

Before I begin the main part of my testimony, I want to make clear that my testimony is solely my own and does not represent the position or opinions of my employer or any other organization or person with which or whom I may be associated.

I am greatly honored to be appointed under the administration of Governor Lourdes Leon Guerrero and Lieutenant Governor Joshua Tenorio to serve as a member of the Board of Directors for the Guam Regional Transit Authority. I humbly and respectfully ask for your favorable consideration in providing consent to my appointment, under Guam law, so that I may serve the people of Guam in this role with honesty and integrity until the prospective term would expire in 2025. I would like to thank ____ for testifying on my appointment. *<if someone badmouths me> I am thankful for ____'s candor and I hope that I will have the opportunity to work closely with [him/her/them] in the future and share perspectives on how to improve public transit.*

While I believe the senators present know me, I would like to give a brief introduction to provide some of my background to anyone listening. I am Julian Janssen and was born in 1983 and raised in Oregon, until my parents, both teachers, moved to Guam in 1990. I have spent almost all of my time since then in Guam, living in Piti and later Tamuning. I attended Agat Elementary, Tamuning Elementary, St. John's Episcopal School, Saint Anthony Catholic School, Guam Adventist Academy, and I graduated from John F. Kennedy High School. I earned my Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from the University of Guam and completed all but the thesis in a Master of Science in Applied Economics from the University of North Dakota. I had a summer internship for Senator Rory Respicio and have worked for Senators Ray Tenorio, Adolpho Palacios, Sr., and Michael San Nicolas. I currently work as a Planner III for the Guam Coastal Management Program in the Bureau of Statistics and Plans under the Office of the Governor.

In December 2008, the Department of Public Works adopted the 2030 Guam Transportation Plan. One of its key policy recommendations was the re-establishment of a public transit authority governed by an independent board. The next year, the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) was established as public corporation under Public Law 30-5, which was introduced by my former boss, Senator Palacios. I am proud of the work we did to improve accessible parking enforcement and provide additional resources to DISID.

I believe that the administration of the Guam Regional Transit Authority should be led with a "Triple Bottom Line" approach to responsible and accountable management, which is about: people, environment, and fiscal responsibility.

People. GRTA is fundamentally about providing accessible, safe, affordable, clean, friendly, and efficient public transportation to its ridership, many of whom are people with disabilities, senior citizens, people with low-to-moderate incomes, students, or simply those who wish to reduce their carbon-footprint. Whether riders use GRTA's paratransit, fixed-route, or demand-response service, they need to be accommodated appropriately and given good service.

Public transportation is about more than mobility, it is also about dignity; the dignity of independent living for people with disabilities and senior citizens—the chance to live our lives and to work without being tied to the kindness of others.

Environment. Public transit is already an environmentally-friendly way to travel, and GRTA will become even better as it grows to have higher utilization and as it adopts technologies such as solar lighting at the bus stops and begins to replace its existing fleet with electric vehicles.

Fiscal responsibility. The dollars that come into GRTA, whether they are from non-appropriated funds, local appropriations, or federal grants, have to be carefully accounted for and invested in improvements to the services provided to transit riders.

I believe we are seeing meaningful progress toward building a transit system that can adequately meet the various needs of the people of Guam and, particularly, the core ridership of GRTA. I consider capacity-building a central issue within the context of moving the transit system to where it needs to be. There are significant investments in building capacity in the works, including a substantial increase in the fleet of transit vehicles, the establishment of facilities to serve GRTA and its ridership, and plans to establish charging stations using federal funding, which may be able to serve GRTA as it transitions to a fully electric fleet. I support such investments and I intend to work diligently to do my part to help GRTA rise to its potential.

If I am confirmed, I look forward to engaging in collaborative efforts inside and outside of GRTA to advocate for and achieve improvements to public transit on Guam for GRTA's current and prospective riders and the community it serves.

The following are *some* priorities that I intend to pursue:

People.

(1) I will work to ensure progress on the One Call – One Click Transportation Management System, the proposed Park and Ride Facility in Dededo, and the establishment of a permanent GRTA facility (which I understand is currently in A&E and awaiting completion of National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 Section 106 consultation with the Department of Parks and Recreation Historic Resources Division).

(2) I will work to develop guidelines on bus stop facilities based on overall and site-specific needs, particularly for the special needs of people with disabilities and senior citizens. ^[1] Those guidelines should be used as a basis to undertake a targeted needs assessment for bus stops, so we can target priority improvements.

(3) I will work with GRTA to bring transit vehicles into compliance with accessibility requirements under the Americans with Disabilities Act.

(4) I will work to ensure appropriate guidance is given to GRTA personnel and that they will be held to appropriate standards of conduct.

(5) I will work with GRTA to apply appropriate procedures to provide adequate preventative maintenance to transit vehicles and regular tests of transit systems to ensure they are in working order, including stop request mechanisms. Toward that end, I will work with GRTA to provide training opportunities to its mechanics to achieve Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification.

