1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN;

3 WHEREAS, the State Partnership Program is a Joint Department of Defense 4 security cooperation program that began in 1993 and is administered by the National 5 Guard Bureau. It seeks to link a State's National Guard with a partner nation's 6 military, security forces, and disaster response organizations in a cooperative, 7 mutually beneficial relationship. It is a crucial US security cooperation tool, 8 facilitating cooperation across all aspects of international civil-military affairs and 9 encouraging people-to-people ties at the state level; and

10 WHEREAS, Guam and the Philippines have had a significant long-term 11 military relationship that has strengthen alliances, enhance interoperability, reassure allies, deter adversaries, and build partner capacity to meet emerging challenges
 across the spectrum of military operations through the State Partnership Program; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the 20th Anniversary of Guam and the Philippines state partnership. Beginning in 2001, the Guam-Philippines State Partnership focuses on civil-military operations, professional development, humanitarian assistance and disaster response (HADR), and humanitarian assistance and disaster response subject matter expertise exchanges (SMEE) in partnership with the Defense Threat Reduction Agency, among others; and

WHEREAS, to mark this 20th Anniversary, we are honored to have with us
representatives from the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP): Major General
Eugenio Hernandez, Colonel Gregory Docil, Colonel Lloyd Cabacungan, Colonel Rey
Bes, Colonel Jaime Datuin, Col Vicente Ronatay, Major Jerome Jabagat, and Chief
Master Sergeant Nida Domingo; and

WHEREAS, since 2001, the State Partnership Program between Guam and the Philippines has made great strides in its achievements, conducting medical and dental missions, engineer subject matter exchanges, senior staff exchanges, and professional development training. Through the State Partnership Program, the Guam-Philippines state partnership performed thousands of services and projects such as medical and dental missions, optical services, as well as construction and renovations of schools; and

WHEREAS, The Philippines remains a strategic ally and partner to the island and the US, committing to investing in high-quality US defense equipment as they modernize their force and conclude a General Security Information Agreement (GSOMIA); and

WHEREAS, The Guam-Philippines state partnership has seen the Guam
 National Guard contributing their cooperation to assisting the Armed Forces of the

Philippines through various subject matter expert exchanges and training programs to
 help prepare the AFP in carrying out operations against domestic insurgency and
 radical terrorist groups; and

4 WHEREAS, through the State Partnership Program, Guam, the Philippines, 5 and Hawaii have been able to conduct subject matter expertise exchanges with regards 6 to health and safety practices for COVID-19 and addressing the best way to conduct a COVID-19 response for the military, as well as integrating that response within the 7 8 civilian sector. Through these subject matter expertise exchanges, Guam, Philippines, 9 and Hawaii have thoroughly discussed basic tactics in handling a COVID-19 response, such as encouraging social distancing, practicing proper hygiene, utilizing 10 limited lockdowns, conducting mass testing, and communicating effectively with 11 civilian medical planners. It is through this State Partnership Program that we can 12 validate the relationships the partners have been building with one another, as well as 13 14 with the civilian health care entities in each nation and state, especially during this 15 global health crisis; and

WHEREAS, As we mark this year as the 20th Anniversary of the Guam-Philippines state partnership, we both strive and look forward to our continued partnership and cooperation. Through this State Partnership Program, both Guam and the Philippines have achieved goals that neither can reach alone. While we as partners have achieved so much, there is still much more room for opportunities to work and learn together; therefore, be it
