WHEREAS, the Lions Clubs International is the world's largest service club organization with forty-six thousand (46,000) clubs and over one million four hundred thousand (1,400,000) members in over two hundred (200) countries and geographical areas; and

WHEREAS, the Mission Statement of the Lions Clubs International is: "To empower volunteers to serve their communities, meet humanitarian needs, encourage peace and promote international understanding through Lions Clubs"; and its Vision Statement is: "To be the global leader in community and humanitarian service"; and

WHEREAS, the Lions Clubs are widely known for their many and varied community and humanitarian service projects in the areas of sight conservation, hearing preservation, youth outreach, environmental protection, diabetes and cancer awareness, and aid to the sick and elderly; and

WHEREAS, the Guåhan Lions Club organized two (2) remarkably successful Gary Valenciano concerts at the UOG Calvo Fieldhouse in 1993 and 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Guåhan Lions Club also participated in the island-wide "Operation Graffiti Wipe-out Campaign" on May 20, 1995, wherein hundreds of volunteers from all walks of life, to include students, government officials, company executives, and employees, young and old, simultaneously gathered at the various Mayor's offices throughout the island and spread out to the community with paint and rollers on hand and painted over graffiti at various locations. 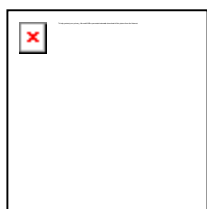