(6) I will work with GRTA to get their planning staff gains access to Geographic Information System (GIS) software. Ensure such staff will be included in GIS training opportunities, whether funded internally or externally.

(7) I will work to ensure transit fleet continue its expansion to provide improved paratransit, fixed-route, and demand-response service.

(8) I will participate along with GRTA leadership and staff to support the transit component of DPW's update of the 2030 Guam Transportation Plan.

(9) I will work to improve GRTA's fixed route service, ensuring that routes are designed appropriately to deliver timely, reliable, more frequent service systemwide, where it is needed, with appropriate study and extensive consultation with riders and other stakeholders.

Environment.

- (1) I will work to ensure that bus shelters are safe and environmentally sustainable by providing solar-powered lighting systems.
- (2) I will ensure that GRTA remains on track for its utilization of federal grant funding to develop charging stations for its transit fleet and in achieving its goal of 100% electric vehicles by 2030.

Fiscal Responsibility

- (1) I will ensure that GRTA has an adequate system for accountability for its collection of fares from transit riders, whether prepaid or paid on embarkation.
- (2) I will work with GRTA to explore partnership opportunities for agencies and non-governmental organizations to increase non-appropriated fund revenue (advertising, bulk passes, etc.).
- (3) I will work closely with GRTA to ensure that existing federal grants are fully utilized and that any unexpended balance will be reprogrammed to improve services rather than be returned.
- (4) I will explore the acquisition of a Fleet Management System to economize on fuel and find inefficiencies within the existing fixed-route schedule.
- (5) I will ensure that any promotional budget will be targeted to high propensity transit riders, such as people with disabilities, senior citizens, students, and low-to-moderate income individuals.
- (6) I will work with GRTA's planning staff to explore development of a Bus Rapid Transit corridor under the Federal Transit Administration's Capital Investment Grants Program.

Chairman Jose T. Terlaje:

I am submitting this supplemental written testimony in my personal capacity. Anything said in this testimony does not represent the position of my employer or any organization or individual with which I may be associated.

I would like to thank you and the honorable members of *I Mina' Trentai Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* for the opportunity have my appointment by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero to serve as a member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) heard and to testify before the Guam Legislature on Thursday, February 10, 2022. I greatly appreciate the questions offered by esteemed members of the legislature who were able to attend the confirmation hearing virtually and those who viewed the hearing live or at a later time. I strongly believe in the potential of public transit, in general, and the transit services offered by GRTA, in particular, to improve the lives of Guam's people with disabilities, *manåmko'*, *manhoben*, and working women and men.

As I mentioned in my testimony before the legislature, I work as a planner for the Guam Coastal Management Program (GCMP) under the Bureau of Statistics and Plans. As a planner, I am currently serving as the point of contact for federal consistency within GCMP.

Federal consistency is a process that preserves, protects, allows responsible development, and where possible, to restores or enhances, the resources of Guam for this and succeeding generations by applying the enforceable policies of Guam to federal actions through the coordination authority established under the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972. Federal consistency involves the review of federal actions, including activities undertaken by a federal agency, federally-licensed or permitted activities, and applications for federal assistance by state and local agencies. As the federal consistency coordinator for GCMP since September 2019, I have not reviewed

any federal consistency case for which GRTA was an applicant. However, it is possible that activities of GRTA, specifically federally-licensed or permitted activities or applications for federal assistance may be subject to federal consistency, should there be an effect on coastal resources or uses.

Draft responses for federal consistency are subject to amendment and final approval by the Administrator of GCMP and ultimately the Director of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans. I take my duties and ethical responsibilities seriously, as a father, a working man, a government employee, and as a trustee of the peoples' interest in GRTA. As an acting member of the GRTA Board of Directors and, should I be confirmed as a member of the Board by the Guam Legislature, a member of the Board of Directors for my remaining term I will seek a recusal for any federal consistency case for which GRTA is the applicant. These are the same actions expected of every board member presently serving throughout our government when a conflict arises. Moreover, it is the same action taken by members of the legislature when conflicts arise.

That being said, my familiarity with the requirements of local law both as a former policy analyst in the Guam Legislature and as a planner would prove useful to GRTA. Thank you for your consideration and I humbly and respectfully ask for your support by confirming my appointment to serve as a member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority's Board of Directors.

Before I begin, I'd like to make clear for the record that my testimony before you today is strictly in my personal capacity. My comments do not represent my employer nor any organization of which I am a part.

Mr. Chairman, I understand that given my professional capacity, my testimony in favor of the nominee is out of the ordinary.

But I am here as a matter of conscience and perspective. In the early 20th Century, a US Supreme Court Justice wrote “anyone good at anything isn't like anyone else. That describes my friend Julian Jansen-the man whose nomination is presently before this committee.

I met Julian in the 5th grade, and we have been friends since. His father was my elementary school music teacher. His mother—Mrs J as I have called her for decades now taught my World History Honors Class and coached us through Academic Challenge Bowl.

In all of that time, Julian has been unlike any other person I have ever met.

