AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 4 TO CHAPTER 77, TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE USE OF BODY-WORN-CAMERAS BY UNIFORMED OFFICERS OF THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A New Article 4 is *added* to Chapter 77, Title 10 Guam Code
Annotated to read as follows:

4 <u>"Article 4</u>

**Body-Worn-Cameras** 

### § 77401. Legislative Findings and Intent.

<u>I Liheslaturan Guåhan</u> finds that Body-worn cameras are video and audio recording devices that police, sheriff and highway patrol officers wear as part of their uniforms to document what they observe as they perform their duties. Body cameras continue to be a popular focus for state and city lawmakers as they consider and enact legislation to address police-community relations.

Body camera laws generally limit public dissemination of camera footage except for statutorily specified purposes. Some jurisdictions permit the release of footage to the people involved in a recording or their attorneys. Other jurisdictions allow release in instances where the public interest outweighs the need for confidentiality. Some jurisdictions allow the release of footage, but recordings can be withheld if they reveal confidential information or identify people accused of, but not charged with, a crime.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that body cams have become increasingly popular in recent years as a means to prevent or document officer misconduct while on duty. However, these devices are unpopular among law enforcement officers as everything that they say or do while on duty is recorded including times when officers have a reasonable expectation of privacy. The other concern from law enforcement officers is that recorded criticism for fellow officers or supervisors may be used against them. To balance the needs of the public, investigators, prosecutors, defense attorneys and victims, the use and release of body cam recordings should be subject to a fair and concise policy.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to allow the Guam Police Department to implement a body-worn-camera program and to allow the Chief of Police to develop rules and regulations to administer the program.

# § 77402. Body-worn-cameras (Body Cams).

A body-worn-camera (body cam) is a device worn by police officers as part of their uniforms. The body cam records audio and video to document what they observe as they perform their duties.

#### § 77403. Body Cam Program.

1	The Chief of Police (Chief) is authorized to develop a body cam program for
2	the Guam Police Department (GPD).
3	§ 77404. Body Cam Recordings: Release.
4	Body cam recordings are not public information as defined by Chapter 10, 5
5	GCA. The Chief of Police has the sole discretion on the release of body cam
6	recordings. Generally, body cam recordings may be released for the following
7	reasons:
8 9 10	(a) Upon a court order including warrants, subpoenas, summons or discovery. Such recordings, shall remain confidential while in the possession or custody of the receiving party unless ordered by a court or the Chief.
11	(b) Instances where the public interest outweighs the need for
12	confidentiality, the release of such recordings shall not occur at such time that
13	the release may impair, hinder or disrupt an investigation or trial. In instances
14	where recordings are released pursuant to this paragraph, such recordings,
15	upon release, are public information.
16	(c) For use in criminal investigations and criminal prosecutions.
17	(d) For use in internal GPD investigations, and
18	(e) Any purpose deemed appropriate by the Chief.
19	§ 77405. Body Cam Recordings: Storage and Archiving.
20	The Chief shall develop a storage, retention and archiving policy for body cam
21	recordings. Body cam recordings must be retained for a minimum of ninety (90)
22	days following completion of an investigation. Body cam recordings used as

- evidence in a criminal or civil preceding shall be retained for a period of not less
- 2 than three years (3) or longer, while disposition of an appeal is pending or subject to
- 3 <u>a court order.</u>
- 4 <u>§ 77406. Pilot Program Permitted.</u>
- 5 The Chief may implement the provisions of this Article as a pilot program.
- § 77407. Grants and Funding.
- Nothing herein this Article or any other provision of law is to be construed as
- 8 to limit or restrict the ability for GPD to apply for and utilize grant funding for the
- 9 purchase, operation and maintenance of body cams. Nothing herein this Article or
- any other provision of law is to be construed as to limit or restrict the ability for GPD
- to apply for and utilize grant funding for the purchase, operation and maintenance
- of body cams recording storage, retention and archiving.
- 13 <u>§ 77408. Administrative Rules and Regulations.</u>
- GPD shall create administrative rules and regulations for the provisions of this
- 15 Article pursuant to Chapter 9, 5 GCA."
