WHEREAS, on March 14, 2020, a public health emergency due to the dangers posed by the 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) was declared for Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) in conjunction with the Guam National Guard (GUNG) held the community's COVID-19 vaccination clinics; and

WHEREAS, (GUNG) was activated on March 14, 2020, and its Joint Task Force 671 served in support of local authorities operating quarantine facilities, replacing emergency field hospitals, working in emergency rooms and in COVID-19 wards, administering tests, distributing food commodities, and much more; and

WHEREAS, the University of Guam Calvo Fieldhouse clinic operated by the Department of Public Health and Social Services and the Guam Army National Guard opened on January 26, 2021 to March 2, 2022, as the main public facility to receive vaccinations against COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2021 the Governor's State Surgeon Cell authored a vaccination strategy, "Operation Liberate Guam." This was a multi-phased comprehensive plan for the island to reach herd immunity by vaccinating eighty percent (80%) of Guam's adult population no later than July 21, 2021, Liberation Day; and

WHEREAS, "Operation Liberate" Guam provided for static, mobile, and targeted vaccination sites and events creating planned benchmarks, parameters, and strategies in order to reach its goal; and

WHEREAS, the plans, operations, and effectiveness was successfully leveraged to gain additional vaccinations for our community at a time when demand far exceeded supply; and

WHEREAS, the University of Guam (UOG) Calvo Fieldhouse clinic operated by DPHSS and GUNG opened on January 26, 2021 to March 2, 2022, as the main public facility to receive vaccinations against COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, "Operation Liberate Guam" resulted in more than a one hundred (100) mobile vaccination outreach events; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2022, DPHSS and GUNG relocated to the Guam Community College to continue administering vaccinations against COVID-19, then recently moved to the Agaña Shopping Center on March 14, 2022, which is the current main public facility to receive vaccinations against COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, "Operation Liberate Guam" was comprised of the Governor's State Surgeon Cell, about twenty-five (25) Army medics, two (2) platoons of support staff, with community volunteers and partners from DPHSS, AmeriCorps UOG Volunteer Center, AmeriCorp *Ayuda Para I Komunidad*, Serve Guam Commission, UOG Global Learning and Engagement, UOG School of Health, and our partners in the healthcare industry: Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), Guam Regional Medical City (GRMC), American Medical Center (AMC), FHP Health Center, and Seventh-day Adventist Clinic (SDA), and together, vaccinating over two thousand (2,000) residents per day at its peak; and

WHEREAS, as of March 2, 2022 a total of one hundred thirty-five thousand eighty-four (135,084) of Guam's eligible population are fully vaccinated representing more than ninety-five (95%) percent, and fifty-five thousand seven hundred fifty-two (55,752) booster shots have been administered to eligible residents since September 29, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Serve Guam Commission (AmeriCorps) assisted with data collection and the processing of all patients; and

WHEREAS, our island has benefited tremendously because of the generosity and support of DPHSS, GUNG, UOG, AmeriCorps Serve Guam Commission and our partners in the healthcare industry: GMHA, GRMC, AMC, FHP Health Center, and SDA; in addition to their commitment to the improvement of the education, health, and welfare of the people of Guam, the members of DPHSS, GUNG, Serve Guam Commission; now therefore, be it


