The Bureau requests that Bill No. 217-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Legislative Bill No. 217-37 (COR) is an act to amend § 14105 of Chapter 14, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the counting of provisional ballots.

The Guam Election Commission has stated that this Bill does not have a fiscal impact and would “provide consistency in the election code and streamline the election process.”

Based on the forgoing, the proposed Bill is administrative in nature and would not fiscally impact FY2024 Government of Guam appropriations.
