AN ACT TO AMEND § 6209 (c) OF ARTICLE 2, AMEND § 6306 AND § 6308 OF ARTICLE 3, AMEND § 6401, § 6402, AND § 6405, ALL OF ARTICLE 4, AND AMEND § 6603 OF ARTICLE 6, ALL OF CHAPTER 6, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO UPDATING FINES AND PENALTIES FOR TOBACCO AND NICOTINE VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that between 2018 and 2022 the Department of Revenue and Taxation cited a total of 106 violations from tobacco outlets on Guam from a total of 329 vendors licensed to sale tobacco products. Violations consisted of sales to those under 21 years of age and failing to post '21+ Only Sales' signages for public view.

I Liheslatura further finds that the World Health Organization, Framework
Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO-FCTC) recognizes that consistently
revisiting violation penalties along with taxation are the two highly effective
initiatives to tackle tobacco and nicotine consumption among youth worldwide.

I Liheslatura finds that in Chapter 6 of Title 11 in the Guam Code Annotated was established in October of 1998 through Public Law 24-278 that required tobacco products to obtain tobacco licenses and to enforce the prohibition of sales of tobacco products to minors. Twenty five years later, updates to Chapter 6 of Title 11 have 1 included the licensing requirements for the retail and wholesale of tobacco products 2 and the restrictions of tobacco products to manufacturer's representatives, and 3 tobacco taxation through Public Law 28-170. The passage of Public Law 32-200 4 restricted the engagement of any sellers to offer any tobacco multi-product discounts and promotions. In 2017, Public Law 34-01 defined electronic cigarettes into 5 6 Chapter 6 and raised the consumer age of tobacco and nicotine products to twenty-7 one years of age. Among the many regulations established on Guam, tobacco and 8 nicotine consumption and tobacco marketing strategies continue to evolve, as well as, the need for policy changes. 9

I Liheslatura finds that according to the Annual Synar Report published by the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center, as of 2017 there were 106 violations with majority being first and second time offenders. According to the Department of Revenue and Taxation as of September 2023 there are 347 active retail Tobacco Business Licenses and eight active Wholesale Tobacco Business Licenses. Between 2018 and 2019, one third-time offender paid a \$5,050.00 penalty and had their tobacco license suspended.

Despite a downward trend of violations for selling tobacco and nicotine 17 18 products without a license or selling tobacco products to minors, data published in 19 August of 2023 finds that consumption of tobacco and nicotine remains higher in 20 Guam compared to the U.S. among adults and youth. According to the State 21 Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup (SEOW) Epi Profile, the use of electronic nicotine delivery devices or "vaping" is high amongst Guam youth, with one in four 22 23 (26.5%) high school students and nearly one in four (23.5%) middle school students 24 reporting current use. Tobacco use figures display marked disparities across socio-25 economic gradients with poor and less-educated individuals more likely to smoke 26 than rich and well-educated persons who are less likely to have smoked at all.

Therefore it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to protect our island's youth by updating statutes, which are nearly two decades old, by requiring training

and certification of businesses who sell tobacco and nicotine products to promote 1 2 compliance with tobacco control laws and regulations and to deter non-compliance by increasing fines and suspension of licenses for first time violators for those 3 4 businesses that sell to minors. § 6209 (c) of Article 2, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code 5 Section 2. 6 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as: **"§ 6209. Display of License.** 7 8 Any license who violates this Section shall be fined Fifty Dollars (c) (\$50.00) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per violation." 9 10 Section 3. § 6306 of Article 3, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated 11 is hereby *amended* to read as: **"§ 6306.** 12 Same: Application. An applicant for a license shall submit the following: 13 14 an application, in writing to the Director, verified under oath (a) and accompanied by a; 15 16 license fee(s); (b) certificate of completion from a program administered by the 17 (c) Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC) or the Department 18 of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), that includes, but is not limited 19 20 to, information on the rules and regulations of the sale of tobacco and nicotine products, prevention of use and cessation programs of tobacco and nicotine 21 products. Managers and staff conducting the sale of tobacco and nicotine 22 products shall complete the program." 23 24 Section 4. § 6308 of Article 3, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated 25 is hereby *amended* to read as: "§ 6308. Penalties for Selling Tobacco Products Without a License. 26

1 In addition to any other penalties and fines that may be levied, including those under § 6405 and § 70120 of this Title, any person who violates § 6201 shall be 2 guilty of a misdemeanor as set forth in § 70119 of this Title, and punished as follows: 3 in the case of a first violation, by a fine of Two Hundred Fifty 4 (a) Dollars (\$250.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). 5 in the case of a second violation, by a fine of Five Hundred 6 (b) Dollars (\$500.00) Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the person shall 7 8 not be eligible to apply for a license for two (2) years after the date of 9 assessment of a fine. 10 in the case of three (3) or more violations, a fine of not less than (c) 11 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), nor more than Twenty Thousand Dollars 12 (\$20,000.00) and the person shall not be eligible to apply for a license for five (5) years after the date of the assessment of a fine. 13 any person who is in violation of this Section, shall obtain 14 (d)certification from the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center or the 15 16 Department of Public Health and Social Services, who shall administer an education program, that includes, but is not limited to, information of Guam 17 laws and regulations pertaining to tobacco and nicotine products, prevention 18 and cessation of tobacco and nicotine use. Certificates shall be submitted to 19 20 the Department of Revenue and Taxation upon completion prior to licensure." 21 Section 5. § 6401 of Article 4, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated 22 is hereby *amended* to read as: "(a) It shall be a violation of this Chapter for any person to sell or 23 distribute tobacco products or electronic cigarettes to any person under twenty-one 24 25 (21) years of age. 26 (1) It shall not be a violation of this Chapter for any person to refuse to sell or distribute tobacco products or electronic cigarettes to any 27 person whom the seller or the distributor reasonably believes to be under 28

- twenty-seven (27) years of age, and who is unable to produce acceptable
 photographic identification and proof that he or she is over the age of
 twenty-one (21) years.
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(21) The sale or distribution of electronic cigarettes to any person under twenty-one (21) years of age, or its possession by such person, is prohibited and shall be regulated and enforced pursuant to this Chapter.