At a time when most kids were playing pogs or watching the Power Rangers, Julian concerned himself with the most fundamental questions of moral philosophy--the just or unjustness of society, and the power of a group of people to come together to make it better.

From the moment he could drive, I've always been able to count on Julian. Like so many of my friends, he's never asked for a dime—never been late when it mattered, never made me feel like I was less. Julian understands the power comes from a ride you can rely on. I am certain that with Julian as a board member, GRTA will too

Hafa Adai Senator Terlaje and Committee members,

I respectfully submit this letter of strong recommendation for the appointment of Mr. Julian C. Janssen as a member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority Board of Directors.

Reliable bus transportation has been an issue on Guam "since ever since." It was an issue when I was a reporter for the now-defunct Guam Cable TV back in 1984, and it was still an issue when I served as communications director for Guam Community College from 2008-2018. Consistently, the top reason GCC students gave for not being able to attend classes regularly was "lack of reliable transportation."

GRTA service has improved in the last several years; however, riders still tell us the fixed route bus service needs improvement. A thorough examination of existing routes and how they may - or may not - serve the needs of current ridership; and growing ridership to alleviate traffic congestion on our island are two laudable and very common sense goals for GRTA.

Mr. Janssen is an extremely intelligent, analytical person, and a critical employee for the Bureau of Statistics and Plans. That goal in itself will substantially increase GRTA ridership, as well as help individual riders to improve their quality of life.

I have known Julian Janssen for many years and heartily endorse confirmation of his appointment to serve as a Member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority Board of Directors.



II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The confirmation hearing was Called-to-Order at 4:00 p.m.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, this virtual confirmation hearing is now called to order. Today's date is Thursday, February the 10th 2022 and the time now is 4 pm. The Committee on Public Safety, Emergency Response,



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Military and Veterans Affairs, Mayors Council of Guam and Public Transit is conducting a virtual confirmation hearing today for the appointment of Mr. Julian C. Janssen, to serve as member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority Board of Directors. For the record in conformance with section 8107 of chapter 8 title 5 GCA. The first confirmation hearing notice was sent out on Thursday, February the 3rd 2022 to adhere to the five working days requirement and the second confirmation hearing adhering to the 48 hours' notice was sent out on Tuesday, February 8, 2022 and in addition to these notices were also sent out to the to all media and posted on the Guam legislature website and I would like to thank all my colleagues for attending this hearing and I would like to recognize my colleague uh Senator Joanne Brown with us today and also uh Senator Joanne I mean Telo Taitague and also I guess the Acting Manager for the Guam Mass Transit Mr. Richard Ibanez and we're gonna go ahead and go with the presentation uh with some of the Senators and Mr. Ibanez to share their thoughts on this confirmation hearing. So, I'm going to call on our good senator uh let me call on our good senator first uh Senator Joanne Brown. Senator, go ahead. You can start.

Senator Joanne Brown: No problem, Mr. Chair. Would you like to have uh if as uh Acting Director of Mass Transit going to provide testimony on behalf of uh Mr. Janssen.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Yes, it's gonna be on uh yeah, I'm gonna let my colleagues go first.

Senator Joanne Brown: Oh no problem. I think it'd be preferable if they provide uh their testimony and um then that would be number one yeah, I think it be preferable perhaps Mr. Chair if they went first and then we can certainly follow after okay if we have any questions we can inquire as to the testimony that they provide if you don't mind.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Okay, Richard, go ahead.

Senator Joanne Brown: Thank you, sir.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Thank you, um honorable senators uh Mr. Chair. Um, I've spoken with uh Mr. Janssen regarding um his um appointment uh to become a Board of Trustee for the Guam Regional Transit Authority. Um, he did have questions and I addressed them. He was already he's very knowledgeable with GRTA. Just from speaking with Mr. Janssen I feel that he will fill a vital role as far as filling our last spot for the board of trustees. He's very knowledgeable with grants and of course we need GRTA being funded with a lot of grants from the FTA, Mr. Janssen will be a very very valuable asset to the Guam Regional Transit Authority. Thank you.



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Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Thank you very much, Richard and let me call on our friend Mr. Carlo Branch. Go ahead, Sir. Mr. Branch just provide your testimony, sir. Carlo, go ahead sir. There we go.

Senator Joanne Brown: Perhaps we can let him know Mr. Chair we can't hear him.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Carlo, can you unmute yourself. Carlo, can you hear me?

Senator Telo Taitague: Carlo, yeah you might want it Carlo you might want to check out and then come back in because we can't hear you.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: yeah, yeah, okay let me let me uh call on uh you Senator Joanne.

Senator Joanne Brown: You know Mr. Chair I think we could have Mr. Jenssen and then maybe by then if Mr. branch is able to reconnect then we can have him provide his comments. I'm not sure if he's aware we're not able to hear him.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: So, you're recommending that we go uh to Julian to have him speak first.

