BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 188-36 (COR)

The proposed legislation intends to transfer Lot No. 7150-R-4-NEW-1-1 from the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of establishing a slaughterhouse. The selected party will be awarded a fifty (50) year lease, with lease payments being deposited into the Chamorro Land Trust Survey and Infrastructure Fund. Additionally, the proposed legislation intends to provide up to Three Million Dollar (\$3,000,000) in financial assistance from the Earned Income Tax Credit; however, the government may use other financing alternatives to fund the building and operation of the slaughterhouse. As cited in Bill 188-36 (COR), the selected party may be eligible for other Government of Guam investment incentives and assistance.

Per correspondence with the Department of Revenue & Taxation (DRT) for other proposed legislations, DRT concludes that the department has paid to taxpayers of record an average of \$53M in EITC reimbursements since 2017. The Bureau notes that several proposed legislations have been introduced appropriating funds from the FY 2021 EITC reimbursement, including two (2) which have been included in the FY2022 Budget Act (P.L. 36-54).
