AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 2 TO CHAPTER 16, TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING A MECHANISM FOR ATTORNEYS TO EVALUATE AND PROPOSE UPDATES TO GUAM'S UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) is a standardized set of laws and regulations for transacting business. The UCC was established in 1953 because it was becoming increasingly difficult for companies to transact business across state lines given the various state laws. The UCC, which consist of 9 Articles, provides a standard legal and contractual framework for businesses in various states to transact with each other.

Although there are slight variations in the UCC for state-to-state, the UCC has been fully adopted by most U.S. states. On Guam the UCC was adopted in 1977 and codified as Title 13 Guam Code Annotated. Although there have been several revisions to the UCC since 1977, none have been made to Guam's UCC which remains the same since it was enacted.

In December of 1977, the Compiler of Laws position was created as a classified position within the Legislative Branch. This position was later placed under the general administrative supervision of the Guam Law Revision Commission. The Legislature, in January of 1982 decided to terminate the Guam Law Revision Commission in favor of the Office of the Compiler of Laws. In 1983 the Compiler of Laws was moved to the Office of the Attorney General and then to the Supreme Court of Guam in 2004. Unfortunately, with the repeal of the Guam Law Revision Commission also came the repeal to the function to review Guam's uniform laws, including the UCC, and provide guidance to the legislature on how the UCC should be updated to maintain uniformity with other states.

*I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that since the UCC was created in 1977, there was an attempt in 2002 to amend Article 9 (Division 9 of the Guam UCC) with Public Law 26-172 to adopt the Uniform Law Commission 2001 update. However, with subsequent repeal of P.L. 26-172, Guam UCC today, remains unchanged, in its entirety, from the version adopted in 1977.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that many of the recent UCC revision recommendation adopted by the Uniform Law Commission include updates to address new technology and electronic commerce. Unless Guam's UCC is updated to account for technological and electronic commerce advancements, it will be increasingly difficult for companies on Guam to transact business with companies across the nation.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to create Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) Advisory Councils within the Office of the Compiler of Laws. The purpose of the Council is draft amendments for *I Liheslatura*, inclusive of the recommended effective dates for such amendments. The goal of amendments is to achieve uniformity with a minimal amount of variation from other states that have updated their UCCs. The difficulty for the Councils is determining the effective dates of the

1	updates so that existing contracts, security instruments and other requirements of the
2	UCC are not adversely affected.
3	It is also the commitment of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to provide the Office of
4	Compiler of Laws with the resources it needs not just to bring the UCC up to date
5	with other states and territories but to address future updates that may be
6	recommended by the Uniform Law Commission.
7	Section 2. A new Article 2 is added to Chapter 16, Title 1, Guam Code
8	Annotated to read as follows:
9	"Article 2
0	<b>Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) Advisory Councils</b>
1	§ 1621. Uniform Commercial Code Advisory Councils: Creation.
2	The Compiler of Laws may create any number of Uniform Commercial Code
3	(UCC) Advisory Councils to serve on an ad hoc basis.
4	§ 1622. Same: Composition.
5	Members of each UCC Advisory Council are appointed by the Compiler of
6	Laws and must be attorneys admitted to the Guam Bar. Members of UCC Advisory
7	Councils serve on an uncompensated voluntary basis.
8	§ 1623. Same: Length of Term.
9	The terms for members of UCC Advisory Councils are determined by the
20	Compiler of Laws.
21	§ 1624. Same: Duties and Responsibilities.
22	The duties and responsibilities of each UCC Advisory Council shall include,
23	but not be limited to:
24	(a) Draft legislation or recommendations for legislation, on a
25	section-by section basis, to update provisions of the Guam UCC contained in
26	Title 13, Guam Code Annotated,

1	(b) Draft recommendations for the effective dates of the
2	recommendations created in paragraph (a) of this Section, supra,
3	(c) Conduct public hearings on proposed recommendations for
4	paragraphs (a) and (b), supra, and make amendments, if necessary, to said
5	proposed recommendations, and
6	(d) Recommendation options of the UCC Advisory Councils
7	include:
8	(1) Adopt the Uniform Law Commission recommendations,
9	(2) Adopt the Uniform Law Commission recommendations
10	with variations,
11	(3) Adopt recommendations other than those of the Uniform
12	Law Commission (and provide the source), or
13	(4) Adopt a recommendation for no changes.
14	§ 1625. Uniform Law Commission (ULC).
	The Uniform Law Commission (ULC), also known as the National
15	The Children Eaw Commission (CEC), also known as the Translati
15 16	Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws), established in 1892,
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1	(b) ULC statutes are representative of state experience, because the
2	organization is made up of representatives from each state, appointed by state
3	government.
4	(c) ULC keeps state law up-to-date by addressing important and
5	timely legal issues.
6	(d) ULC's efforts reduce the need for individuals and businesses to
7	deal with different laws as they move and do business in different states.
8	(e) ULC's work facilitates economic development and provides a
9	legal platform for foreign entities to deal with U.S. citizens and businesses.
10	(f) ULC Commissioners donate thousands of hours of their time and
11	legal and drafting expertise every year as a public service, and receive no
12	salary or compensation for their work.
13	(g) ULC's deliberative and uniquely open drafting process draws on
14	the expertise of commissioners, but also utilizes input from legal experts, and
15	advisors and observers representing the views of other legal organizations or
16	interests that will be subject to the proposed laws.
17	§ 1626. Compiler of Laws: Duties and Responsibilities.
18	The duties and responsibilities of the Compiler of Laws regarding the UCC
19	Advisory Councils, include but are not limited to:
20	(a) Solicit interest from Guam barred attorneys to serve on UCC
21	Advisory Councils and make appointments accordingly,
22	(b) Provide for administrative support for the UCC Advisory
23	Councils,
24	(c) Compile the recommendations of the UCC Advisory Councils
25	and periodically submit such recommendations to I Liheslaturan Guåhan,
26	(d) Submit to <i>I Liheslaturan Guåhan</i> , at least once annually, requests
27	for appropriations to fund the provisions of this Article. Requests for

1	appropriations for inclusion in the annual General Appropriations Act shall be
2	submitted by no later than Ninety (90) days prior the start of each fiscal year,
3	unless otherwise agreed to with the chairperson of I Liheslaturan Guåhan's
4	committee responsible for appropriations.
5	(e) Submit to I Liheslaturan Guåhan, as may be necessary, requests
6	for statutory amendments to this Article.
7	§ 1627. Establishment of a Five-Year Goal for Adoption of Prior
8	<u>ULC Recommendations or Alternatives of Prior ULC Recommendations.</u>
9	I Liheslaturan Guåhan establishes a Five (5)-year goal for completion and
10	submission of UCC Advisory Councils' recommendations for amendments to Title
11	13 Guam Code Annotated (Uniform Commercial Code). The Five (5)-year period,
12	supra, shall commence One Hundred Eighty (180) following the enactment of this
13	Article.
14	§ 1628. No Sunset of this Article.
15	This Article shall not sunset. The Compiler of Laws, may sua sponte, convene
16	UCC Advisory Councils to review and make recommendations on future ULC
17	recommended updates or other recommendations amendments of the laws of Title
18	13 Guam Code Annotated."
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