Senator Joanne Brown: Yeah, I think in the interim unless we can get Mr. Branch on just to make time you know productive perhaps to have Mr. Jenssen provide his testimony and if Mr. Branch can get back on and we can hear him and then we can proceed with any questions uh that way we can inquire as to the testimony provided.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Okay, so we'll go to uh Julian. Julian, go ahead.

Julian Janssen: (See written testimony provided)

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Thank you very much, Mr. Janssen and I would like to first off recognize our good senator, Senator Sabina Perez. At this point in time, I would like to call on Mr. Carlo Branch to share his thoughts regarding the appointment.

Carlo Branch: Yes. Hello Mr. Chairman. Are you able to hear me?

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: We can hear you now.

Carlo Branch: (See written testimony provided)



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Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Thank you, Mr. Branch. Thank you very much. Before I go on to the senators, let me just read some of the written testimony that was submitted to my office, and I just want to call out your name right now. Jayne Flores is one of them from the Bureau of Women's Affairs. We got another one from John Ryan from Ordot and another one from Kelly Marsh Taitano who's also a former senator and also, lastly, Dr. Leah Beth O. Naholowaa. I do have the written testimony with me so if anybody, excuse me. If anybody wants to read it, just come by and I'll show it to you and now let me start with our good senator, Senator Joanne Brown. Go ahead ma'am. Share your thoughts.

Senator Joanne Brown: Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman and certainly to those that testified on behalf of Mr. Janssen's appointment, but I did want to ask Mr. Janssen. You did mention that you work at the Bureau of Planning. Are you currently in a classified position in the government at this time or unclassified?

Julian Janssen: My position is classified.

Senator Joanne Brown: I'm just asking. It's not traditional that we have classified employees sitting on boards and commissions. I mean do you think there's any potential conflict with the work that you're doing at the Bureau of Statistics as a classified employee sitting over other Government of Guam employees in the mass transit authority?

Julian Janssen: No. There are members on other such boards.

Senator Joanne Brown: I know but it's not traditional but it's not traditional. Normally, we have other members that, not that it takes away from your participation, but normally we have other members of the community rather than having the government overseeing the government. You know, normally we would like others from outside of that, you know, in the public to be sitting on boards and commissions so that we have a different perspective and it's always important to keep the government in check. I don't like too much inbreeding. It's not, I don't think it's healthy. So not necessarily to take away from your interest and you had quite an extensive list of things you wanted to see from mass transit, and I certainly wish you well with that. I think historically, it's been dumbfounding to me as to why the mass transit on Guam has not been as efficient and effective as it can be and it is in other jurisdictions. You know considering our island is much smaller. We've not been able to get to that level of I guess community buy-in, where people that you know, otherwise in other places would ride the mass transit system don't do it here because of the concern of reliability and how do we get to that level so that, you know, we have other members of our community. Not everybody drives. Not



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everybody wants to. We have older people in our community that if they knew there was consistency with regards to the service actually would actually want to participate. Not everyone necessarily needs to be low income to want to ride the bus, but I think it's just having reliability in the system because some people don't like the hassle of driving, especially on our roads and some of the crazy drivers that we have out there. So, I mean you have an ambitious list what makes you think that's something you can accomplish and get others on your board to do.

Julian Janssen: Okay. Is that the question or is the question?

Senator Joanne Brown: That's the question. Yes, that's the question.

Julian Janssen: Okay because I heard like three questions in there. Okay.

Senator Joanne Brown: Not quite. I mean I simply said you had a long list. You had a long list of things you wanted to do and the lack of consistent reliability, so I don't think there are a lot of questions. I'm simply restating some of the things you had relayed and so I'm as I mentioned my last question there. I'm curious. How can you, how do you think you can convince other members of your board perhaps to do what hasn't been accomplished since probably mass transit was created?

Julian Janssen: Yeah. Well, I mean I think that we are very much in a potent or in a situation where there is a lot of opportunity and people can begin to see that opportunity, especially with the infrastructure funding and the initial strides that the previous executive manager and the board have been able to make towards securing additional funding for expanding the fleet, both for paratransit and also the anticipated growth of the buses the bus fleet. I kind of want to circle back to your discussion about my role as both working at GCMP as a planner for the Government of Guam and my role at GRTA. I personally do not think that there is any conflict whatsoever. I think that they're complementary. I think I've even mentioned some of areas of overlap in the way in which we have. We execute plans and we come up with plans for the Government of Guam. GRTA should be playing a role in that, and I have and in my own work at GCMP recent. You know relatively recently; I'm doing federal consistency and I have noticed that there are authorities which we can exercise to emphasize to like public highway projects, the need to consult GRTA to allow them to continue to operate and not have or so they can come up with ways that they can continue operate. You know even as there's going to be construction immediately where their stops are you know and that consultation. I don't think that's a consistent thing that they have done so I look at this as an opportunity for to bring a different perspective. A very thoughtful and reasoned perspective and I believe



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in the capacity of the of the current board members and the management to be able to make huge strides in the near future.

