The Bureau requests that Bill No. 202-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 202-37 (COR) is an act to repeal Public Law No. 37-47 in its entirety. This law amended §§58109 and 58110 and added a new Chapter 58B to Division 3 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated relative to the legalization and regulation of the use of consumer-grade fireworks. If enacted, the proposed legislation will essentially cancel all the amendments to the Guam Code Annotated passed via P.L. No. 37-47, which was only recently signed into law on November 10, 2023.

This bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
