Hafa Adai Senator Barnett:

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 119-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill 119-37 (COR) is an Act to repeal Article 14 of Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated (GCA); and to add a new Part G of Article 2 of Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to revitalizing the Guam Procurement Advisory Council (GPAC) to modernize procurement in order to promote public confidence and achieve best value in service to our community.

The legislation primarily keeps the structure of the Article 14, Chapter 5, Title 5 GCA relative to the GPAC in-tact. However, the proposed legislation makes the following amendments/additions when being re-enacted as Part G of Article 2, Chapter 5, Title 5, GCA: 1) amends the composition of the GPAC; 2) adds an additional six (6) duties to the responsibilities of the GPAC; and 3) amends the reporting requirement of the GPAC.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