Senator Joanne Brown: Well, we certainly look forward to seeing it like I said it hasn't been done so far and I think much to the dismay of many in our community of just wanting to see, you know, consistent service. What are the issues? Are you aware of how your fleet is maintained because that's always been an issue? How does the current fleet, maybe Mr. Ybanez, can answer that? How is your kids, how is your fleet currently being maintained? I mean it's nice to buy all these new buses. That's always been the thing. Gov Guam loves new things. We love new buildings. We love new everything but our ability to maintain it consistently has never been the best. So, do you have a private contract with anyone that does the maintenance on your buses? Is it done in-house? How's that addressed?

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Thank you. Thank you, senator. Senator Brown, to answer your question, we do have a fleet right now of 22 buses and when they do go down for maintenance, we do have a contract with Atkins Kroll to maintain our buses and vehicles and we currently are anticipating the arrival of 10 new 14 packs buses in the end of August, which was already awarded. As soon as those buses come, it will alleviate our, I believe seven- to eight-year-old, our box and minivans. So, we did have maybe 17 vehicles at AK prior to this public hearing but our transportation supervisor was able to pull five vehicles and get them fixed. Now we're down to only like 12 and we just, I just received the WhatsApp message. We'll probably get three more. So, our fleet is consistent when it goes down, we work closely with AK and then if our in-house maintenance can fix it, be it a headlight, a flat tire. They can fix it in-house with GRTA. But yes, we do have some vehicles and buses with AK right now.

Senator Joanne Brown: I see. Are you guys doing regular maintenance on the vehicles? I mean I'm not talking about we wait till you know the style waits till it breaks down. I mean are we doing regular oil changes according to the mileage and the things that normally we would do with our own vehicles to keep them running and running well.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Yes, great question! So, what we implemented was once a month the whole fleet, on a Sunday, we'll bring it to AK and we're working closely with them to have every bus and minivan or vehicle that we have maintained. We do it once a month on a Sunday.

Senator Joanne Brown: Another question, do you have a tracking system on your buses, so you know where they're at, where they're located, how well they're being driven or



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not driven? Your fleet's not that large that you couldn't accomplish that. Do you have that in place so you can track where your buses are at any given time?

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Yes, Senator! Prior to me becoming the acting executive manager. The previous executive manager along with myself and the other staff at management they implemented a transit management service called Route Match which utilizes a tablet. It's installed in all of our buses and minivans. We can track where the driver is and if they're speeding. We can see if they're going on the wrong route, to the right house and if they're basically not working. It alerts us here at the home base at our dispatch center. So, yes, we are using a Route Match which is a transit management service that the previous EM and our staffing management utilizes.

Senator Joanne Brown: One other question. I'm glad to hear that you guys are using technology so that we can and especially for your riders if there's a delay or whatever at least there's a way. Is there a way of riders knowing if there's some delay for whatever reason?

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Yes!

Senator Joanne Brown: You know if they have a set schedule is that something they could get online and look at and check if there's a delay. Do you have updates on the status or buses are on time and things like that so that they can track? Especially if they're going to a doctor's appointment or going to work maybe.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Yes, Route Match gives us like you said the use of technology. Route Match does have, when Route Match alerts us that a driver is late it inputs it into the system, and we can track if we are late an hour or if somebody canceled. It also alerts our dispatch center that the driver for bus I'll just say bus X is still in Mangilao uh be prepared to tell especially paratransit that their ride will be about 30 minutes late. So, we do have that um capability Senator.

Senator Joanne Brown: Well, that's good to hear. I mean, I hope we see better things because I mean we have a lot of challenges in government but to me getting from point A to point B shouldn't be that complicated. I mean we move 30,000 students a day to and from school. Uh doesn't make a lot of sense, we can't move 20 buses around the island to pick up and drop people off safely. So, uh hopefully we'll continue to hear good things and certainly to you Mr. Janssen you're very young, you've got a lot of energy, and hopefully, you can apply it, but you know I'm just being frank. I am concerned. I want to make sure that we have a good mix of members on our boards and commissions because I don't like to see too much of government in government. I like less government. I think



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we probably will get a better productive view but it's just something to be mindful of certainly for me if I'm going to vote on your confirmation because you do currently work as a classified employee of a government agency and there may be others, I think your chairman is a mayor as well. So, like I said I just like to see a better mix of members. It doesn't take away from you or your contribution or what you have but I think it's important that we have diversified views in the community and accountability of the government outside the government itself. Because I just see too much inbreeding in the Government of Guam, and I don't see that as a good thing always. So don't take offense to it but it's simply a question I'm sure many will have with regards to a government classified employee you know serving on a board of commission of its government and overseeing uh the operations of other government Guam employees. So, with that Mr. Chairman, thank you for the indulgence of being able to ask these questions. Thank you!

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Thank you very much, Senator Brown. Uh next in line uh we want to call on our Senator Telo Taitague. Go ahead, ma'am.

