**AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW § 8121 TO CHAPTER 8, DIVISION 1, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO CANNABIS COURIER SERVICES ON GUAM.**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

**Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes the need for a robust regulatory framework governing the delivery of cannabis. The Cannabis Control Board shall ensure cannabis courier services operate in a secure, controlled manner by implementing rules akin to California's regulatory model, with emphasis on inventory tracking, delivery controls, and security standards.

**Section 2.** A new § 8121 is *added* to Chapter 8, Division 1, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

**“§ 8121. Cannabis Courier Services.**

**(a) Track-and-Trace Requirements. All cannabis delivery operations must utilize a state-approved track-and-trace system to log and monitor cannabis products during transportation. Prior to each delivery trip:**

**(1) A delivery inventory ledger must be created, including unique identifiers (UIDs) for each cannabis item, driver and vehicle information, and inventory specifics;**

**(2) This ledger must record:**

- 1           i.       Ledger number assigned to the trip;
- 2           ii.       Driver's name, ID, and license number;
- 3           iii.       Vehicle make, model, and license plate;
- 4           iv.       Item names, categories, UIDs, quantities;
- 5           v.       Start date and time of delivery.

6 (b) Delivery Ledger and Trip Logging. Delivery employees must:

7           (1) Maintain an up-to-date ledger at all times, logging each stop and  
8 delivery completion;

9           (2) Update the ledger after each completed delivery to reflect  
10 remaining inventory;

11          (3) Record details in the track-and-trace system by the end of the  
12 calendar day, including:

- 13           i.       Completion time of each delivery;
- 14           ii.       Customer type (adult-use, medicinal);
- 15           iii.       Delivery location;
- 16           iv.       Quantity and price of cannabis products delivered.

17 (c) Inventory and Transport Compliance. During each delivery trip:

18           (1) Cannabis goods in transit shall not exceed \$10,000 in value;

19           (2) Vehicles must only carry cannabis products, licensed  
20 accessories, and delivery records;

21           (3) Deliveries must be pre-ordered by customers, with receipt  
22 provided to the delivery employee;

23           (4) If no orders are pending for 30 minutes, employees must return  
24 to the licensed premises.

25 (d) Delivery Logs and Security Protocols. Delivery employees shall:

26           (1) Log all stops, with explanations, and turn logs in upon returning to  
27 premises;

1           (2) Maintain a secured vehicle with lockable compartments for  
2 cannabis goods;

3           (3) Return any undelivered cannabis to the retailer's inventory within  
4 the track-and-trace system.

5       (e) End-of-Day Reporting. By close of each business day:

6           (1) All sales, deliveries, and undelivered inventory must be recorded  
7 in the track-and-trace system;

8           (2) All uncompleted deliveries must be returned to inventory and  
9 accounted for in end-of-day reports.

10       (f) Penalties for Non-Compliance. Violations of any regulations under this  
11 section may result in:

12           (1) License suspension or revocation;

13           (2) Fines determined by the Cannabis Control Board;

14           (3) Additional enforcement actions as deemed necessary.”

15       **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any  
16 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not  
17 affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without  
18 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are  
19 severable.
