The Bureau requests that Bill No. 241-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Legislative Bill No. 241-37 (COR) is an act to add a new § 6110A to Chapter 6 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to prohibiting candidates from appearance on any ballot for any public election who have engaged in insurrection or rebellion against the United States or any member of the Union, or given aid or comfort to the enemies thereof.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