Senator Telo Taitague: Thank you Mr. Chairman. I thought you were going to say I was your favorite. I was waiting for that but ai adai.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: You are my favorite, but I don't want to announce it anymore because everybody says I cannot just be choosing one senator.

Senator Telo Taitague: I miss that yeah, I miss that. It's okay I know we're all your favorite uh Mr. Chair and I thank you for the opportunity to speak on this confirmation you know. I too share the same sentiment as Senator Brown with regards to classified positions but uh most especially you know individuals sitting on a board has to have the ability to work with others and be non-controversial or you know basically doesn't have, well has a sense of working and having an open mind with others and you know I've seen you in action, Mr. Janssen. It kind of worries me because this is such an important important agency. You know there's been so much controversy with GRTA so much controversy on buses being on time. Um you know I get calls all the time from Mass Transit individuals who can't seem to flag anyone down you know or even be heard at the agencies. However, Mr. Babauta did great strides to try and prove that and you have shoes, big shoes to fill Mr. Ybanez because I know Mr. Babauta not only put a lot of time in there but he put his heart and soul in that agency and the work that he has done himself. But you know that being said I have a couple of questions for you Julian. When GRTA is in a better position to offer reliable services how will you encourage residents to prioritize and choose public transit over personal vehicles in consideration of environmental issues and rising fuel costs?



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Julian Janssen: Well, I think that one of well, I mean two days ago there was a presentation before the GRTA board. I'm not going to say I completely support what was discussed in the marketing proposal by UOG which was delivered by Amanda Blas, but you know there are certainly options that we could put on the table for promoting GRTA. I personally think one of the best ways of promoting GRTA is to have signage on the bus stops because it's very hard to know where you can actually embark or get off. If you're driving around a lot of the times they're simply not marked so for the average person, they won't know that there's a bus stop there and they'd have to go maybe online or something and go to the website and try to figure that out. I think also well the website has much to improve upon as well, but you know there's plenty of ideas that can be explored. I think that some of the things that Amanda Blas was talking about certainly could find its way into an actionable proposal that will really elevate GRTA in the public conscience and give people a reason why that they would choose to be environmentally conscious to find an affordable way of getting to work and getting to where they need to be by using Guam Regional Transit Authority. Thank you!

Senator Telo Taitague: Do you have any comments on the idea of using school bus shelters for public transit services outside of school hours? Is that something to think about too?

Julian Janssen: I have heard that brings up issues. I would have to look into it closer. I think one problem with that is the branding that you can't really or that there'd be a lot of confusion about whether something is a bus stop for GRTA versus the public school because it's not going to be able to be exactly the same. That's not going to be appropriate everywhere.

Senator Telo Taitague: That was brought up I think about a year ago talking about the utilization of you know how schools are being used you know bussing children that something that's used in Hawaii. A lot of school children use mass transit in Hawaii, to get to school so it's an idea. So, what specific ideas do you have that will help GRTA expand advertising opportunities involving you know what you talked about you know these shelters and branding like its fleet buses and its shelters and the means to generate revenue.

Julian Janssen: Well, I mean I mentioned one thing. I think another thing that might make a lot of sense would be to invest in the production of some good quality PSAs which you know you can make and then you can rerun them with essentially donated time by broadcasters. You know I mean that one's relatively inexpensive I think because it's just a production of the spots. You know then you can get into the viral marketing or the marketing on the internet which I wouldn't rule out, but I would be I would make sure



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that whatever we're gonna do is targeted very well to what we would expect the core riders to be and that isn't necessarily absolutely everybody.

Senator Telo Taitague: I think my last question for you is regarding technology and the use of it for you know Guam Regional Mass Transit and you know ideas such as get the ball rolling on there using allowing swipe cards purchase of reload convenience for cell phones and computers. What's your perspective on technology integrated into Mass Transit other than what the good director was mentioning about the note, electric notepads.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Route Match, Senator.

Senator Telo Taitague: Yeah, Route Match, Route Match yeah. So, what is your perspective on that Mr. Janssen?

Julian Janssen: I mean, I would just start by saying that I would like to know more about that Route Match later on so we'll have to be discussing that so I can learn all about it. Now one thing that I have like I mentioned I'm not that much of a fan of the current website and I think that there may be benefits to exploring the idea of developing a mobile app that could be on an android store or something that would be able to show in a very user-friendly way where exactly the stops are and like what the route schedule is. You know as to whether it could show real-time tracking. I'm not sure maybe that's not feasible at this moment but it might be able to be integrated with the Route Match. But I'm very open to suggestions and I'm very willing to collaborate with anybody who has ideas.

