The Bureau requests that Bill No. 246-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

The intent of Bill No. 246-37 (COR) is to amend §6A117 of Chapter 6A, Title 18, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations relative to the lease award of the Chamorro Land Trust Leases. The proposed amendment intends to add language which allows the Commission to process the next applicant for a lease award that is able to provide the sufficient proof needed in the event that an applicant is unable to provide sufficient proof as stated in §6A117(b).

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