7 (32) Any provision of this Chapter applicable to the regulation and
8 prohibition of the sale or distribution of tobacco products to any person
9 under twenty-one (21) years of age, or possession by such person, shall be
10 applicable to electronic cigarettes, and any other component of an electronic
11 cigarette, and shall be regulated and enforced in the same manner as tobacco
12 products, to include the applicability of all penalties and fines."

13 Section 6. § 6402 of Article 4, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated
14 is hereby *amended* to read as:

15 "§ 6402. Acceptable Forms of Identification. Display of Prohibition on
 16 Sales of Tobacco Products to Persons Under Twenty-one (21) Years of Age.

All licensee shall post notice that this Chapter prohibits the sale of tobaccoproducts to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age.

19(a) In the case of retail operation, notices *shall* be publicly and20conspicuously displayed in the licensee's place of business in letters at21least two inches (2") in height.

(b) Any the case of vending machine, the license *shall* affix to the
front of each vending machine in sign in letters at least one-half inch (15") in height.

25 (c) Any licensee who violates this Section *shall* be fined Fifty
 26 Dollars (\$50.00) Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per violation."

Section 7. § 6405 of Article 4, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated
is hereby *amended* to read as:

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"§ 6405. Penalties for Selling or Distributing Tobacco Products to Persons Under Twenty-one (21) Years of Age.

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(a) In addition to any other penalties and fines that may be levied, any person who violates § 6401 of this Chapter shall be penalized as follows:

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7 8 (1) In the case of the first violation in any five (5)_year period, the person shall be fined One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), and the license shall be suspended for ninety (90) days and *shall* be notified, in writing, of penalties levied for further violations;

9 (2) in the case of a second violation in any five (5)_year period, the 10 person shall be fined Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) Ten Thousand 11 Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the license shall be suspended for ninety (90) One 12 Hundred Eighty (180) days;

(3) in the case of third three (3) or more violations in any five (5) year
period, the person *shall* be fined Five <u>Twenty</u> Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00)
(\$20,000.00) and the license shall be suspended for one hundred eighty (180)
days revoked. The revoked licensee *shall* be ineligible to apply for a new
license for five (5) years after the effective date of the revocation.

18 (3) in the case of four (4) or more violations within any five (5) year
19 period, the person shall be fined Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and, in
20 the case of a licensee, the license shall be revoked. The revoked retailer shall
21 be ineligible to apply for a new license for two (2) years after the effective
22 date of the revocation.

(b) Failure to pay a fine levied under this Section <u>after suspension pursuant</u>
 to <u>Subsection (a) of this Section shall result in continued</u> suspension of the licensee's
 license until such fines are paid.

(c) During any suspension or revocation of a license under this Section, the
licensee shall not sell tobacco products and shall remove all tobacco products from
all areas covered by the suspended license. In addition, any new application for a

license to sell tobacco products while a licensee is suspended under this Section shall
 be denied.

3 (d) All tobacco products sold over the counter shall be displayed and 4 located where they shall be inaccessible to persons under twenty-one (21) years of 5 age. Any vendor who violates this provision shall pay a penalty of Two Hundred 6 Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).

- (e) any person who is in violation of this Section, *shall* obtain certification
 from the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center or the Department of Public
 Health and Social Services, who shall administer an education program, that
 includes, but is not limited to, information of Guam laws and regulations pertaining
 to tobacco and nicotine products, prevention and cessation of tobacco and nicotine
 use. Certificates shall be submitted to the Department of Revenue and Taxation upon
 completion prior to licensure."
- Section 8. § 6603 of Article 6, Chapter 6, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated
 is hereby *amended* to read as:
- 16 **"§6603. Penalty.**

Whoever transports or imports into Guam for delivery or use in Guam tobaccoproducts in violation of this Article shall penalized as follows:

(a) in the case of a first violation, the person shall be guilty of a
misdemeanor and may *shall* be fined not more than One Thousand Dollars
(\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one (1) year, or both;

(b) in the case of any subsequent violation, the person shall be guilty of a
felony of the third degree and shall be fined not more than Ten Thousand Dollars
(\$10,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than five (5) years, or both.

(c) any individual who imports tobacco products outside the exemptions
identified in this Article shall be imposed a fine of three (3) times the taxable
assessment, which shall be determined using the tax rate established in § 26603 of
Article 6, Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, by the Officer of the Customs

and Quarantine Agency at the port of entry. The commodity shall be seized, and the
violator of this Section shall be fined an additional three (3) times the value of the
current value of the commodity for the cost of storage, destruction, and
administrative fees for tobacco exceeding the exemption pursuant to 9 Guam Code
Annotated § 47.70. This fee shall be deposited in the Customs Local Forfeiture
Account (CLFA) according to the following:

- (i) <u>50% in the Customs Local Forfeiture Account (CLFA);</u> and
- 9(ii)50% in the Youth Tobacco Education and Prevention10Fund (YTEP Fund).

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(d) The Customs and Quarantine Agency shall maintain a database of all
individuals who are in violation of this Section to determine and administer
subsequent violation charges.

This act shall be effective upon enactment. 14 Section 9. **Enactment Date.** 15 Section 10. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application 16 to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity 17 shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 18 19 Act are severable.
