Comments on Bill No. 163-36 (COR)**

Bill No. 163-36 (COR) is an act to add a new § 57109 to Chapter 57 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, relative to designating Guam Public High Schools as sites for students to apply for a Guam Identification Card (Guam ID).

The Bill designates the Guam Public High Schools as sites where a student may apply for a Guam ID. It further sets forth that the Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT) shall, in coordination with the Guam Department of Education (GDOE), establish a policy which shall determine how a student attending a Guam Public High School shall be able to obtain the assistance with the application process in their school to obtain a Guam ID. The process shall comply with all the laws, rules, regulations, confidentiality, and procedures governing the conduct in the application process for a Guam ID and shall include an arrangement between DRT and GDOE in allowing a designated employee of the school in picking up the Guam ID. The Bill further stipulates that any student who applies for a new Guam ID through the process established by this subsection, shall have the fees waived.

As indicated on DRT's Guam ID application form, the current service fee for new Guam IDs is \$25 each. Based on comments received from DRT, the Bill, if enacted, will result in a loss of fees normally collected to re-coup the actual Departmental administrative and material costs to produce a Guam ID. The approximate direct costs to issue a Guam ID exceed the current fee by a factor of thirty-seven percent (37%). DRT maintains that while there is no specific obligation for GDOE to fund this program, the responsibility will fall upon GDOE, as negotiated with DRT, to absorb related costs as the designated Guam ID application site. According to DRT, should this Bill become enacted, the estimated fiscal impact to DRT & GDOE is as follows:
