## AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 70117.1 TO CHAPTER 70, DIVISION 3, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND TAXATION (DRT) TO ISSUE CONDITIONAL BUSINESS LICENSES.

## 1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM.**

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 3 the process of obtaining a business license in Guam is tedious, restrictive, and 4 deterring to applicants in that, it often requires a substantial amount of time to obtain 5 the various permits and requirements necessary for a Guam business license. 6 Depending on the type of business, applicants for Guam business license will need 7 to go through several Government of Guam agencies to obtain permits such as 8 Clearing/Grading and Building Construction Permit from the Department of Public 9 Works, Conditional Use Permit from the Guam Land Use Commission, Sanitary 10 Permit from the Department of Public Health and Social Services, or Activities, 11 Materials, and Use Permit from the Guam Fire Department. Each required permit 12 mandates an inspection process before the permit is provided, which takes up valuable time. Delays in procuring these permits and requirements drastically impact 13 14 and slow down the process of obtaining a business license to the point that some

businesses are forced to cease operations or prevent newly-established businesses
from opening their doors to serve our island, hindering the growth of our economy.

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3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan also finds that allowing businesses to operate under a 4 conditional license will create more revenue for our government and encourage the growth of businesses in our island. With this Act, The Department of Revenue and 5 6 Taxation will process conditional business licenses as it would other licenses, putting 7 a reasonable fee on it and gaining a new revenue source for the agency. Many 8 businesses will surely take advantage of the additional time frame provided by the 9 conditional license to process all their needed permits and licenses, and the other 10 agencies processing the required permits and licenses for the business license will 11 also be given more time to assess and scrutinize the applicants. A conditional 12 business license will also encourage more enterprising individuals to pursue their business aspirations by providing them leeway and flexibility to apply for the 13 14 necessary permits and licenses for a business license. One of the major and daunting 15 hurdles of starting a business is the process of applying for the necessary permits for 16 a business license, a hurdle that can easily be remedied by providing conditional 17 licenses. With the leeway provided by a conditional license, business-aspirants will 18 not be dissuaded and discouraged if they fail to meet the standards, as they will have 19 the time to address them properly. A conditional business license also prevents the 20 adverse effects of failing to meet the requirements for a business license on 21 businesses, namely their shutting down. Allowing businesses to operate while they 22 process the needed permits for their business license will prevent them from losing income and going under due to failure to meet their financial obligations. 23 24 Conditional business licenses are both beneficial to the business sector of our island 25 and our government.

26 Because of these reasons, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends to authorize the 27 Department of Revenue and Taxation to issue conditional business licenses to

| 1  | qualifying businesses. This legislation will not only benefit the business sector of   |
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| 2  | the island by providing them flexibility in adhering to the requirements of a business |
| 3  | license, but also our government by creating a new avenue for revenue.                 |
| 4  | Section 2. A new § 70117.1 <i>shall</i> be added to Chapter 70, Division 3, Title 11,  |
| 5  | Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:   |
| 6  | "§ 70117.1. Conditional Business License.  |
| 7  | Notwithstanding any other provision of law:  |
| 8  | (a) Any business owner may apply for a conditional business license                    |
| 9  | if he or she has failed to meet all requirements for a business license. The           |
| 10 | Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall assess every                  |
| 11 | application for a conditional business license and may approve and issue               |
| 12 | conditional business licenses with the consent of the License Board. The               |
| 13 | conditional business license shall allow the licensee to operate his or her            |
| 14 | business that is without a Guam business license or a renewed Guam business            |
| 15 | license for a period of one (1) year, during which time, the licensee shall            |
| 16 | complete all requirements to obtain a business license. Failure to obtain a            |
| 17 | Guam business license within the duration of the conditional license shall             |
| 18 | result in penalties listed under § 70117(b) of this Chapter.                           |
| 19 | (b) Conditional business licenses shall expire one (1) year after the                  |
| 20 | date of issuance and shall not be renewable unless the applicant obtains a             |
| 21 | Guam business license or a renewed Guam business license.                              |
| 22 | (c) Conditional business licenses shall only be applicable to one (1)                  |
| 23 | business with an expired Guam business license or one (1) business without a           |
| 24 | business license; applicants shall apply for a conditional business license for        |
| 25 | every business or expired Guam business license.                                       |
| 26 | (d) Fees charged for a conditional business license shall not be lower                 |
| 27 | than the fee charged for a Guam business license."                                     |

Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
Section 5. Severability. *If* any of the provisions of this Act or the application
thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity *shall not* affect
any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect without the
invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
severable.