Senator Telo Taitague: Okay well, thank you so much for your responses to my questions. You know as far as the website is concerned whenever any agency comes before us on confirmations the first thing, I look at is the website to find out if it's up to date. It looks like it's pretty much up to date because I have something here that says it was closed on January 17th. I mean compared to some of the other agencies you know you don't see anything, last time anybody touched it was like in 2022. I mean 2020 and even 2021 but I'm actually quite happy with the information provided it's quite a bit of information on GRTA maybe we can find another app like you mentioned to you know simplify it were those people who just want to get one particular information and it's a touch of a just a finger because of a lot of our riders. You know it needs to be more techy friendly you know for them to understand because there is a wide range of individuals writing GRTA. So, I thank you Mr. Chair for the opportunity. I wish you the very best Mr. Ybanez. Like I said they choose to feel since Mr. Babauta has left but I'm hoping that if there's anything I can do that you would call on me if there's something that you need.



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Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): Absolutely Senator, thank you.

Senator Telo Taitague: Okay, thank you so much. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Thank you very much, Senator. Let me go to another favorite of mine, Senator Sabina Perez. I hope you don't get offended that Senator Taitague. Go ahead, Senator Perez.

Senator Sabina Perez: Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman for this opportunity and hello to Mr. Janssen. So yes, I noticed that you are, you know, you oversee federal consistency at the Bureau of Statistics and Plans and so you know I'm wondering would that present a potential conflict of interest, if there's anything, that may go before BSP and you being on the board of Guam Regional Transit Authority?

Julian Janssen: Well, I would say not. For one thing, all I'm doing is calling people's attention to the laws that we have on the books that are enforceable policies under the Guam Coastal Management Program and my responsibility there is to provide those comprehensively and consistently to anybody who is applying or is subject to federal consistency. Also, it goes ultimately, the decision on goes up as well. So, it doesn't stop with me. It goes up to the administrator. It goes up for review for the chief planner and it goes finally up to the director of Bureau of Statistics and plans, who is ultimately the signature signatory.

Senator Sabina Perez: Okay because one of the things of federal consistency is it's not just projects, but also funding federal funding, right. So, federal funding could have an impact on the coastal resources of Guam and in this case the coastal resources is all of Guam. You know, the island of Guam is considered coast part of the coast. So yeah, I'm just thinking, you know, in what ways can you determine if a project coming before the regional authority might perhaps, there might be some sort of conflict? I mean, is there a way to determine that you know considering it's not just the project itself, but the funding that's coming through the authority.

Julian Janssen: I mean, we don't provide funding. We are part of a review process.

Senator Sabina Perez: Correct, yes. I'm part of federal consistency. Is that any - it's not just a project that comes before the BSP, but also funding associated. So, federal funding could trigger a consistency review and so yeah. I, just to me, it's unclear, you know, there might be potential conflict of interest and I just want to, want to, make you aware of that and if there's a way to kind of prevent that from happening right. So, you know,



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obviously we want the best, you know. You know, we to properly implement federal consistency as well as advance the needs and the progress that we've seen such far with Guam Regional Transit Authority under the leadership of Cel Babauta. You know, so you know, I'm just trying to think of a way where, you know, perhaps you can be made aware of that and be able to prevent that from happening and if there's such a way, you know, perhaps we need something. I guess I would need some clarification on that in your role playing both roles as a federal consistency reviewer and serving on the on the board of Guam Regional Transit Authority. So, that's one of the concerns. I share that concern with my colleague. So, I do appreciate the vision that you have as a board member. You know, I'm very much in support of, you know, reducing our need on use of fossil fuels and you know. You know, maybe perhaps overhauling the fleet and I understand Mr. Babauta was also very much, you know. He was a proponent of that. Unfortunately, I know in many public hearings that he came to, he talked about procurement struggles and in looking at the latest minutes of the board meetings, there is one such. There's - it's still stuck in procurement as far as the electric buses and so perhaps, you know, as a board member what could your contribution be towards providing that sort of support.

Julian Janssen: I'm sorry. I kind of, I kind of lost a track. Sorry, what was that question?

Senator Sabina Perez: Yeah. So, in your, in talking in your testimony, you talked about supporting, you know, trans changing the fleet to electric fleet, solar charging stations and you know. I think that's something that Mr. Babauta had initiated too as well. So, but the issue was procurement. It got stuck in procurement and I'm just wondering, what can you contrib- what kind of contributions can you make in procurement in basically clearing up procurements throw to protests?

Julian Janssen: I'm not a- I'm not an expert on procurement. You know, I would, I mean I would do the best that I can to make sure that I didn't introduce problems, but you know. You have to rely on the people who know what they're doing with regard to the procurement and all the processes there. So, I kind of wanted to circle back a little bit on the- oh never mind, on the issue with regard to federal consistency, just for the clarity of everyone. I'm not sure if everyone is familiar with what federal consistency is, but it's in essence applying a review of what laws governing coastal uses and coastal resources Guam has and then applying those for federal projects and you know so I just want to make sure that's clear that it's not applying federal standards to any or anything like that I think a lot of people probably get it completely backwards in their understanding so I just wanted to take this opportunity to clarify that



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Senator Sabina Perez: okay so maybe this questions could be for acting executive manager Mr. Ybanez so procurement you know what do you have as far as procurement support within the authority

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): thank you Senator Sabina Perez as far as procurement is concerned, I work closely with our attorney assistant attorney general assigned to us by the attorney general's office as well as GSA and our planner with our buses the 10 buses that are coming in August and then we're currently sending out another IFB upon review from our assistant attorney general that is assigned to us from the AGs office for an additional six more buses in total with the money that we are receiving we should have an additional 27 vehicles and for right now you mentioned electric buses just to you know clarify the electric buses is coming from the BIL the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law that was passed I believe back in November December by President Biden and that is a five-year plan to get electric buses and an electrification station so that's where we are at with the electric buses senator.

