AN ACT TO AMEND § 61304(b)(7) AND § 61310 OF CHAPTER 61, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO ADD A NEW §10104(d)(8) AND §10104(d)(9) OF CHAPTER 10, TITLE 22, GUAM ADMINISTRATIVE **REGULATIONS** RELATIVE RULES AND TO **STRENGTHENING** AND HARMONIZING **GOVERNMENT AGENCY ENFORCEMENT** CAPABILITIES AND ENSURING BEST MINING OR **QUARRYING PRACTICES.** 

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that as the demand for aggregate goes up, so too, does the value of that aggregate
- 4 and the pressure on government agencies to approve permitting for the removal of
- 5 this aggregate from Guam's limited land resources.
- 6 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Guam's laws and rules and
- 7 regulations need strengthening to close regulatory gaps for quarrying and other
- 8 functions under erosion and sediment controls to mitigate potential environmental
- 9 impacts associated with aggregate extraction, including conversion of land use,
- 10 changes to the landscape, loss of habitat, dust blasting effects, erosion and
- 11 sedimentation.

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1	Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to strengthen efforts to					
2	protect the health and safety of those in the surrounding areas of quarries, and					
3	especially Guam's aquifer, by strengthening and harmonizing government					
4	enforcement capabilities and ensuring best mining practices by private industry.					
5	Section 1. § 61304(b)(7) of Chapter 61, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is					
6	hereby amended to read:					
7	"(7) <u>Biological</u> Eextractive industry."					
8	Section 2. § 61310 of Chapter 61, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is hereby					
9	amended to read:					
10	"§ 61310. M2 Heavy Industrial Zone.					
11	(a) Use Permitted.					
12	(1) Any uses permitted in the M1 zone, excepting residential use.					
13	(2) Junk Yards. Under the special provisions set forth in Subarticle 6,					
14	Article 5 of this Chapter.					
15	(3) Any other uses not specifically prohibited by law, including those					
16	which are or may be objection-able, obnoxious, or offensive by reason of					
17	odor, dust, smoke, noise, gas fumes, cinders, vibration, or water-carried					
18	waste.					
19	(4) Uses customarily accessory to any of the uses herein permitted,					
20	and accessory buildings and structures.					
21	(b) Conditional use.

25	Section 3. A new §10104(d)(8) is hereby added to Chapter 10, Title 22, Guam					
26	Administrative Rules and Regulations to read:					

"(8) The area of land to be cleared, graded, grubbed, filled, excavated, embanked or used for stockpiling may not exceed five (5) acres, except that the Administrator may increase this maximum to a size larger than five (5) acres if the adopted conservation standards can be maintained, or the Administrator may reduce the maximum to a size below five (5) acres if the Administrator determines that the conservation standards will not be met. Additional area shall not be opened for clearing, grading, grubbing, filling, excavating, embanking, or stockpiling until measures to prevent dust or erosion problems in the area already cleared, graded, grubbed, filled, excavated, embanked or used for stockpiling have been satisfactorily completed." 

**Section 4.** A new §10104(d)(9) is hereby *added* to Chapter 10, Title 22, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations to read:

"(9) Mining or quarrying *shall* require a special permit and be regulated by the Department of Public Works, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, Guam Department of Labor, Guam Land Use Commission, Bureau of Statistics and Plans, Mine Safety and Health Administration and other local and federal agencies."

**Section 5.** The Department of Public Works shall promulgate and enforce rules and regulations for the application and issuance of permits for clearing, grading, grubbing, filling, excavating, embanking, stockpiling, mining and quarrying consistent with 22 GAR Chapter 10 Guam Soil and Sediment Control Regulations and in accordance with 5 GCA Chapter 9. No permit may be issued without conformance to all requirements or conditions of the Application Review Committee agencies.

**Section 6.** The Guam Environmental Protection Agency shall promulgate, modify, update, repeal and enforce rules and regulations setting environmental

- standards for clearing, grading, grubbing, filling, excavating, embanking,
- 2 stockpiling, mining and quarrying in accordance with 5 GCA Chapter 9.
