoru teacher in 1986 to promote and perpetuate the CHamoru language and culture through future generations. In 1990, he was the music choreographer for the CHamoru dance group, "Paraisu"; and by 1991, he had released two (2) CHamoru albums, entitled: "Ayuda I Famagu'on-ta" and "Ta Fandanña"; and

WHEREAS, Joseph "Joe" Blas Peredo was closely involved with "Nasion CHamoru," a well-known CHamoru organization who were advocates for land return, decolonization, and CHamoru rights; and
