Relative to posthumously recognizing former Senior Jurist Pro Tempore for the Superior and Supreme Courts of Guam, Honorable Richard Hugh Benson for over 44 years of service in Pacific court systems and expressing condolences to his family on his passing on behalf of the people of Guam.

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Richard Hugh Benson, former Senior Jurist Pro
Tempore for the Superior and Supreme Courts of Guam passed away on November 17,

5 2021 in Guam. He lived to be 95 and is survived by his wife, Beatrice "Betty" Benson,

sister Barbara, his children Lang, Mark, and Marzieh; stepchildren, Shirin, Zeena, and
grandchildren, Ian, Matthew, Lua, Max, Mai, Ian, Dakota, and Dylan; and

WHEREAS, Judge Richard Benson began his civil service when he entered the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland on July 24, 1945 and graduated on June 3, 1949. Judge Benson continued to serve in the Navy for ten (10) years before obtaining his Juris Doctor (J.D.) from the University of Michigan Law School in 1956. He entered private practice in his home state of South Carolina and continued in Guam when he moved to the island in 1966; and

9 WHEREAS, Judge Benson was a private attorney in Guam for three years before 10 being appointed by Governor Carlos G. Camacho to Island Court as a judge in 1970. 11 Four years later, Judge Benson would be appointed by the same Governor to the newly 12 formed Superior Court of Guam which consolidated Guam's Commissioners, Police, 13 and Island Courts. He would become the first judge to be retained by the people of 14 Guam by popular election in 1978; and

WHEREAS, Judge Benson made the selfless decision to retire from the Superior 15 Court of Guam in 1981 in order to develop the Federated States of Micronesia's 16 (FSM's) court system and serve as the first Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of 17 the FSM. He was appointed to this position by the FSM's first President, Tosiwo 18 Nakayama on October 31, 1980 and confirmed by the FSM Congress on November 8, 19 1980. This was a position Judge Benson did not have to take, but like his wife Betty 20 said, "He believed in the unity of mankind and strove for that. He was a judge [in Guam] 21 and doing very well, but gave it up to go and start a court [in the FSM] for a quarter of 22 the price." Judge Benson expressed his intention to only remain on the body until a 23 qualified Micronesian could succeed him, and pledged to help train and develop locals 24 for judicial leadership. He served as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the FSM 25 for two decades before retiring from this position in 2001; and 26

WHEREAS, Judge Benson's civil service in the Pacific did not stop for he continued working in the court system when he returned to Guam in 2001. He served as Judge Pro Tempore of the Superior Court of Guam and as Justice Pro Tempore of

the Supreme Court of Guam for eleven (11) years in addition to serving pro tempore in other Micronesia courts, like the Supreme Court of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and the Supreme Court of the FSM. Judge Benson also accepted appointment as a Part Time Associate Justice in the Palau Supreme Court in 2009, where he showed great care in interpreting law and administering justice. He retired from this position in 2015; and

WHEREAS, Judge Benson's dedication to the law was assuredly matched only 7 by his dedication to his chosen faith, which he served vigorously on a worldwide scale. 8 He did so during his formative years of joining the Bahá'i Faith, when at times it made 9 10 it difficult for him to secure employment in his chosen profession. In many instances 11 during the late 1950's and early 1960's, Judge Benson was a man ahead of his time as a promoter of racial equality and interracial gatherings within his faith. Judge Benson 12 would go on to pioneer the Pacific as a Bahá'i, eventually serving in the capacity as 13 14 Continental Counsellor; and

WHEREAS, Judge Benson also contributed to the community through nonprofit work, dedicating much of his work toward peaceful conflict resolution through mediation for domestic and civil disputes through the non-profit organization Inafa'Maolek. Through his work with Inafa'Maolek, Judge Benson mediated over 50 cases. And during its existence, Judge Benson also mediated and arbitrated cases for Guam International Arbitration Center; and

WHEREAS, in recognition and appreciation of Judge Benson's dedicated service to improving justice throughout the Micronesia, the Judiciary of Guam awarded him the 2012 Hustisia Award which is given annually by the Judiciary of Guam to a person or organization that has contributed significantly to the improvement of the administration of justice. Judge Benson served as Senior Judge Pro Tempore on the Superior Court of Guam up until and including 2014; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on
behalf of the people of Guam, posthumously recognize former Senior Jurist Pro
Tempore for the Superior and Supreme Courts of Guam, Honorable Richard Hugh

Benson for over 44 years of service in Pacific court systems and express condolences
to his family on his passing; and be it further
