Hafa Adai! Senator Barnett:

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 167-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Legislative Bill No. 167-37 (COR) is an act to amend § 4202 (b) of Chapter 2 Title 4 Guam Code Annotated relative to the enactment of Public Law 34-145 which amended The Sixty Day Rule.

Based on comments received from the Civil Service Commission regarding Bill No. 167-37 (COR), the proposed amended legislation provides an additional thirty (30) days of pay for any classified employee and casual employee prior to termination of employment for any reason and creates extra costs to the Government of Guam.

The Bureau notes that positions for classified employee and casual employee in the Government of Guam are usually budgeted for a full Fiscal Year. As such, even though the proposed legislation provides for an additional thirty (30) days of pay, there isn't any additional funding impact on the affected department or agency.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact to any funds of the Government of Guam.
