**AN ACT TO AMEND § 32201(c)21(E) OF CHAPTER 32
DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 5 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED
RELATIVE TO PRICE GOUGING IN TIME OF
DISASTER PROHIBITED.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 32201(c)21(E) of Chapter 32, Division 3 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

(21) Price gouging in time of disaster prohibited.

(E) The price on all wholesale and retail goods shall be frozen whenever *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* declares Guam to be in Condition of Readiness 1 or 2, or their equivalent, and shall continue to be frozen until ~~seventy-two (72) hours~~ ninety (90) days after Guam returns to Condition of Readiness 4, or its equivalent. The normal sales prices of goods shall include the increased import costs of the goods for all goods normally imported by sea, and incremental freight costs caused as a result of air freight actually incurred. The Legislature may suspend this price freeze by resolution before the end of ninety (90) days.

Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