Senator Sabina Perez: thank you thank you for the response

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): thank you

Senator Sabina Perez: yeah, and I do sorry yeah I do recognize the rider sorry the on time record has been improved dramatically I think I even see it anecdoted anecdotally as I drive by bus stations I you know I don't see as much riders waiting at the bus stop as I did before so congratulations on that and you know definitely like to see continued improvements and yes Julian you were raising your hand

Julian Janssen: sorry I just actually wanted to kind of go back because you know what you what you raised with the conflict of interest does make me not I mean I don't think that it's insurmountable at all I think it would be a rare thing if it would even be a question but I certainly want to you know make sure that that that is addressed I'm not saying well it can be addressed internally within DSP and Guam coastal management program you know I'm going to consult with our like ASO and you know if necessary maybe with a council or something to make sure that you know if there is say the potential for a conflict on the review of federal consistency on specifically projects that are being funded for GRTA by my being a board member then I could possibly if the if need be step back and the different planning staff could might be able to do that but I'm just thinking out loud you know and I wouldn't know the outcome of the advice that I would get until later I'm just thinking that there's ways to avoid it even if it work would be an issue and I and I will do I will do with my due diligence to make sure that that is going to happen okay.



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Senator Sabina Perez: okay perfect yeah that's so important I do appreciate that that extra effort so yeah a lot of the questions were asked and yeah I think that I really appreciate the vision that you have as a board member being proactive and progressive in regards to environmental protections and moving forward but I think too like my colleagues have mentioned you know we want to keep this progress going with Guam Regional Transit Authority and you know some of these day-to-day operational things are also very important in addition to achieving the idealistic vision so yeah definitely looking forward to your contributions on the board and so thank you Mr. Chair

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: thank you very much Senator there's only one thing that kind of just bothers me right now is the ongoing project on the park and ride I just want to ask Richard have you got together with the mayor of Dededo regarding the reservation of property that we need to get because you know we're press with time with that nine million dollars that is supposed to go to GRTA but actually if nothing is going on with the with the designation of the property we're going to lose that 9 million dollars so what is what's the status on that project.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): thank you, Mr. Chair. I actually reached out to your office, and I spoke to Kirsten Kristen

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: yeah yeah

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): and she informed me that you were in your offices was communicating with mayor Savares regarding the parcel of land that originally was supposed to be given to us which was across American Grocery but the then and then.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: we have a problem with water works with that one

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): that one and then they mentioned to me that they went back to Mayor Savares and asked if we can get the.

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: old flee market

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): flee market yes so, I can call you and you know discuss it Mr. Chair because we're just waiting on the we need we need the property even before we can move Mr. Chair.



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Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: Richard we need to get together with the mayor because she offered that we can actually use the old flea market right on route one because you know we need to move forward and finalize this project because if we don't we're pressed with time we're gonna lose that 9 million dollars so I'm going to go ahead and make a schedule with you and with the mayor of Dededo if we can get Joe Borja to really you know certify the whatever land area that we need to get so that we don't lose that nine million dollars.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): yes sir

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: so, I'll be calling you I'll be calling you Richard thank you very much.

Richard Ybanez (GRTA, Acting Executive Manager): okay thank you thank you

Chairman Jose "Pedo" Terlaje: ladies and gentlemen we're just about time to close and I would like to thank all of you for your participation in today's confirmation hearing for Mr. Julian A. The confirmation hearing was adjourned at 5:00 p.m.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee finds that the appointee received positive testimony from nearly ten residents. In conversations with the acting Executive Manager, it was revealed that the appointee has identified federal funds for the authority to try and meet its mission.

During his confirmation hearing, a senator had asked about the potential for a conflict of interest that would arise from serving on the board while being a classified employee. In the Committee's research, it is allowable for board members to be classified so the Committee finds this to be a non-issue. There is no evidence to suggest that a conflict of



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interest exists under Guam law (4 GCA §15205). Additionally, the appointee provided a letter to the Committee committing to recuse himself from any action that may have a perceived conflict of interest.

Therefore, the committee finds that the appointee meets all the requirements for this position and will be an asset to the board with his hard work and attention to details and recommends to do approve Julian Janssen as a board member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority.

The Committee on Public Safety, Emergency Response, Military and Veterans Affairs, Mayors' Council and Public Transit hereby reports on the appointment of **Julian C. Janssen** to serve as a **Member of the Guam Regional Transit Authority, Board of Directors**, with the recommendation to do confirm.
