AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) FROM FISCAL YEAR 2024 GENERAL FUND REVENUES COLLECTED IN EXCESS OF ADOPTED REVENUE LEVELS TO THE GUAM CANCER FUND, AND ALL REMAINING EXCESS REVENUE TO THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Appropriation to the Guam Cancer Fund.

The sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) is appropriated from the Fiscal Year 2024 General Fund revenues collected in excess of the adopted revenue levels enumerated in Public Law 37-42, as amended, to the Guam Cancer Fund. This appropriation is intended to support cancer prevention, treatment, and support services for the people of Guam.

Section 2. Appropriation to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority.

All remaining excess Fiscal Year 2024 General Fund revenues collected beyond the adopted revenue levels enumerated in Public Law 37-42, as amended, are hereby appropriated to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for its operational and maintenance expenses for Fiscal Year 2025.

Section 3. Effective Date: This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

Section 4. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
